HOME CONDITIONS:

The home is a five apartment upper County Council flat situated in an area where there is a rising incidence of delinquency. Rent is £4.6.9d. per month. Income is derived from father's wage which averages £15., to which is added family allowance of £2.18s. total £17.18s. There are no hire purchase commitments but the family pay £1.5s. per week towards clothing clubs.

The home is adequately furnished but maintained in a rather untidy condition.



PERSONAL HISTORY:

Archibald is the oldest of his parents seven children and although still officially a member of the Army Cadet Force has not attended for several months. Most of his spare time is spent outwith the home, generally in company of other boys of his own age group, and he is frequently to be found in the local public park. The Court will note that in January of 1965 Archibald was placed on Probation at Hamilton Sheriff Court as the result of a number of offences involving dishonesty. During the period of his supervision he was felt to have co-operated reasonably well although he did commit one subsequent offence for which he was admonished. The Probation Order expired at the normal completion date, but the writer has seen Archibald from time to time since then as his younger brother was placed on Probation in June 1967. Since the termination of his order Mrs. Young has on several occasions asked the writer to speak to Archibald regarding his conduct which she felt to be un-acceptable.

Mrs. Young feels that her son pays no attention to instructions, and that his only aim in life is to have as much money in his pocket to spend as possible.

Archibald appears to have little interest in schooling, though he does deny the suggestions in his school report that he has caused trouble in school. He states that when he leaves at Christmas 1967 he would like to join the Army, but one feels that this is due to a vague desire to be out of the family home and away from parental criticism.

THE OFFENCES:

The offender admits being involved in the four charges labelled against him. He gives as an excuse that the time of food were taken to assist his co-accused, who had intended to go camping for his summer holidays. With regard to the money involved in the third charge, Young states that each accused received £2.10s., and that this was spent during a days truanting from school, when both boys went to East Kilbride Bowling Alley, remaining there for the best part of the day. Archibald states he returned £4. of the £5. which he received as a result of the theft of the cash from the fourth charge.

ASSESSMENT:

Archibald is a physically mature boy of average intelligence who appears to have given the school authorities some trouble by his actions and attitude. He is seen by his mother as being interested only in obtaining and spending money for pleasure, without thought of the consequences of his actions.

He has already been offered the opportunity of Probation, and while he responded reasonably well during supervision, it is felt that he has reverted to an un-acceptable mode of conduct.

In all the circumstances the Court may feel that approved school training should be considered, in the hope that his removal from his home and his associates might prove advantageous.

CONTINUATION NOTE by Approved Schools Psychologist - 28.11.67

Mr. Simpson Brown gave some further information about Archie at a review meeting today. Of the younger children in the family, one has been severely ill and as a consequence has had a kidney removed. Two younger sisters are at a special school, a 6-year-old brother is spastic. The father has had a history of drinking, wife assault and has, he believes, a bad reputation locally. Despite this, the mother maintains quite high standards of household management and the younger children are well cared for. This may tend to confirm the earlier view that Archie may have felt rather out of things at home, as presumably the mother has had to give a lot of attention to the younger ones. It tends to confirm also the view that Archie had been failing to reveal the situation at home and his feelings about this. Now, I think, that it would help Archie to be able to talk more directly.

He has been adopting rather a clownish attitude (some boys have given him the nick-name Sambo) and it is probable that this is a defence against sensitive areas of feeling.

The family live in a 5 apartment, upper floor Council flat situated in a normally quiet country town. They have lived here for 7 years, having come from the more isolated village of Cumnock. The rent is £4-8-7 per month and is paid right up to date. The home is adequately furnished but most of the furniture shows signs of wear and tear.

The mother is a very nervous type, who appears to me to have had a shock or else she is feeble-minded. She has a slight speech defect, which is accentuated when she is excited.

The father is a lorry driver, earning an average of

The mother has been left to struggle with a large family, a task for which she is not very capable and more so, when one considers the handicaps of various members of the family.

William, aged 14,

Arthur, aged 12, is in and out of hospital, with one kidney.

Elizabeth, aged 11, and Mary, aged 9 are at Special School.

Andrew, aged 6, is a severely disabled spastic, permanently lodged in Stannore House hospital. His twin sister,

Margaret appears to be fairly normal.

He was bothered with hernia, when he was younger. His mother claims that he was not lazy, because he has been delivering milk since he was 9. He did not used to be selfish, but is showing signs of following in his father's footsteps, demanding money which his mother could ill afford to give him. Sometimes, he stole from her, although he was given 10/- per week for pocket money. Recently, he told his mother that he wanted away, because she was always nagging at him.

Home Background

Mr. Young (40) is a lorry driver

He appears to show little consideration for his wife and family and is frequently out, often till very late at night. Mother (39) very nervous type, may be feeble minded or have had shock. Slight speech defect, particularly when excited. Manages home very well despite difficulties and fact that she has to cope on only [redacted] per week. There are seven children of whom Archie is the oldest. William (14) [redacted] n, Arthur (12) is in and out of hospital with one kidney, Elizabeth (11) and Mary (9) are at Special School, Andrew (6) severely disabled spastic who stays at Stanmore House, Lanark. Margaret (twin) appears normal.

Reception.

Within the classroom, Archie fared well being average in English and above average in Arithmetic. Archie's intelligence quotient was 100 (R.P.M.) so he appears to be working to capacity. At potatoes he proved a good and willing worker and this record was sustained within the various departments.

Archie settled into Reception quickly and fairly well though from an early date he proved to be something of a clown and while he would desist from this if told to by staff, his behaviour did tend to irritate some of the boys in the group. As a consequence of this he was on occasions involved in some squabbles and fights but while these won him the respect of the boys he was never seen to take advantage of this respect by bullying. As time went on the clowning tended to diminish and Archie proved more and more friendly, helpful and co-operative to staff.

Basically Archie is a nervous boy and may as a result attempt to please in a way which is inappropriate. Conditions at home are not entirely satisfactory and Archie has always tended to shy away from discussing this aspect of his life. It may well be that his delinquencies have been of a protest variety since he is reported to have wanted to leave home before his committal to Wellington. His clowning also may be a means of escaping more serious and even unpleasant thoughts and memories and beneath it all he may well have areas in which he is very easily hurt.

Few difficulties are foreseen in the school. At times Archie is likely to annoy through his frivolous behaviour but he is responsive to adult help and guidance. He should be encouraged to talk about his feelings re home by Mr. Rae and Mr. Brown will no doubt need to play a supportive role once Archie is released.

His ability at handwork and metalwork at school and his interest in plumbing as a trade before he came here indicate promise as far as the plumbing department is concerned.

REPORT by Approved Schools' Psychologist - 24.10.67

Although apparently straightforward in manner, Archie did not impress me as necessarily revealing himself. There is no obvious family or social difficulty. He is the oldest of seven, [REDACTED] A cousin, Robert Brown, now 21, [REDACTED] This youth also living (at times) in Strathaven is held up to Archie as an example of what might be.

Father and mother are seen as reasonable in attitudes now, although father did at one time, drink heavily. For a three year spell, according to Archie, the father was unemployed because of a dermatitis. The boys helped out with milk runs but as the father had been receiving payment from his former employers there was no hardship.

First offence occurred at age twelve when, with an older and delinquent boy, Archie broke into Stonehouse School. The boys amused themselves, were destructive only in the sense that they broke into cupboards for material to play with. Two years probation were completed without further offences. Now Archie, in conjunction with Sandy [REDACTED], has robbed two shops. Sandy came for Archie in the early morning. A ladder was used to climb out and in of his bedroom window. Successful in their first venture, they repeated a robbery scheme (money and cigarettes from a local shop) but were then caught.

Archie feels that this was an exciting adventure. He does not seem to assess the act but is aware of causing distress to the family.

For indefinable reasons, I feel Archie to be not quite as he presents himself. I suspect an area of emotional coldness but would be happy to have this disproved as we get to know him better.

For the moment, Archie seems to be a normal enough boy, perhaps a little nervous, (he/

(he had been picking at spots on his chin), possibly over self-centred. He may meet difficulties with some boys because of a need to maintain 'face.' He may have been influenced toward awareness of delinquent acts as an attraction from contact with his cousin. It is however one possibility that as the eldest of seven he has felt himself to be less important to his parents than the younger ones and that his movement towards delinquency has a protest element.

Archie wanted to be a plumber or a soldier. At school, he was at his best in practical subjects. The metal work teacher said "Archie's my right hand." He was interested in cadets but had flagged recently in attendance. The school may well help him to develop in his personality beyond further interest in delinquency; at best, however, more will be known before this can be a confident assumption. The parents may have been less controlled with Archie than he indicates. The father may have produced direct resentments and the mother, by her attention to the younger ones, created more basic and less apparent levels of resentment.

3. In each department, classes are to be numbered in yearly stages from below upwards, thus :—*Primary* I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII ; *Secondary* I, II, III, IV, V, VI. Any class to which the pupil is admitted after having been assigned by the Promotion Board to a secondary course shall for the purposes of this Record be treated as being in the secondary department. If it is in the nature of a transitional class introductory to the first year of the secondary course, it should be designated by the symbol Tr. instead of S.

4. The following symbols shall be used where applicable :—  
P—for Primary Department ; 3S—for 3-year Secondary Department ; 5S—for 5-year Secondary Department ; GAEL—to signify that the pupil is taught Gaelic. Types of secondary courses shall be indicated by the following symbols, where necessary, in combination :—

(L) Literary ; (T) Technical ; (C) Commercial ; (D) Domestic ;  
(R) Rural ; (M) Modified.

Courses which include a foreign language shall be marked by a dagger thus :—†

5. Entries under "Remarks" shall be initialled and dated by the teacher concerned. They should be confined to any special circumstances which have a bearing on the pupil's progress and which will be helpful to teachers under whose charge he may later pass.

6. Entries in Section IX should relate to information regarding the health of the pupil which will enable teachers to ensure that due regard is had to any disability from which he suffers.

7. When the pupil is registered as "left"—

(a) If he is not entering another school, the Record shall be retained for a period of at least five years, after which it may be destroyed ;

(b) If he is entering another school in the same education area, the Record shall be sent to the head teacher of the said other school in the manner prescribed by the Education Authority or Managers ;

(c) If he is entering a school in another education area, the Record shall be retained in the school until applied for in accordance with the following procedure. As soon as the pupil is admitted to the school in the other area, the head teacher of that school shall apply for the Record through the Director of Education of the area, who shall forward the request to the Director of Education of the area in which the school previously attended is situated. On receipt of this request the Director of Education shall obtain the Record from the school and forward it to the Director of Education of the other area, who shall transmit it to the head teacher of the school to which the pupil has been admitted.

**Refusal to take advice.**

From our records it would appear that this boy has had no after-care supervision since the implementation of the new Act in November 1969. This does not excuse the boy, but it is regrettable. One cannot, therefore, determine any other reason for the present lapse.

Whilst he was reliable within the school he could be obstinate. He had difficulty in making relationships with adults.

Apart from one major setback when he appeared in Court following an absconding, he progressed reasonably satisfactorily through the school. Firm handling was found to be necessary.

I consider it would be unfortunate if this lad were to be committed for Borstal training at this stage. I would suggest the Court should try to ensure that adequate after-care is provided because, with this, I think he could still survive in society. Accordingly, it is respectfully suggested that sentence should be deferred for 6 months or a year, at the Court's discretion.
