Home Background:

The Craig Family live in a four apartment Ayr County Council house. The furnishings are in an appalling condition, although at present the Social Work Department are trying to help with second-hand furniture from their stores. The house is very neglected and looks totally disrupted in every way. At the moment there is no electricity and informed us that he bought clothes for the children with the money he saved for the electricity account. This is possible, as there have been numerous complaints from the school about the condition of the children's clothing.

David (11) - SUBJECT OF REPORT - David is the fifth of the seven children. He apparently does not have the privileges of the eldest son or the indulgence one usually affords the youngest. One assumes, from what is said, that this boy was very fond of his mother and when she died he suffered emotionally. It would appear from the dates of his previous offences that David's delinquent activities started when his father's outings became more frequent and he was left more and more to his own devices. It will also be noticed that this was the year his mother died.

Attitude to Offence: -

David does not appear to know exactly why he has committed these offences and does not willingly admit to them.

School Report: -

Please see attached.

Assessment: -

This boy appears to be emotionally disturbed. There is little doubt that his father's threats to put him and the rest of the family in a Home has had an adverse effect on the boy. There is much controversy between the teacher, Health Visitors and R.S.S.P.C.C. as to whether breaking up the family and placing them in a Home would be beneficial in the long run. As for David, it would be foolish to speculate as to the best method in dealing with him. Unless his father realises the seriousness of the situation and makes a genuine attempt to help the boy over this difficult period, one would hesitate to suggest supervision. Nevertheless, to recommend a List 'D' School for a period of time might cause him to suffer anxiety at being cut off from his home and family. Before coming to any decision on the future of this boy, it is respectfully suggested that he be referred for assessment by the County Assessment Team.
