### BASIS OF REPORT

The writer was due to interview Mr Murray in relation to the current Report on 24 March 1999 but he failed to appear for his appointment. This Report is therefore largely based on Departmental Records. The writer's last interview with Mr Murray was on 09 March 1999. Mr Murray's two year probation Order, imposed at Perth Sheriff Court, expired on 18 March 1999.

### CIRCUMSTANCES SINCE LAST REPORT

Shortly after Mr Murray's last appearance in court he moved out of Anchor House to live with a friend in the Letham area. Following a period spent living with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray, in August 1998, moved to Manchester where his mother and siblings now reside. During this period, Mr Murray was supervised by Manchester Probation Services. Mr Murray returned to Perth the following October and, since this time, and while not in Glasgow, he has lived with different friends. The writer however, is unaware of Mr Murray's current whereabouts.

In late January of this year, Mr Murray, while visiting relatives, was taken into Glasgow Royal Infirmary. It subsequently transpired that Mr Murray had an ulcer and, as a consequence, was suffering from stomach and bowel problems. This situation was apparently exacerbated by abscesses. He was eventually discharged from hospital earlier this month and returned to Perth.

As far as the writer is aware, Mr Murray has been convicted of no further offences during the period of deferment. In addition, he continues to be in receipt of State Benefits.

**CONCLUSION**

Presuming the above information is correct, the writer would suggest to the court that they consider admonishing Mr Murray on this occasion. This recommendation is based on the fact that Mr Murray has already been the subject of Probation Supervision for the last two years, his itinerant lifestyle and age.

**BASIS OF REPORT**

This report is based on one office interview with Mr Murray and reference to Departmental Records. The Writer also supervises Mr Murray's current Probation Order.

**ACCOMMODATION**

Mr Murray currently resides at the above address which is a hostel for single males.

**FAMILY COMPOSITION**

**FINANCE**

At present, Mr Murray is in receipt of State Benefit totalling £60.60 per fortnight. Regular fortnightly financial outgoings are £40 towards accommodation and £5 toward the payment of a fine.

## PERSONAL HISTORY

Born in Glasgow, Mr Murray grew up in the Easterhouse area and never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between his mother and a Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and, as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. Shortly after, they moved to Coupar Angus, then to Stanley and in October 1997, to St Andrews in Fife. However, the following January the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester some two weeks ago.

Mrs Murray, who has now separated from Mr Waddell, has a history of drug and alcohol abuse. In June 1995 Mr Waddell was charged with physically assaulting Mr Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault, and continuing family difficulties, Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care. For the first eight months Mr Murray resided with foster carers but, due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Following an appearance at the Children's Panel, Mr Murray was discharged from Local Authority care on 6 February 1997. Due to friction between him and his mother, Mr Murray immediately left Perth to go to Glasgow to live with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic Offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Shortly after his release, on 2 May 1997 and, due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow and continuing friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. However, this placement broke down in July 1997 and, following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray returned to the family home.

In October 1997 Mr Murray commenced an Agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife where he lived in privately rented accommodation. Due primarily to his non-attendance, Mr Murray's place on the course was withdrawn and, in March 1998 he returned to the family home. However, difficulties with Mr Murray's relationship with his mother continued and, shortly after, he moved into Greyfriars Hostel for the Homeless where he remained until moving into Anchor House approximately six weeks ago.

## EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT

Mr Murray attended Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where his poor attendance was noted. On coming to Perth Mr Murray attended Perth Grammar School where again his poor attendance and disruptive behaviour were prevalent. As a result of these difficulties, Mr Murray attended Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. While admitting that he 'didn't like' school, Mr Murray was of the opinion that family difficulties contributed to his poor attendance and negative attitude towards his schooling. Since leaving school, and apart from a two week period spent as a Kitchen Porter and a few days casual employment, Mr Murray has remained unemployed.

## HEALTH

Apart from suffering from asthma and eczema, Mr Murray was of the opinion that he keeps in good physical and mental health.

## ALCOHOL/DRUGS

According to Mr Murray, he consumes alcohol only at weekends although recently he has admitted to drinking to excess. He further stated that alcohol was a factor in the current offence.

Apart from the irregular use of cannabis, Mr Murray denies taking drugs.

## OFFENDING BEHAVIOUR

Mr Murray's previous offences have all involved motor vehicles. While admitting to having a liking for cars, Mr Murray was of the opinion that the main factors in relation to his previous offending behaviour were his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and his continuing family difficulties. He stated that he was 'depressed and bored' and 'wanted to do something stupid'. While not disagreeing with Mr Murray, the writer is of the opinion that his disrupted upbringing and immaturity were, and remain, pertinent factors.

## OUTSTANDING OFFENCES

Mr Murray would appear to have no matters outstanding against him.

## THE OFFENCE

Mr Murray admits to the offence and, to being drunk at the time it was carried out. He states that on the day of the offence occurred, he was visiting his mother and living at Greyfriars Hostel. When he was due to leave, a friend offered him the baseball bat and Mr Murray decided 'stupidly' to take it, just 'in case any of the Muirton mob attacked me'. Mr Murray, who apparently did not attempt to conceal the bat, was apprehended on his way to the hostel.

According to Mr Murray, he regrets the offence which, he maintains, would not have occurred had he not been drinking. He also stated that he would not have used the bat.

## COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Admonishment:** Taking into account Mr Murray's age and background, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the Court could consider admonishment as a suitable disposal.

**Monetary Penalty:** It is the Writer's opinion that Mr Murray would have difficulty in paying a monetary penalty, mainly due to his present financial situation and his immaturity. However, if the Court is considering this course of action, then I would suggest the imposition of the minimum fortnightly payment.

**Deferred Sentence:** This course of action would put the onus on Mr Murray and give him the opportunity to prove to the Court that he has the motivation and commitment to avoid further offences. It could also act as a deterrent.

**Probation Supervision:** While Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision, given the fact that he is currently subject to such an Order, this course of action would appear to be unnecessary.

**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

## CONCLUSION

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until early 1996. With regard to these previous offences, the last occurring approximately twenty months ago, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority care and continuing family difficulties.

Despite a degree of isolation and continuing accommodation difficulties, Mr Murray again managed to avoid coming into conflict with the law until the current offence occurred in March of this year. In relation to this offence alcohol, along with immaturity would appear to be relevant factors.

With regard to disposal and taking into account the above information, especially Mr Murray's background, age, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the writer would suggest that on this occasion the Court considers deferring sentence for a period for good behaviour. During this period, Mr Murray has agreed to address his alcohol misuse and a referral to an outside agency for counselling is likely. If the Court is of the opinion that stronger measures are required, then I would suggest the imposition of a further Probation Order, with a condition to undertake alcohol counselling.

If the Court is considering custodial measures, then the writer would recommend that a period of Community Service be imposed as a direct alternative.

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## COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Admonishment:** Taking into account Mr Murray's age and background, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the Court could consider admonishment as a suitable disposal.

**Monetary Penalty:** It is the Writer's opinion that Mr Murray would have difficulty in paying a monetary penalty, mainly due to his present financial situation and his immaturity. However, if the Court is considering this course of action, then I would suggest the imposition of the minimum fortnightly payment.

**Deferred Sentence:** This course of action would put the onus on Mr Murray and give him the opportunity to prove to the Court that he has the motivation and commitment to avoid further offences. It could also act as a deterrent.

**Probation Supervision:** While Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision, given the fact that he is currently subject to such an Order, this course of action would appear to be unnecessary.

**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

## CONCLUSION

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until early 1996. With regard to these previous offences, the last occurring approximately twenty months ago, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority care and continuing family difficulties.

Despite a degree of isolation and continuing accommodation difficulties, Mr Murray again managed to avoid coming into conflict with the law until the current offence occurred in March of this year. In relation to this offence alcohol, along with immaturity would appear to be relevant factors.

With regard to disposal and taking into account the above information, especially Mr Murray's background, age, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the writer would suggest that on this occasion the Court considers deferring sentence for a period for good behaviour. During this period, Mr Murray has agreed to address his alcohol misuse and a referral to an outside agency for counselling is likely. If the Court is of the opinion that stronger measures are required, then I would suggest the imposition of a further Probation Order, with a condition to undertake alcohol counselling.

If the Court is considering custodial measures, then the writer would recommend that a period of Community Service be imposed as a direct alternative.

### BASIS OF REPORT

This report is based on one office interview with Mr Murray and reference to Departmental Records. The Writer also supervises Mr Murray's current Probation Order.

### ACCOMMODATION

Mr Murray currently resides with [redacted] in a three bedroom, privately owned bungalow in Kinross. This is supported accommodation which is financed by the Social Work Department. Mr Murray's mother and his two step-sisters reside in Stanley.

## **FINANCE**

At present, Mr Murray is in receipt of Jobseekers Allowance totalling £38 per week. As his accommodation is paid by the Social Work Department, his only regular financial outlay is the repayment of a DSS loan totalling £4.44 per week.

## **PERSONAL HISTORY**

Born in Glasgow, Mr Murray grew up in the Easterhouse area and never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between his mother and a Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and, as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. Shortly after they moved to Coupar Angus and then to Stanley where Mrs Murray and her two daughters remain.

Mrs Murray has now separated from Mr Waddell who has a history of drug and alcohol abuse. In June 1995 Mr Waddell was charged with physically assaulting Mr Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault, and continuing family difficulties, Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care. For the first eight months Mr Murray resided with foster carers but, due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Following an appearance at the Children's Panel, Mr Murray was discharged from Local Authority care on 6.2.97. Due to friction between him and his mother, Mr Murray immediately left Perth to go to Glasgow to live with relatives.

On 19.3.97 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic Offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Shortly after his release, on 2.5.97 and, due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow and continuing friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation where he presently remains. However, in effect, Mr Murray continues to spend much of his time in Stanley.

## **EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT**

Mr Murray attended Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where his poor attendance was noted. On coming to Perth Mr Murray attended Perth Grammar School where again his poor attendance and disruptive behaviour were prevalent. As a result of these difficulties, Mr Murray attended Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. While admitting that he 'didn't like' school, Mr Murray was of the opinion that family difficulties contributed to his poor attendance and negative attitude towards his schooling. Since leaving school, and despite efforts, Mr Murray has remained unemployed.

## **HEALTH**

Apart from suffering from asthma and eczema, Mr Murray was of the opinion that he keeps in good physical and mental health.

## **ALCOHOL/DRUGS**

According to Mr Murray, he consumes alcohol at weekends only and does not believe he has a problem. He further stated that he 'doesn't take drugs, just fags'. Neither appeared to be a factor in the offence.

## **OUTSTANDING OFFENCES**

Mr Murray would appear to have no matters outstanding against him.

## **OFFENDING BEHAVIOUR**

Mr Murray's present and previous offences have all involved motor vehicles. While admitting to having a liking for cars, Mr Murray was of the opinion that the main factors in relation to his offending behaviour were his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and his continuing family difficulties. He stated that he was 'depressed and bored' and 'wanted to do something stupid'.

However, he maintained that he regretted his involvement in the offences and now realised that his actions were 'stupid'. He further stated that he did not intend becoming involved in further offences.

While the Writer is of the opinion that immaturity was also a factor in relation to Mr Murray's offences, it appears that his recent period in custody had a salutary effect on him and in all probability is likely to be a deterrent to future offending behaviour. Mr Murray has been involved in no future offences since the current ones which occurred in October 1996.

## **THE OFFENCE**

**Probation Supervision:** While Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision, given the fact that he is currently subject to such an Order, this course of action would appear to be unnecessary.

**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

**CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATION**

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until early last year. With regard to these offences, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority care and his continuing family difficulties. However, Mr Murray's position is now more settled and he is of the opinion that he will become involved in no further offences.

Taking into account Mr Murray's background and age, the fact that he is currently subject to Probation Supervision and, that he has not re-offended for some nine months, it is the Writer's opinion that it may be appropriate to give him the benefit of the doubt. I would therefore suggest that, on this occasion, the Court consider admonishing Mr Murray. If not totally convinced, then the Court could defer sentence for a period for Good Behaviour. A Supplementary Social Background Report could be provided at the end of the period of deferment. If the Court is considering custodial measures, then I would suggest the imposition of a Community Service Order as a direct alternative.

This report was compiled as a result of information gained while I was Andrew's worker from October 1996.

Social Work records were also researched.

Criminal records through SCRO were also obtained.

A worker from the Social Work Department in Easterhouse made a home visit to ascertain the present circumstances.

**ACCOMMODATION**

Andrew is staying with his Uncle Christopher and Auntie Karen, their 3 children in a 3 bedroomed Council house in Easterhouse. This family offered to look after Andrew when he left care and he has a bedroom to himself.

**FINANCE**

Andrew is currently receiving Hardship allowance of £30 per week.

**PERSONAL HISTORY**

Andrew was born in Glasgow and grew up in the Easterhouse area of the city. His mother Vanda Murray was not married and Andrew does not know the identity of his father. He has 2 younger half-sisters, Michelle (10) and Kirsty (7) who are the children of a long standing relationship between his mother and Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and as a result of difficulties in the community, the family were rehoused in Perth in 1990. They moved to Coupar Angus then to Stanley where his mother and sisters now stay.

Andrew's parents are now separated. Mr Waddell has a history of drug and alcohol abuse and he was charged in June 1995 with physically assaulting Andrew and his mother.

Andrew came into care in June 1995 due to the assault and continuing family difficulties. Andrew went to stay with foster carers for 8 months but due to difficulties Andrew presented for the carers, he moved into a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Andrew left care on 6 February 1997 having been discharged from care by the Children's Hearing in Perth. After this Hearing Andrew immediately left to go down to Glasgow to stay with his Uncle Chris and Auntie Karen. Andrew has fallen out with his mother over this and has not kept in contact with her.

#### **HEALTH**

Andrew keeps in good health although he does suffer from Asthma and Eczema.

#### **EDUCATION**

Andrew went to the Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where it was noted that he had poor attendance. Andrew attended Perth Grammar School when the family moved. It was seen that again he had poor attendance, had difficulties in making friends and defied teachers. As a result of school based difficulties, he went to Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. Since then Andrew had a work experience placement at a farm near Crieff as he had been given a place at Oakridge College but this did not work out for him. Andrew had been looking for possible work in Perth, but was unsuccessful. Andrew had a successful interview at Elmwood College, and was due to start there on 9 February, but unfortunately Andrew decided that his future lay in Glasgow.

#### **ALCOHOL/DRUGS**

Andrew, although occasionally having a drink, does not have a problem with drink. Andrew does not take drugs as far as I know.

#### **OUTSTANDING OFFENCES**

Andrew has a number of outstanding Road Traffic offences from April and May 1996 which are detailed in the SCRO record.

#### **THE OFFENCE**

Andrew admits to the offence. He relates that he was under pressure due to family circumstances and was feeling fed up by being in care and this is why he took and drove the car.

## ATTITUDE TO THE OFFENCE

Andrew says he regrets stealing and driving the car and feels sick about it. He said he has apologised to the owner of the car whom he considers to be a friend. Andrew says he has kept out of trouble since then and has not been charged. Andrew attended the Car Project in Perth for young people who have had Road Traffic offences. He appeared to appreciate this but does say he still has the desire to drive cars.

## DISPOSAL

### 1 Custodial Sentence

In view of Andrew's age and immaturity this would have a negative effect on him and the Court may consider this an inappropriate option.

### 2 Monetary Penalty

Since Andrew is dependent on Hardship allowance for his practical needs, this would also appear not to be appropriate.

### 3 Community Service

I have spoken to Mr Gilligan of the North and East District Community Service Team in Glasgow and he informs me that there would be a placement for Andrew. However, in view of this being Andrew's first offence, it may be that this disposal at this stage would not be an option. I do not believe Andrew would be able to complete his Community Service as in the past he found it difficult to hold down work experience. Andrew has indicated that he would be willing to comply with this if the Court felt that he would benefit from this.

### 4 Probation

In the past Andrew was subject to a Supervision Order to the Children's Hearing System and at times Andrew was compliant but at other times he was not. Andrew says he understands the possible consequences of breaching probation if the Court decided this was a relevant option.

#### Advice from Children's Hearing

At the Children's Hearing of 17 February 1997 the Panel concluded that probation would be the most appropriate disposal for Andrew.

### 5 Motoring Project

There is a Motoring Project which takes young people from the Easterhouse area who have been charged with Road Traffic offences. This Project currently has a place for Andrew which he would be able to attend whether he was on a Probation Order or not.

**6 Deferred Sentence**

Deferred Sentence, although perhaps helping Andrew break his offending behaviour, could however give Andrew the message that he has been let off this offence considering that there are other similar offences pending.

**SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION**

Andrew appears at times as a rather immature young man who has left care not really ready to be part of the adult world. Andrew however says it is time he faced up to his offences.

Andrew appeared to be co-operating with the Social Work Department until 6 February 1997 and everything appeared to be going well for his future. However, Andrew has decided that he would rather make his home in Glasgow with family down there.

I consider that the most suitable option for Andrew would be a Probation Order which would help him address his offending behaviour in relation to Road Traffic offences as well as providing continuing support. The Motoring Project in Glasgow would be part of the ongoing work with him.





Andrew has to reappear, personally, at Perth Sheriff Court on 31 March 1999, and a Supplementary Social Background Report was requested for that date. You will note that Andrew's Probation Order expires prior to this. While the writer is prepared to submit this report following consultation with yourselves, it may be appropriate for Andrew to take advice from his solicitor in Perth, eg. it may not be necessary for Andrew to appear in Court, especially if the current progress continues.

With regard to Andrew's Probation Order, I have no objection to you supervising it on a caretaker basis. As far as I am concerned, a transfer would only involve locating the appropriate Petty Sessional Division and apply to Perth Sheriff Court for a transfer.

However, the supervising Magistrates Court cannot deal with the original offence, nor can it discharge the Order for any reason. 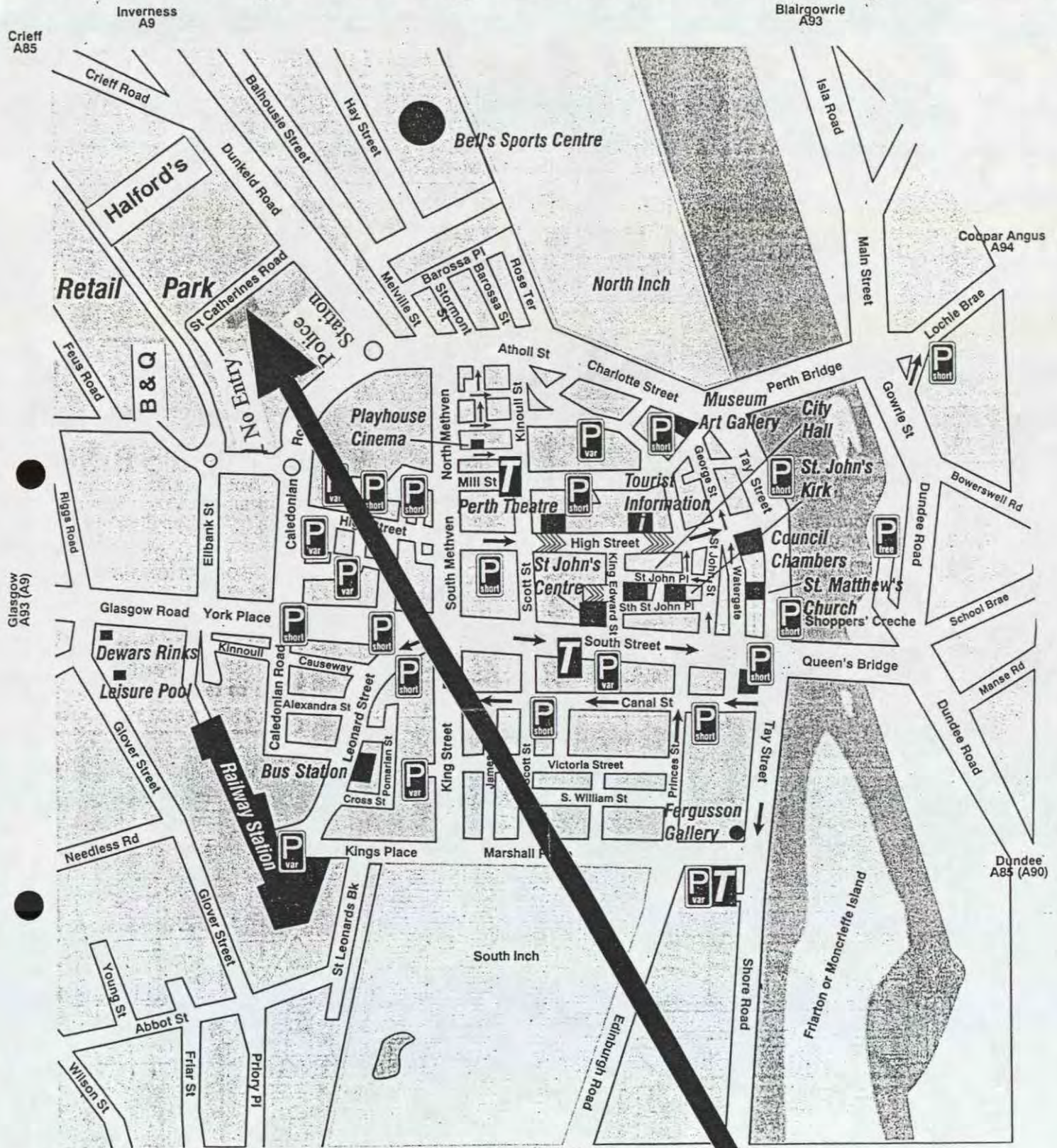



He has been ordered to appear at Perth Sheriff Court on 26 February 1997. However, the Reporter will call a hearing in Perth prior to this and Andrew will have to appear there also.

Easterhouse Criminal Justice Services would be willing to carry out a home visit to check out current situation and this might avoid your social worker having to go to Glasgow. Given that Andrew was discharged from supervision on 6 February 1997 your section will have an up-to-date report.

The contact persons in Easterhouse are Louise Rodden Social Worker (0141 7814000) or Eileen Baxendale Area Manager (same number).

With regard to Community Service there will have to be liaison with Easterhouse Criminal Justice Services about suitability and availability of placement. The social worker can also seek advice from Perth Criminal Justice Services about any matters and we will help as much as possible.

Andrew is a slight built wee boy with a very mischievous face. His relationship with both parents is warm, yet Andrew can be insolent and truculent on occasion, especially with his mum who tends to be the dominant carer.

Attending Rogerfield Primary School, Andrew has not yet settled in. His teacher states that he tends to be a loner and can appear to court bullying and rejection as a means of gaining attention. His attendance is poor and late coming often sees him loose a good part of the working day which in turn alienates him from the rest of the class. Andrew doesn't appear to have difficulty in making friends out of school, as his choice of friends tends to be other troublesome little boys. A member of the local youth club, Andrew enjoys organised games and does appear to respond and benefit from a high level of attention. Andrew hopes to accompany the youth club on their annual summer camp.

Not terribly communicative, Andrew can appear unhappy. His father and he have enjoyed discussion of football and snooker but of late, Andrew has not spent much time in his father's company.

### RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

As will be clear from previous reports, the Murray / Waddell family have been known to the Social Work Department for quite sometime. In the past year the children enjoyed a fairly stable home life while parents were assisted in providing for the childrens needs.

In the transition from Easterhouse to Milton the childrens routine and stability has been upset.

Fortunately both Michelle and Andrew have been successfully enrolled in the local primary school.

### ANDREW

Has benefitted from the past years supervision. He is a pleasant lad who having taken a long time to settle in at Rogerfield Primary has taken quite quickly to Miltonbank. In Easterhouse he enjoyed his involvement in the local youth club making a good relationship with Bob Holman the group leader.

His relationship with his dad has improved as he sees the family's situation get better but Andrew is fairly articulate in his condemnation of Joey's addiction.

On one or two occasions over the past 12 months, Andrew has stayed out very late at night, his mum and dad have tried to discipline him in this respect, explaining to him the dangers involved in wandering off.

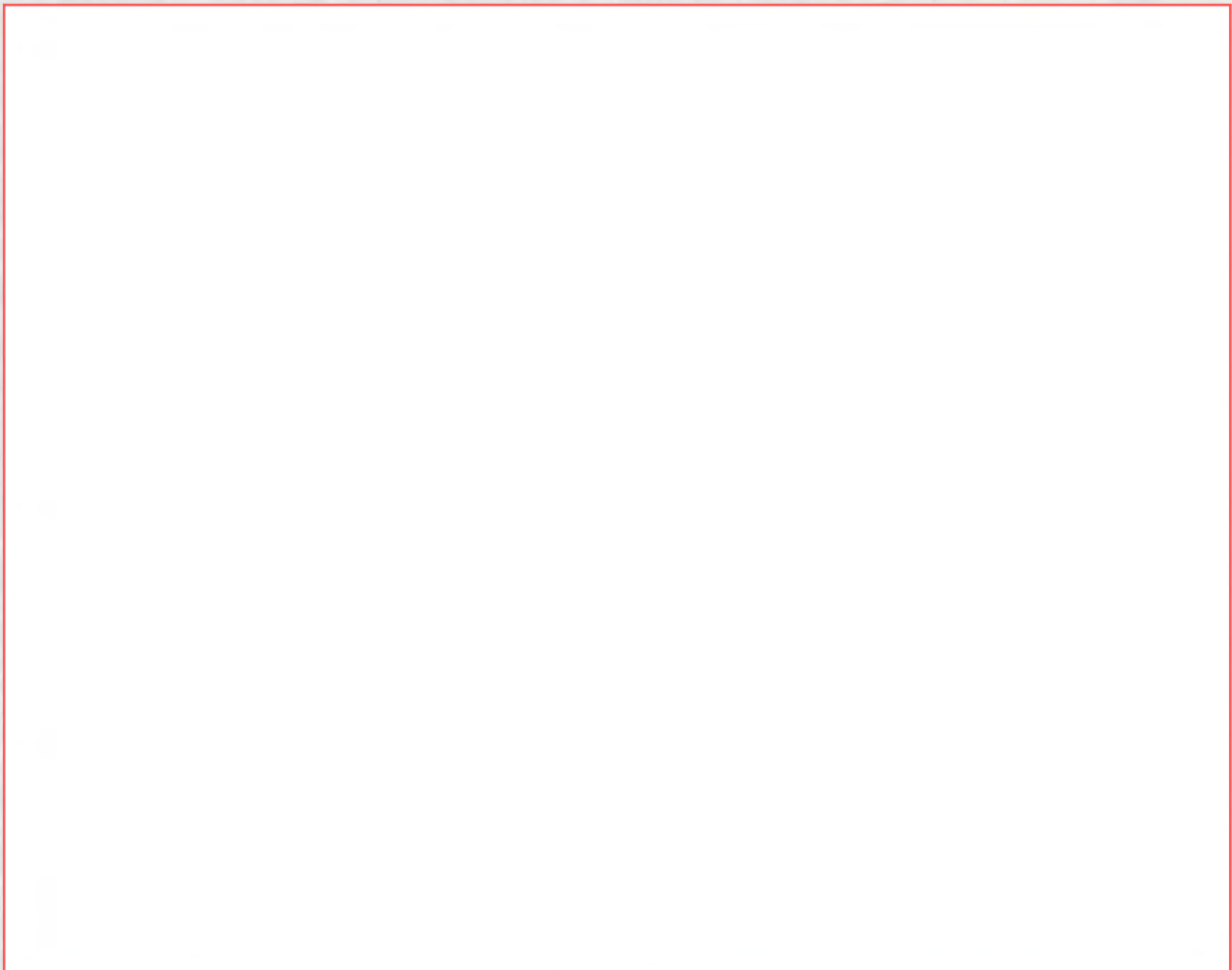
ANDREW (CONT'D)

Since moving to Milton Andrew has slipped back into some of his old behaviour and mum in particular has been assisted in responding appropriately.

HEALTH

Andrew suffers very badly from eczema. Admitted twice to Yorkhill in the past 3 months <sup>AND</sup> a more recent admission to Stobhill, the Staff Nurse said his condition is not necessarily stress related but in view of the recent upheaval his condition may well have some link to this.

Andrew also suffers from very poor sight. He has been prescribed glasses but refuses to wear them. This in turn affects his school work. Stobhill are currently looking again at sight problem.

CONCLUSION & RECOMMENDATION

During the period of Supervision Vanda and Joey did progress and were keen to co-operate with the Department. The children benefitted from the stability and regularity of routine and discipline introduced. However the family have been set back by the recent need to move house and continue to need fairly stringent support in sustaining the progress made. Andrew in particular is very much in need of Supervision in addressing his relationship with his parents and their ability to provide the necessary care. In view of the recent developments, terminating the Supervision Order at this time may be counter productive.

As indicated the case was transferred to Possilpark Social Work Department in September 1992, following the family's move to this area. At that time it was clear that the family had various, complex problems. Intensive Social Work support was mobilised. In terms of the parents it was felt that the first task would be to stabilise the parents, to enable us to explore meaningful plans for the children.

Andrew, the eldest child suffers from excema, he has been admitted to Stobhill Hospital on two occasions since September, these have been for a two-week duration. Between times he attended almost daily. Staff were concerned that his parents neglected his medical needs, and commented to me that he often arrived at the Ward at 8.00am in the morning, having made his own way there (approximately 2 miles) on a bicycle without brakes. All of these issues were continually raised with the parents, and latterly the potentially dangerous situations had filtered through. Since the move to Possilpark, Andrew's excema grew particularly acute, consequently the transition to Secondary School was interrupted through his hospital admissions, plus other school children identified him as a "scapegoat". This factor already added to an already difficult situation, in both the educational and social input. On the social side, the area the family moved to is much deprived with little resource facilities, and local youngsters were very antagonistic towards Andrew, and he spent much of the time alone.

I contacted the Excema Society and got information for Vanda and Joe to help them understand the nature of excema. Further, a Befriender was identified for Andrew and even though they only met around six times, it was extremely successful. To help integrate him into the local community he attended a Swimming Club which again proved a success. On the school front, despite a lot of support from school staff, it became clear that Andrew was not making the transition. Liaison took place between school staff, myself and the Educational Psychologist. It was the view of all concerned that Andrew's needs would be best met in an educational setting for children with special needs. Unfortunately, we had just identified a potentially placement for Andrew when the family moved. What we had envisaged, was Abercorn School. The establishment has a high pupil-staff ration-on to six, and is timed in to all aspects of child care i.e. from mentally handicapped children to other children with physically and emotionally disabled children.



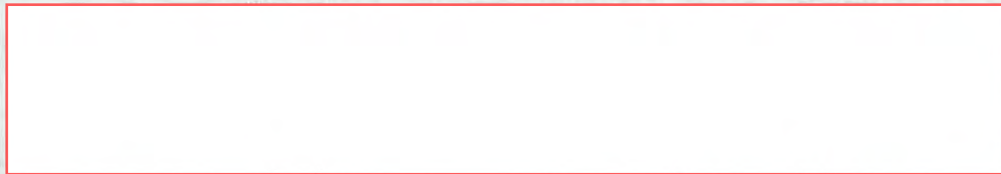
It is my view that given the continuing unresolved difficulties of the children that Supervision should continue. In this regard I therefore request that the requirements are transferred to Social Work Care team, Dunkeld Road, Perth.

This Report is by necessity brief and incomplete as a request for a report was only received on 23.03.93. This request required that the report be completed by 30.03.93 which only gave the writer five working days in which to do so. Unfortunately this is insufficient notice as I obviously had pre planned work commitments which could not be cancelled at such short notice.

**Report:**

The case was allocated to myself on 14.01.93 upon transfer from Strathclyde Social Work Department. A Children's Hearing was held in Strathclyde on 22.01.93 at which it was decided to transfer the children's Supervision Requirements to Perth.

I have seen the family on an at least weekly basis since allocation. [redacted]

[redacted]

Mrs Murray does state that she has difficulties with the children's behaviour particularly Andrew, and there have been some incidents of truancy and unexplained absences from school. However, aside from these [redacted] Andrew [redacted] seem to have settled reasonably well at school, despite the many difficulties that appeared to be present in Andrew's previous education pattern.

Mrs Murray does present as heavily dependant on social work support and involvement, however at the moment she is coping reasonably well with the care of the children. There are some difficulties such as Andrew's education and medical attention , and her ability to care for the children in crisis situation which require further social work input, and I would recommend that the children continue on supervision under Section 44(1)(a) Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 for the moment.

**Andrew Murray:**

Andrew is the oldest child and is not Mr Waddell's son. He has a good relationship with both his Mother and Mr Waddell although Ms Murray appears to undertake most of the care and control of Andrew, particularly at the moment.

Andrew at present is a pleasant articulate young man however he is prone to sudden mood swings which mother finds difficult to handle. Both mother and father report difficulty in dealing with Andrew in the family home. They report that he is cheeky and talks back a good deal. He stays out later than he should and has been involved with the police having recently been given police warnings on a couple of occasions.

**School:**

Andrew's school attendance in Glasgow was extremely poor and has improved markedly since he moved. He has not been recorded as special educational needs previously however an application to do so has been undertaken. He currently receives a very large degree of support from the special needs unit within the Grammar School. This support will be outlined in more detail by Mrs Jean Young as she has worked extensively with Andrew. A Placement at Abercorn School in Glasgow was identified as a possibility for Andrew however no referral was made to this school which mixes children with special needs with those who have school difficulties.

**Health:**

Andrew suffers badly from eczema. However this condition is being treated by his school nurse and appears to be largely under control at the moment. Andrew has had no hospital admission since arriving in Perth. He is being encouraged to take more responsibility for the care of his condition.

**Conclusion and Recommendations:**

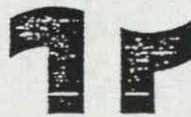

General Introduction:

The writer was introduced to the family at 5 Kings Road, Coupar Angus as Andrew's new social worker in late December 1993. I had been informed by the previous case holder that following a required transfer report in May 1993 through the familys move from Glasgow

### Education/Health

Andrew currently attends Perth Grammar School and is receiving the support of the Special Unit Base. There is plentiful reported evidence of Andrew's truanting through his early primary school with obvious improvements in this area since his move to the Grammar School. However as a consequence of previous school unattendance there are large gaps in his learning, which are now gaining the benefit of S.E.N. support. This was highlighted at an Annual Review re Andrew which I attended on 20th January 1994.

Andrew suffers from excema which in the past has required hospitalisation. This health concern has much improved more recently with regular monitoring being carried out with assistance from the school nurse. Andrew is an Asthma sufferer and requires an inhaler. He also needs the assistance of spectacles, however is extremely reluctant to wear glasses, both at home and in school.

### Conclusion:

#### Summary/Conclusion

Andrew every so often likes to inform me that he would like to change to Blairgowrie School, and as a result needs to be reminded and encouraged to realise how much is already on offer for him at his present school. I know that I have got the support of both parents and the Grammar school in our understanding of the already established support and guidance that Andrew is party to in his schooling in Perth.

Andrew when he wants to, comes across as a pleasant young lad quite able to express an opinion on a variety of issues. However, he is prone to being unaccepting of his parents instruction and they report difficulty in dealing with Andrew in the family home. I am aware through a recent home visit that he is on occasions staying out with his location unknown to his mother, with a current incident involving the police.

I am aware that mother and father have some difficulty in controlling and dealing with Andrew and to assist in this endeavour I aim to continue to liaise closely with the school and continue with a programme of work involving the use of an accept contract between Andrew and his parents.

It is following recent discussion with Mrs Murray and Andrew with acceptance of further support being offered by myself, that I would recommend that given the ongoing difficulties being experienced by Andrew's parents that he remain on a 44(1) (a) Domestic Supervision Order.

Andrew Murray is an eleven year old boy, the oldest child of Vanda Murray. Two daughters in the family, Michelle (5), and Kirsty (3), are the children of Mrs Murray and her current co-habitee Mr Joseph Waddle.

Mr Waddle and Andrew do not enjoy a very good relationship at present although Andrew talks of having had a very good relationship in his earlier years. Mr Waddle is said to take drugs which to a point are prescribed by his G.P. however, Mrs Murray states that he also gets other tablets (yellow eggs) from friends.

In the past year Andrew has found difficulty in settling down in Easterhouse and in spite of his involvement in local youth club has been inclined to wander off and stay out late. On one occasion, approximately 17th /18th January, he wandered as far away as Coatbridge, said he went to see his friend a man called Alan. Andrew was returned by police who found him wandering but they did not see "Alan". Andrew said initially that he had managed to reach Alan's home but he wasn't in, later he said he didn't know where Alan had lived and he was looking for his house. Andrew could not tell me where he came to know Alan. A more recent incident took place 22nd - 23rd January 1992. Andrew was sent to the shop with ten pounds to buy bread and milk. When he did not return, Mrs Murray searched around for him. A neighbour informed her that he was at the back of "the compound". It transpires that Andrew had lost the ten pounds and was afraid to return home and had gone to talk with his friend Bob Holman - he was not in so Andrew wandered round to the Security Guard at the back of the new shopping centre compound. He was found sitting inside the Guards office with two other boys. Mrs Murray argued with the Guard informing him that she would report him to the "Authorities" as he had no right allowing the children inside the compound.

The incident was later addressed with Andrew in his ~~own~~ and dad's presence and also on an individual interview. Andrew is in the habit of wondering off and not returning until late. Mrs Murray feels he is often round at the "compound" but this cannot be substantiated.

Recently Andrew has been coming to the office weekly. Issues addressed have been his relationship with mum - his school attendance which has greatly improved. Leisure time after school and how he spends it. In discussing his relationship with his dad, Mr Waddle has agreed to try and spend more time with Andrew, as yet Andrew is not convinced his dad will be consistent, but we continue to meet weekly and assess progress.

Attending Rogerfield Primary School, Andrew has not yet settled in. His teacher states that he tends to be a loner and can appear to court bullying and rejection as a means of gaining attention. His attendance is poor and late coming often sees him loose a good part of the working day which in turn alienates him from the rest of the class. Andrew doesn't appear to have difficulty in making friends out of school, as his choice of friends tends to be other troublesome little boys. A member of the local youth club, Andrew enjoys organised games and does appear to respond and benefit from a high level of attention. Andrew hopes to accompany the youth club on their annual summer camp.

Not terribly communicative, Andrew can appear unhappy. His father and he have enjoyed discussion of football and snooker but of late, Andrew has not spent much time in his father's company.

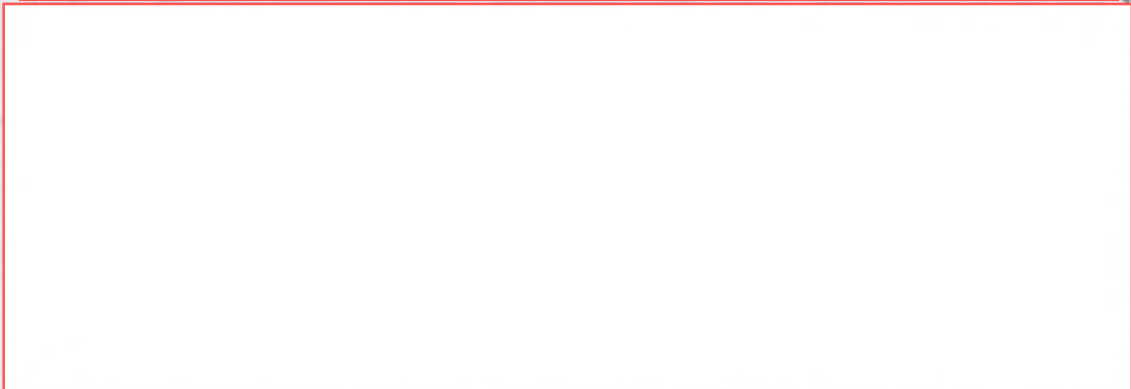

Andrew Murray (11 years), C/O Bellahouston Guest House

10.01.91

Andrew is the son of Vanda Murray, who is the sister of Christopher Murray.

Andrew called at the Social Work Department at approximately 4.35 pm enquiring if his aunt/uncle, Karen/Christopher Murray were at the department. It transpired that Andrew was to stay with his aunt and uncle for a couple of days in order to give his mum a break. Andrew had been at the couple's door for a considerable time and hence arrived at the Social Work Department in a cold condition. Andrew was advised to remain in the Social Work Department and that a worker would escort him to the Murray household after 5.00 pm.

Marie Valente, Senior Social Worker and the writer escorted Andrew to the Murray household at 5.15 pm and 5.35 pm but on both occasions no one was at home. Andrew was then transported to his paternal grandparents in the Garthamlock area but again no entry was gained. Andrew advised that his aunt Sylvia Dunn resided in the Easterhouse area and hence he was taken there, Sylvia Dunn was not at home but her husband agreed to keep Andrew overnight. When Mr Dunn was told the story, he stated that Christopher Murray was a waste of time and a compulsive gambler. (Sylvia Dunn is Christopher Murray's step-sister).

Sylvia Dunn phoned Marie Valente, Senior Social Worker the following morning (11.0191) and arrangements were made for Ruby McKeown (Homemaker) to collect Andrew and return him to the Social Work Department.

The writer phoned Vanda Murray and informed her of the situation. She insisted that Christopher and Karen Murray had agreed to care for Andrew for 2 nights and that they had stipulated the time for Andrew to call at their home.

Efforts had been made the previous night to contact Vanda Murray but the workers were unable to attain the appropriate phone number.

Vanda Murray was informed that one more visit to Christopher and Karen Murray's would be completed and if they were not at home, Andrew would be returned to her care.

Vanda Murray informed the writer that Andrew spent a number of weekends in the Easterhouse area as he often resided with Bob Holman. Graham Hammond is Bob Holman's co-worker in their work.

The writer and Ruby McKeown escorted Andrew to the home of Christopher and Karen Murray, 26 Burnett Road, Barlanark. During this journey the writer raised the topic of Andrew staying with ~~Bob~~ Holman at weekends. Andrew went on to tell that ~~Bob~~ collected him from the Bellahouston Guest House in his van. As both ~~Bob~~ and Graham are known to Ruby McKeown she in turn discussed the workers and their work with Andrew, in order to make Andrew feel comfortable. During this conversation Andrew told of having stayed with Graham 26 times, with another boy having stayed 31 times. Andrew informed that when he went to stay the weekend with Graham, he could now choose what other boys could stay if any.

No one was at home in the Murray household hence Ruby McKeown returned to the office while the writer went on a Home Visit.

On returning to the office the writer was informed by Ruby McKeown that Andrew informed her that when he stayed with Graham, he often slept in the same bed as Graham, sometimes with another child. Andrew could see no wrong in this as he told Ruby, "we are all men together". This was discussed with Marie Valente, Senior Social Worker and thereafter the writer spoke to Andrew (with Ruby McKeown present) to collaborate his earlier statement.

Andrew told that sometimes 4 boys would stay with Graham. On these occasions 2 boys would sleep with Graham while the other 2 slept in another room. The 2 sleeping in the other room would go to bed about 10.00 pm, while Graham and the other 2 boys went to bed about midnight. This being after the initial 2 boys were sleeping.

If staying with Graham on his own, Andrew could choose between sleeping with Graham or sleeping in the other room.

Andrew informed that if not wearing pyjamas he will wear his pants and T-shirt to bed.

When having a bath at Graham's, they must keep the toilet door open. Andrew informed that Graham sometimes dries his back for him.

When staying at Graham's they play various (child) games and watch videos, most videos being about God/Jesus. Andrew informed that Graham does not like girls. Graham is unmarried.

Andrew was returned to his mother by Sandra Burns, Homemaker, who informed that Andrew was very reluctant to return. Although knowing the address of the Guest House, Andrew proceeded to give the worker false directions.

When re-united with his mother Andrew had a tantrum and insisted that he wanted taken into care.

It later came to the attention of the writer that Andrew had spent some time in the playroom of the Social Work Department. This room is generally kept tidy and was so when Andrew went into the room. For the brief period that he spent in the room it was left looking as if a bomb had hit it.

A letter was hand delivered to the family home on 14.01.91 asking Christopher and Karen Murray to contact the writer as soon as possible. They still had not contacted the writer at the time of writing (15.01.91).

**Brief Summary:** Andrew moved up from Glasgow last week and is staying temporary with his mother and 2 sisters in Stanley. He needs to move out as Mrs. Murray is not allowed to have him stay.

## Community Resource Team

This team is split into providing two main areas of work:

1) Independent Living Team

To help, support and train young people 16+ who were in care on their 16th birthday to move eventually to their own accommodation as appropriate to their needs.

2) Resource Team

To provide intensive support to Fieldwork Teams to prevent young people being received into care. This is achieved through Intensive Community Assessment, Alternative to Care and diversory programmes and group work initiatives. Resource Workers develop links with organisations in the community both statutory and voluntary in order to ascertain the services available for young people to identify gaps in service provision and encourage and support the provision of additional community resources. This team is essential in the Department's aim to maintain young people experiencing problems at home within their own community when at all possible.

### Referral Criteria:

#### Resource Team

The team provides a district wide resource. Priority will be given to those children or young persons who are at immediate risk of being received into care.

It is expected that individual team seniors will have been consulted prior to referral.

#### IL Team

Refer when identified that young people will most likely move into Independent Living.

NB This could be done most effectively at the Review nearest the YP's 15th birthday.

## MEETING - 3.4.97

### Discussion

Andrew is currently serving a 3 month custodial sentence at Polmont, Falkirk and is due to be released 3rd May 1997. Ann Marie has maintained contact with Andrew and has had 1 visit to Polmont with Andrew's mother.

Ann Marie reported that Life Skills work had not taken place while Andrew resided in James Street Unit.

Irene Wilson has had contact with Andrew in the past and he is registered with Perth Careers Service and Perth Job Centre. Andrew will be entitled to benefits on his release from Polmont.

### Andrew

Andrew presented as distressed and emotionally unstable on arrival at Polmont. He threatened suicide and cried through the night. He is being detained in the medical wing for observation. Ann Marie reported that he appeared more settled and had a positive attitude, counting the days until his release and looking forward.

Andrew is being kept occupied and is given domestic/cleaning task as a short work programme.

On his release Andrew is seeking accommodation preferring to stay somewhere in Perth town centre. He is open to the idea of supported accommodation and to seeking some employment.

Andrew is allowed 2 visits each month and is looking positively towards his mother visiting again.

### Decisions

1. Ann Marie and Irene to make a joint visit to Polmont.
  - i) A finishing exercise re residential
  - ii) Introduce new worker
  - iii) Setting boundaries and clarifying workers involvement
  - iv) Making plans for Andrew's introduction back to the community.
2. Irene will contact Robbie Duncan, Criminal Justice Department to advise of her involvement and plans to visit Polmont.
3. Irene to contact Polmont re visit.
4. Irene to contact Steve Sweeney to advise of her involvement.

## Plans

It was considered that residence with Andrew's mother and younger siblings was inappropriate although Andrew may stay some nights with his family.

Supported accommodation will be considered and Irene felt that Andrew will need a high degree of emotional support on his return to the community.

Irene will assist Andrew in re-establishing contact with Julie Gardiner, Perth Job Centre and with contact with the careers ~~advice~~ *service*.

Support will be given to enable Andrew to sort out his financial situation.

A Network Meeting will be scheduled for Andrew's return to discuss current issues and plan with Andrew and his family re future supports.



In accordance with Section 232 of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 I have to report that the above named has failed to observe the conditions of their Probation Order.

### GROUNDS OF BREACH

Mr Murray is in Breach of this Probation Order on two counts. On 27 October 2000 he was convicted at Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court and sentenced to 4 months plus 2 months consecutively in a Young Offenders Institution for an offence committed in July 2000 to which he had plead guilty.

He failed to attend set appointments at my office regarding his Probation plus Unpaid Work on 23 October 2000.

Mr Murray has also failed to comply with the condition of Unpaid Work from 23 September 2000 until incarcerated. He failed to notify me of his whereabouts or any change of address or keep me advised regarding his circumstances.

### CONCLUSION/RECOMMENDATION

Social Background and Community Service Reports had been ordered by Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court for Mr Murray's original sentence date on 1 September 2000. He failed to appear on that date due to sickness, producing a medical certificate and his case was deferred until 22 September 2000. Mr Murray then failed to attend and a Warrant to Apprehend him was granted.


On 27 October 2000 he appeared at Glasgow Sheriff Summary Court and was sentenced to

imprisonment as detailed.

I understand that an earlier Community Service Order of 200 hours imposed in 1999 and supervised by the writer before transfer by this Court to Glasgow's jurisdiction was Breached by colleagues in Glasgow.

At the time of writing Mr Murray is due to appear for sentence for Breach of Supervised Attendance Order intimated to this Court by my colleague Mrs Barbara Pow. I am currently due to see Mr Murray to undertake Social Background and Community Service Reports for his appearance in connection with these matters on 4 January 2001. The writer had not been made aware that Mr Murray had been apprehended and incarcerated until his whereabouts became known to this Court, due to the Breach of Supervised Attendance Order being intimated.

Given the current circumstances I would recommend that the Court consider revocation of this Order and imposition of an alternative sentence. It appears clear that Mr Murray is not motivated to perhaps comply with Probation or Unpaid Work condition and indeed a Community Service Order given his previous Breach by Glasgow and lack of completion locally. In the interim I shall be interviewing Mr Murray and reassessing his motivation and attitude. An updated Social Background and Community Service Report will be available for Court on 4 January 2001. and with this regard I have indicated to the Sheriff's Clerk the above information beforehand to enable the possibility of dealing with any outstanding matters simultaneously if appropriate.

### ANDREW MURRAY (DOB. 19-09-80)

I received your letter dated 8 September 1998 in relation to the above. Andrew has to reappear, personally, at Perth Sheriff Court on 31 March 1999, and a Supplementary Social Background Report was requested for that date. You will note that Andrew's Probation Order expires prior to this. While the writer is prepared to submit this report following consultation with yourselves, it may be appropriate for Andrew to take advice from his solicitor in Perth, eg. it may not be necessary for Andrew to appear in Court, especially if the current progress continues.

With regard to Andrew's Probation Order, I have no objection to you supervising it on a caretaker basis. As far as I am concerned, a transfer would only involve locating the appropriate Petty Sessional Division and apply to Perth Sheriff Court for a transfer.

However, the supervising Magistrates Court cannot deal with the original offence, nor can it discharge the Order for any reason. The essential principle is that any discharge of the Order, or the imposition of sentence for the original offence is a function of the Scottish Court which made that Order, and would have to be remitted back to it.

Given the above information, and taken into account that there is less than six months to run on Andrew's Probation Order, I would concur with you and suggest that you supervise the Order on a caretaker basis. Should you wish to clarify anything please do not hesitate to contact me.

Social Work records were also researched.

Criminal records through SCRO were also obtained.

A worker from the Social Work Department in Easterhouse made a home visit to ascertain the present circumstances.

**ACCOMMODATION**

Andrew is staying with his Uncle Christopher and Auntie Karen, their 3 children in a 3 bedroomed Council house in Easterhouse. This family offered to look after Andrew when he left care and he has a bedroom to himself.

**FINANCE**

Andrew is currently receiving Hardship allowance of £30 per week.

**PERSONAL HISTORY**

Andrew was born in Glasgow and grew up in the Easterhouse area of the city. His mother Vanda Murray was not married and Andrew does not know the identity of his father. He has 2 younger half-sisters, Michelle (10) and Kirsty (7) who are the children of a long standing relationship between his mother and Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and as a result of difficulties in the community, the family were rehoused in Perth in 1990. They moved to Coupar Angus then to Stanley where his mother and sisters now stay.

Andrew's parents are now separated. Mr Waddell has a history of drug and alcohol abuse and he was charged in June 1995 with physically assaulting Andrew and his mother.

Andrew came into care in June 1995 due to the assault and continuing family difficulties. Andrew went to stay with foster carers for 8 months but due to difficulties Andrew presented for the carers, he moved into a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Andrew left care on 6 February 1997 having been discharged from care by the Children's Hearing in Perth. After this Hearing Andrew immediately left to go down to Glasgow to stay with his Uncle Chris and Auntie Karen. Andrew has fallen out with his mother over this and has not kept in contact with her.

#### HEALTH

Andrew keeps in good health although he does suffer from Asthma and Eczema.

#### EDUCATION

Andrew went to the Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where it was noted that he had poor attendance. Andrew attended Perth Grammar School when the family moved. It was seen that again he had poor attendance, had difficulties in making friends and defied teachers. As a result of school based difficulties, he went to Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. Since then Andrew had a work experience placement at a farm near Crieff as he had been given a place at Oakridge College but this did not work out for him. Andrew had been looking for possible work in Perth, but was unsuccessful. Andrew had a successful interview at Elmwood College, and was due to start there on 9 February, but unfortunately Andrew decided that his future lay in Glasgow.

#### ALCOHOL/DRUGS

Andrew, although occasionally having a drink, does not have a problem with drink. Andrew does not take drugs as far as I know.

#### OUTSTANDING OFFENCES

Andrew has a number of outstanding Road Traffic offences from April and May 1996 which are detailed in the SCRO record.

#### THE OFFENCE

Andrew admits to the offence. He relates that he was under pressure due to family circumstances and was feeling fed up by being in care and this is why he took and drove the car.

## ATTITUDE TO THE OFFENCE

Andrew says he regrets stealing and driving the car and feels sick about it. He said he has apologised to the owner of the car whom he considers to be a friend. Andrew says he has kept out of trouble since then and has not been charged. Andrew attended the Car Project in Perth for young people who have had Road Traffic offences. He appeared to appreciate this but does say he still has the desire to drive cars.

## DISPOSAL

### 1 Custodial Sentence

In view of Andrew's age and immaturity this would have a negative effect on him and the Court may consider this an inappropriate option.

### 2 Monetary Penalty

Since Andrew is dependent on Hardship allowance for his practical needs, this would also appear not to be appropriate.

### 3 Community Service

I have spoken to Mr Gilligan of the North and East District Community Service Team in Glasgow and he informs me that there would be a placement for Andrew. However, in view of this being Andrew's first offence, it may be that this disposal at this stage would not be an option. I do not believe Andrew would be able to complete his Community Service as in the past he found it difficult to hold down work experience. Andrew has indicated that he would be willing to comply with this if the Court felt that he would benefit from this.

### 4 Probation

In the past Andrew was subject to a Supervision Order to the Children's Hearing System and at times Andrew was compliant but at other times he was not. Andrew says he understands the possible consequences of breaching probation if the Court decided this was a relevant option.

#### Advice from Children's Hearing

At the Children's Hearing of 17 February 1997 the Panel concluded that probation would be the most appropriate disposal for Andrew.

### 5 Motoring Project

There is a Motoring Project which takes young people from the Easterhouse area who have been charged with Road Traffic offences. This Project currently has a place for Andrew which he would be able to attend whether he was on a Probation Order or not.

**6 Deferred Sentence**

Deferred Sentence, although perhaps helping Andrew break his offending behaviour, could however give Andrew the message that he has been let off this offence considering that there are other similar offences pending.

**SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION**

Andrew appears at times as a rather immature young man who has left care not really ready to be part of the adult world. Andrew however says it is time he faced up to his offences.

Andrew appeared to be co-operating with the Social Work Department until 6 February 1997 and everything appeared to be going well for his future. However, Andrew has decided that he would rather make his home in Glasgow with family down there.

I consider that the most suitable option for Andrew would be a Probation Order which would help him address his offending behaviour in relation to Road Traffic offences as well as providing continuing support. The Motoring Project in Glasgow would be part of the ongoing work with him.

**BASIS OF REPORT**


This report is based on one interview with Mr Murray at his aunt and uncle's home in Easterhouse and should be read in conjunction with the report prepared by Perth Social Work Department for 26.2.97.

**HOME CIRCUMSTANCES**

Mr Murray was residing at the Easterhouse address given at the time of interview. During interview he expressed a desire to return to Perth as he felt unsettled and unhappy in Easterhouse. The writer was informed by Criminal Justice Services in Perth on Thursday, 13th March that Mr Murray has returned to his parents' home in Perth.

**CONCLUSION**

Mr Murray stated that he did not wish to be assessed by the Motoring Project in Glasgow as he did not intend to remain in Glasgow. The referral to the Glasgow Motoring Project was withdrawn for this reason. The writer would suggest that if any further information required by the court would be given by the Perth Criminal Justice Services.

**BASIS OF REPORT**

This report is based on one office interview with Mr Murray and reference to Departmental Records. The Writer also supervises Mr Murray's current Probation Order.

**ACCOMMODATION**

Mr Murray currently resides at the above address which is a hostel for single males.

**FAMILY COMPOSITION**

Mother	Vanda Murray	(37)	Manchester

**FINANCE**

At present, Mr Murray is in receipt of State Benefit totalling £60.60 per fortnight. Regular fortnightly financial outgoings are £40 towards accommodation and £5 toward the payment of a fine.

## PERSONAL HISTORY

Born in Glasgow, Mr Murray grew up in the Easterhouse area and never knew his father. He has two younger step-sisters who are the children of a long-standing relationship between his mother and a Joseph Waddell. The family moved many times in Glasgow and, as a result of difficulties in the community, they were re-housed in Perth in 1990. Shortly after, they moved to Coupar Angus, then to Stanley and in October 1997, to St Andrews in Fife. However, the following January the family returned to the Muirton area of Perth where they remained until moving to Manchester some two weeks ago.

Mrs Murray, who has now separated from Mr Waddell, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] In June 1995 Mr Waddell was charged with physically assaulting Mr Murray and his mother. As a result of this assault, and continuing family difficulties, Mr Murray was placed in Local Authority Care. For the first eight months Mr Murray resided with foster carers but, due to his difficult behaviour he was then placed in a residential unit run by the Social Work Department.

Following an appearance at the Children's Panel, Mr Murray was discharged from Local Authority care on 6 February 1997. Due to friction between him and his mother, Mr Murray immediately left Perth to go to Glasgow to live with relatives.

On 19 March 1997 Mr Murray appeared at Perth Sheriff Court in relation to a number of Road Traffic Offences when he was imprisoned for three months and made the subject of a Probation Order totalling two years. Shortly after his release, on 2 May 1997 and, due to difficulties with his residency in Glasgow and continuing friction with his mother, Mr Murray agreed to be placed in supported accommodation. However, this placement broke down in July 1997 and, following a period spent with relatives in Glasgow, Mr Murray returned to the family home.

In October 1997 Mr Murray commenced an Agricultural course at Elmwood College in Cupar, Fife where he lived in privately rented accommodation. Due primarily to his non-attendance, Mr Murray's place on the course was withdrawn and, in March 1998 he returned to the family home. However, difficulties with Mr Murray's relationship with his mother continued and, shortly after, he moved into Greyfriars Hostel for the Homeless where he remained until moving into Anchor House approximately six weeks ago.

## EDUCATION/EMPLOYMENT

Mr Murray attended Rogerfield Primary School in Glasgow where his poor attendance was noted. On coming to Perth Mr Murray attended Perth Grammar School where again his poor attendance and disruptive behaviour were prevalent. As a result of these difficulties, Mr Murray attended Blairgowrie High School for a period in 1995. While admitting that he 'didn't like' school, Mr Murray was of the opinion that family difficulties contributed to his poor attendance and negative attitude towards his schooling. Since leaving school, and apart from a two week period spent as a Kitchen Porter and a few days casual employment, Mr Murray has remained unemployed.

## HEALTH

Apart from suffering from asthma and eczema, Mr Murray was of the opinion that he keeps in good physical and mental health.

## ALCOHOL/DRUGS

According to Mr Murray, he consumes alcohol only at weekends although recently he has admitted to drinking to excess. He further stated that alcohol was a factor in the current offence.

Apart from the irregular use of cannabis, Mr Murray denies taking drugs.

## OFFENDING BEHAVIOUR

Mr Murray's previous offences have all involved motor vehicles. While admitting to having a liking for cars, Mr Murray was of the opinion that the main factors in relation to his previous offending behaviour were his frustration with being in Local Authority Care and his continuing family difficulties. He stated that he was 'depressed and bored' and 'wanted to do something stupid'. While not disagreeing with Mr Murray, the writer is of the opinion that his disrupted upbringing and immaturity were, and remain, pertinent factors.

## OUTSTANDING OFFENCES

Mr Murray would appear to have no matters outstanding against him.

## THE OFFENCE

Mr Murray admits to the offence and, to being drunk at the time it was carried out. He states that on the day of the offence occurred, he was visiting his mother and living at Greyfriars Hostel. When he was due to leave, a friend offered him the baseball bat and Mr Murray decided 'stupidly' to take it, just 'in case any of the Muirton mob attacked me'. Mr Murray, who apparently did not attempt to conceal the bat, was apprehended on his way to the hostel.

According to Mr Murray, he regrets the offence which, he maintains, would not have occurred had he not been drinking. He also stated that he would not have used the bat.

## COMMUNITY BASED DISPOSALS

**Admonishment:** Taking into account Mr Murray's age and background, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the Court could consider admonishment as a suitable disposal.

**Monetary Penalty:** It is the Writer's opinion that Mr Murray would have difficulty in paying a monetary penalty, mainly due to his present financial situation and his immaturity. However, if the Court is considering this course of action, then I would suggest the imposition of the minimum fortnightly payment.

**Deferred Sentence:** This course of action would put the onus on Mr Murray and give him the opportunity to prove to the Court that he has the motivation and commitment to avoid further offences. It could also act as a deterrent.

**Probation Supervision:** While Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Probation Supervision, given the fact that he is currently subject to such an Order, this course of action would appear to be unnecessary.

**Community Service:** Mr Murray has been assessed as a suitable candidate for Community Service which will be carried out according to National Standards.

## CONCLUSION

While experiencing what can only be described as a disrupted upbringing, Mr Murray managed to avoid becoming involved in offences until early 1996. With regard to these previous offences, the last occurring approximately twenty months ago, Mr Murray maintained that they occurred as a result of his frustration with being in Local Authority care and continuing family difficulties.

Despite a degree of isolation and continuing accommodation difficulties, Mr Murray again managed to avoid coming into conflict with the law until the current offence occurred in March of this year. In relation to this offence alcohol, along with immaturity would appear to be relevant factors.

With regard to disposal and taking into account the above information, especially Mr Murray's background, age, and the fact that he is currently subject to a Probation Order, the writer would suggest that on this occasion the Court considers deferring sentence for a period for good behaviour. During this period, Mr Murray has agreed to address his alcohol misuse and a referral to an outside agency for counselling is likely. If the Court is of the opinion that stronger measures are required, then I would suggest the imposition of a further Probation Order, with a condition to undertake alcohol counselling.

If the Court is considering custodial measures, then the writer would recommend that a period of Community Service be imposed as a direct alternative.

Andrew was asked by P C McDougall to go over the events which led up to the incident where he had sexual intercourse with this older woman.

Andrew stated that Jean, who, he thinks, is 32, arrived at his uncle's house about 3.30 pm. She had been drinking. She has been staying with his Uncle Chris and Aunty Karen.

His Mum had been in touch in the afternoon and told him about her problems with Joey. He had then phoned Nacha, (Nacha said this was about 4.20 pm) to say he would not be returning that night, as planned.

Jean then asked him if he wanted to go to bed with her. He said, Yes, and went into the bedroom with her. She had taken 3/4 full bottle of cider with her which Andrew said he tipped out of the window. He said she also had a full bottle with her which he also tipped out of the window. He said that he had not been drinking. Allegedly Jean then took off her trousers and her pants and Andrew ran out of the room.

At approximately nine o'clock Uncle Chris phoned Nacha to ask permission for Andrew to stay. Nacha said No.

Later Andrew and Jean went into the bedroom. Andrew said he was going in to see his Uncle Chris who was asleep and Jean went in at the same time. She said to him "What are you doing then?" She then sat on the bed and said "are you coming in then?" Andrew states he said "I don't know if I should - alright then". He then took his trousers down and eventually off and got into the bed.

He states he "kinda" had an erection and then he did. He said she gave him a condom which she apparently had to get out of bed and get from her coat pocket. Andrew said Jean touched his penis but nothing else and he did not touch her at all. He said they were "doing it" for about 5 minutes when his Auntie Karen came in and said to Jean, "get out of bed you dirty cow". Andrew said he jumped up, went into the bathroom, threw the condom in the bin and washed himself. He then left his Uncle Chris's and spent the night at his cousin Eddie's home.

He said he felt very dirty afterwards. Nacha reports that Andrew has been spending much more time in the shower than previously and has been complaining of soreness in the pubic region. Suggested that he should see a doctor re this.

The situation came to light because Jean was apparently boasting about this to Uncle Chris. He then phoned Andrew to check whether what she said was true or not. When Andrew confirmed her story Uncle Chris detained Jean in his home and contacted the Police, which is why they have now requested a statement from Andrew to ascertain whether or not a crime has been committed.

Andrew in agreement that he was not forced or coerced into having sex with this woman.

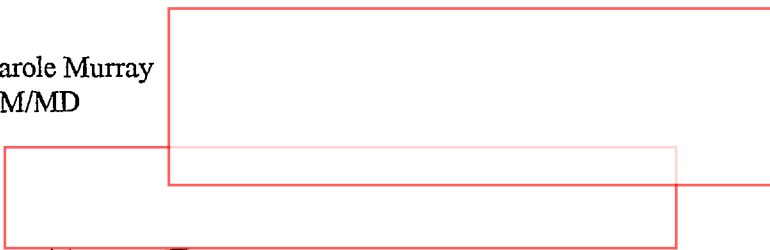

Silly behaviour followed, with Andy threatening to "egg" younger resident and generally challenging house rules. I asked Andy to join me in the office, where I spoke to him about his behaviour tonight. He calmed down and soon seemed sober. I told him Nacha wished him to phone tonight - Andrew became anxious, asking me why - was it anything to do with Friday? Was Nacha in trouble for him being there? I suggested he should phone Nacha from the office and then he could have a chat about it.

10.30pm - Andy phoned Nacha, who wasn't in, and spoke to  but  said he didn't know what Nacha wanted.  gave Andrew another number, but Nacha wasn't there either.

Andrew told me that Nacha would like him to return to live with him on a supported lodgings basis once he's been to Court. I explained it was very unlikely the Department would

fund that if they weren't prepared to fund Andy there on a mainstay basis. Andy said that Nacha wants him and if the SW Department wouldn't fund it he could get a job and pay Nacha rent.

I explained to Andy there were certain procedures which must be followed and that if Nacha is proposing any such arrangement he must go via his support worker. Andy stated that Nacha was the only person who cared about him, and that we were trying to interfere. I explained that in fact a number of staff members cared and were concerned about him, and for that reason we don't want him to build his hopes up and be let down.

### 1 Circumstances Resulting in Social Work Intervention

Andrew and his family moved from Glasgow in November 1992. At this time he was the subject of a Section 44(1)(a) home supervision order. Andrew remained on a home supervision order due to a problem in his relationship with his mother and step-father and problems with school non-attendance.

Andrew was received into the care of this department on 6 June 1995 on a Place of Safety. He has remained in the care of this department since that date.

### 2 Current Statute

At Andrew's last hearing on 2 October he was placed on a Section 44(1)(b) at 36 Woodside Crescent, Perth.

### 3 Present Situation

The decision to recommend that Andrew remains on supervision despite his age was taken because he is considered still to require a great deal of support. He acknowledges he is not yet ready for independent living of any kind. He is meant to be working with Steve Waugh on an I.L. programme but is not really buying into this at present.

Andrew's access with his mother has not been very positive lately and a request has been made to the resource team for them to identify a worker to facilitate this access and looking with Andrew and his mother at ways of improving this.

Andrew's behaviour within Woodside has recently been a cause for concern. It has been made very clear to Andrew that the continuation of his supervision order is dependent on his co-operation and should his behaviour continue to cause concern consideration may be given requesting his supervision be terminated. Although everyone acknowledges the fact that Andrew needs support he must be willing to co-operate for it to be of any value to him.

Andrew has a number of outstanding offences which will be heard by the Court not the Hearing system.

### 4 Reasons for continuing Social Work Involvement

As it has been identified that Andrew continues to need support and is the subject of a Section 44 (1)(b).

This was a meeting previously requested by Andy at the end of October. The beginning of the meeting involved Andy asking for a jacket which he feels he needs to complete his interview outfit, given the various job interviews around. I advised that this would be no problem, provided his clothes budget was not a problem.

Andy then explained that he had last night been speaking to a girlfriend and that she had been telling him of previous sexual abuse that she had apparently suffered and how it had affected her.

Andy advised that last night's conversation had "got him thinking" about his past and what he thinks about when he gets down. He stated that he also knows how it feels to have been sexually abused, and spoke of his mother's ex-partner (Joseph Waddell) having "touched him up" when he was younger.

Andy went on to describe Joe having sexually abused him when he was approx 10 - 14 years old, up until he was taken into care. This, he said, happened on approx five occasions. It involved Joe having started with Joe sticking his bottom in Andy's face and then exposing his penis to Andy. Andy alleges that Joe also forced his penis into Andy's mouth. Andy does not think that Joe ever ejaculated.

When I asked, Andy said that there were no witnesses and he did not see Joe doing anything sexual to anyone else.

I explained to Andy that he is 16 and therefore has the right to choose whether or not he makes a formal complaint to the police. However, I said that the social work department has a duty towards his little sisters in terms of protection. Andy said that he did not think that Joe sexually abused them and when I asked why he thought this, Andy said that they both sleep with their mother and Joe sleeps on the sofa when he stays, which is apparently irregular. I asked him why his sisters sleep in their mother's bed and Andy seems to believe that some children, including himself are scared of the dark when they are young and it is "okay" to sleep with their mother.

Andy seemed sure that Joe was responsible for the sexual abuse and talked briefly about assaulting him as a means of revenge. We discussed this briefly, but it may need further addressing.

Andy then described having had similar experiences with a Jim Fisher when he was approx 8/9 years old. Jim Fisher apparently "raped" his sister. Andy described this as, "he touched me and got me to touch him". Andy's memories of this are vague.

Andy feels he does not wish to make a formal complaint to the police and feels it is very private and should be kept so. He does not wish his social worker or his mother to be informed. He apparently did not tell his mother about Joe Waddell as he felt she would not believe him.

I said again that perhaps we would need to check that his little sisters were safe and he again said that he did not think Mr Waddell had abused them.

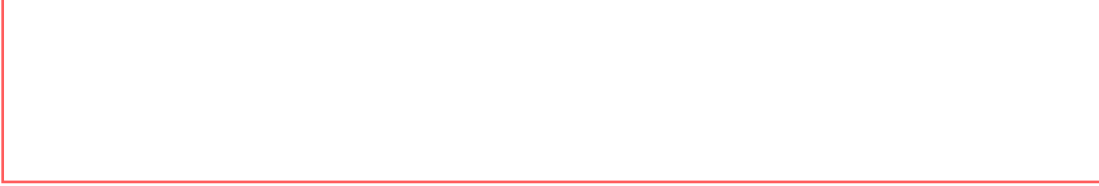
However, I advised Andy that he might need some further help and that I would be speaking to my line manager (Rhod Napier) and that I would get back to him as soon as possible.

Anne-Marie Caldwell advised that she had not entered details in the Woodside log of their conversation last night, as Andy has asked for this information to be treated in confidence.

I advised Andy that in the meantime there was a helpline in Dundee now for males and that I would look this out for him.

The situation was left for me to get back to him.

At 11.30pm Andrew started to become unsettled. Attracting attention to himself by passing comments about staff to the amusement of other residents. Andrew went to prepare something to eat at 11.45pm and made it last past the 12pm agreed bedtime. The other residents went upstairs at 12pm, however Andrew refused to go upstairs to his room and was adamant that he would not be going upstairs at 12pm. He put his jacket on at 12.15pm and left the unit returning at 12.30pm claiming he was only outside having a cigarette. On return Andrew sat in the living room still refusing to go upstairs. Staff left Andrew in the living room for a short time and then Andrew came to seek staff. Omar left the office to go to the living room with Andrew and asked him to go upstairs and settle. Andrew then informed Omar that he was having difficulties sleeping. He forwarded information to Omar regarding his previous relationship with Joey. He gave details of physical and sexual abuse that he was subjected to by Joey. He was stating that Joey beat him regularly and left him marked on occasions. Andrew had become visibly upset and while upset revealed that Joey had made advances towards him in the form of Joey forwarding his penis towards Andrew's mouth. There was little I could do to help Andrew but offer an ear that was listening to him. He was also concerned of the impact of him informing Liz about Joey. He expressed his fear of Joey and if his mum found out about Joey she would tell Joey the situation. Andrew feels that Joey knowing he has spoken about this to Social Workers will have serious consequences for him if he was now to have any contact with Joey. Andrew went on to say he has spoken to his Solicitor regarding the situation and his Solicitor told him that he himself could stop further action being taken.

Andrew was starting to become more relaxed and it was agreed that he could have a cigarette and then go upstairs. While he was smoking he revealed that he and his sister had been abused and what right did somebody have to abuse a four year old girl. He did not reveal the identity of this person or the type of abuse

involved, it seemed that it was a different person as he was not stating Joey with reference to this statement which he had done freely before. He was in a more upbeat mood and went upstairs at around 1.15am shortly after finishing his cigarette. I had agreed to spend time with him the next day going round the town and if he wished to talk more to feel free to do so. On this note Andrew went upstairs to his room.

2am Andrew returned downstairs again claiming he could not get to sleep. Spoke generally with him and he went back upstairs in a couple of minutes. Andrew and I went down town next day and Andrew was in a fine mood. Asked him if he wished to discuss anything, however he declined saying he was feeling OK.

Andrew knocked on the office door at 12.30am. He wanted to talk to me. He was unable to get to sleep. Andrew told me that he has been unable to sleep since telling Liz Lafferty that Joey interfered with him and his sisters. I did not ask Andrew many questions given he has spoken to Liz Lafferty. However, he talked, without prompting, for half an hour.

Basically Andrew cannot cope with having disclosed to Liz and Andrew Pennycook. He is scared of the consequences of this; that his mum will find out. He said he hates himself and wants to kill himself. According to Andrew he hasn't showered or changed his clothes for few days. He doesn't want to eat. I did ask Andrew if he had considered speaking to his doctor. He told me he has been given a phone number but is reluctant to use it because he finds it hard to speak to strangers. I suggested it may be a good idea because there would be no fear of any consequences as the call would be confidential.

Andrew talked about his mum lying to him all his life and how hurt he is that she calls him a liar. Andrew has heard many versions of who his father is, what happened to him, from his mother and other relatives. He cannot trust anybody as he has been lied to so many times.
