Information on which Report is Based:

1. One office interview with Ms MacIntosh on 19.05.2005.
2. I have known Ms MacIntosh for some years through knowledge of her parents and her sister when I was Social Worker in HMP Porterfield, Inverness.
3. I have seen a copy of the breach report that I instituted and a list of previous convictions.
4. A Scottish Executive risk assessment has been completed.

Details of any Current Court Orders:

Ms Macintosh is the subject of a twelve month Probation Order made by Inverness Sheriff Court on 3 November 2003.

Matters Affecting Disposal Today:

1. ANALYSIS OF OFFENDING

1.1 Current Offence

Ms Macintosh has told me that she does not want to do her probation Order as she feels that the punishment is out of proportion to the offence. However, Ms Macintosh tells me, after some debate that she is willing to come and see me on a regular basis. In effect she wishes the Probation Order to continue. She feels that the intensive probation requirement is not one she can presently undertake due to her pregnancy and embarrassment at being in and seen in a groupwork session.

I suspect that Ms Macintosh has not really had the best of advice and perhaps should have sought legal advice rather than make a unilateral declaration of her intent. However, she is now aware and understands that perhaps the whole matter could have been dealt with in a somewhat more fitting manner.

1.2 Previous Offending

Ms Macintosh would appear to have a number of outstanding charges that have yet to be dealt with. She tells me that there is another matter which sentence has been deferred on.

1.3 Risk Assessment

Ms Macintosh is presently four months pregnant and she tells me that she has stopped using alcohol and illegal substances. In that case I assess Ms Macintosh as being at a low risk of reoffending and of doing harm to others and herself.

2. PERSONAL AND SOCIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

2.1 Background

Ms MacIntosh's childhood was not happy. She is the youngest in a family of two. Her mother, father and sister have, at various times, been in custody and as a consequence Ms MacIntosh was a 'looked after' child from the age of eleven to sixteen. She said she was dreadfully unhappy and kept running away as she wished to be at home and reunited with her parents and her sister.

2.2 Accommodation

Ms MacIntosh lives with her mother in a privately rented house in Inverness.

2.3 Education/Training/Employment

Ms MacIntosh left Culloden Academy at the age of fifteen with no formal qualifications, a fact which she now regrets.

2.4 Finances

Ms Macintosh is in receipt of £71 per fortnight in Income Support.

2.5 Lifestyle

Ms MacIntosh had previously described her lifestyle as that where, until she became pregnant, she drank alcohol every day. If not drinking she said she used cannabis every evening. When pressed, Ms MacIntosh said she liked shopping for clothes, going to fair grounds, going to the theatre and watching movies. However, she acknowledged this was an ideal lifestyle, not one which she had been living. Presently she is busy looking after herself and her unborn baby.

2.6 Physical/Mental Health and Risk of Self Harm

Although Ms MacIntosh is in generally good health she has suffered from an alcohol induced stomach ulcer since the age of sixteen. She has no mental health problems and would not self-harm in any circumstances.

2.7 Drug/Alcohol Use

Ms MacIntosh has used both alcohol and cannabis on a daily basis since around the age of twelve. However, she is adamant that she has stopped the use of legal and illegal substances due to her pregnancy.

3. REVIEW of SENTENCING OPTIONS

3.1 Financial Penalty

Ms Macintosh is willing to pay a financial penalty if the Court should so decide to use this option. However, it must be recognized that Ms Macintosh is a single mother and as such has

to fund her own way in regard to the pregnancy.

3.2 Probation Order

At the time when I prepared the original SER for the Court I made the following statement. I can see a clear focus for Probation and would respectfully ask the Court to consider the imposition of a twelve month Order with a condition that Ms MacIntosh attends the Youth Action Team and undergo their programme "Time To Grow". However, I now believe that the probation Order should continue, if it pleases the Court, with the deletion of the requirement to attend Intensive Probation and the time to grow programme.

3.3 Community Service

If the Court is looking for an alternative to custody, Ms MacIntosh is fit, willing and able to undertake a Community Service Order whether as a direct Order or as a condition of unpaid work to a Probation Order. A place can be made available for her on the local scheme.

3.4 Custody

I assess Ms MacIntosh as being capable of undergoing a custodial sentence. I do not believe she would self-harm.

4. CONCLUSION

When sober Ms MacIntosh is a bright, intelligent and articulate person who has a nice sense of humour. Her problems are clearly linked to her childhood and her use of alcohol and cannabis. With this in mind, I would respectfully ask the Court to consider the rein station of a twelve month Probation Order. During this period I would ensure that Ms Macintosh would address her problems with the use of alcohol and illegal substances. I have also referred Ms Macintosh to the Children and Families Social Work Team at Culloden from whom she will receive assistance and advice.

Contact Record – NCH Gael Og Probation Project - **Thursday, February 19, 2004**

I succeeded in making contact with Claire after visiting her at her accommodation., a measure which was agreed with Mark Cambridge to see if it would be possible to engage with Claire this way. I interviewed her with her housing key worker present (with Claire's agreement), and also Claire's Mum Tracey, whom Claire asked to be present.

Claire was not able to produce the sick notes she claimed to have obtained in the past, with regard to non-attendance at NCH. Her attitude was that she would go back to the Doctor and get him to write a note covering as many absences as she felt necessary. She has not attended any of the 6 groups or any of the 1-1 sessions offered. Her only attendance was the initial interview. I was left with the impression that she was not pleased to see me at Assynt Road either. Although the meeting had been arranged by letter, Claire had been absent from her accommodation for a few days according to staff and therefore was not expecting to see me. She happened to call in with her Mum whilst I was there to pick up some mail.

Claire said she had not been coming to see her Supervising Officer Bob Barr or NCH as she "wanted to get breached". She stated that her solicitor is going to tell the court that she doesn't have to attend the project and she will then be put back to seeing Bob Barr once a week. Claire is refusing point blank to engage with NCH on any level and says thinks it is all a waste of time and an irrelevance to her current situation. I have impressed upon her the need to go and see her Supervising Officer.

Claire states that she is not drinking at present due to the pregnancy. She also says she is never going to offend again so does not need any therapeutic intervention. Her attitude to Probation and her Offence was one of complete disinterest. She did not say where she had been for the past few days and staff at Assynt Road hostel did not know either. Her Mum did not offer any encouragement to Claire to attend NCH but did say that she would speak to Claire about going to see her supervising officer.

Claire is still an open case to Susan MacGregor at Culloden Children and Families Team, but Susan advises me that there has been very poor engagement and they are considering closing her case. Susan will try to engage Claire again. Claire has also been open to Barnados Spring Board Project due to her status as a previously looked after child. There were issues there with chaotic living and failure to engage. I understand that engagement has also been poor with YAS.

I would assess Claire as being vulnerable and at risk of manipulation by others. She appears to have difficulty in accepting the seriousness of her situation, and I would be concerned, despite her own feelings of optimism, about her at least becoming caught up in the offending behaviour of others. However, she was explicitly clear that she did not intend to complete any courses on any basis with NCH Probation Project to address any of these issues.

I advised Claire that it was likely that she would be suspended from the Project and urged her to reconsider her stance, but Claire was unmoved and resolute.



Claire is the younger of two daughters of Tracey MacKintosh. The family have been known to Social Work Services for several years. Ms MacKintosh has a history of drug dependence, and has in the recent past, served a custodial sentence for related offences. Claire's father has a similar dependence, and he has also served a prison sentence for drug related offences.

During 2002, Ms MacKintosh was again given a custodial sentence, which she is currently serving. At the time of her sentence, Claire and her mother were living in temporary accommodation. Claire was accommodated by Social Work Services, however, the placement broke down shortly after Claire's sixteenth birthday.

Current Circumstances

Claire had difficulty in maintaining accommodation once her placement broke down, but Claire was being housed at MacGregor's Bed and Breakfast, Inverness. She turned up in Edinburgh on 30/01/03 saying that she had been asked to leave this accommodation due to marijuana being found. She had found a place at a hostel in Edinburgh. The funding of this placement was deemed to be untenable by this Council and Claire returned to Inverness and to MacGregor's Bed and Breakfast on 18/02/03. Claire's sister Nicola was released from prison and her and her boyfriend were unofficially staying with Claire at her placement. This was putting Claire's place at the Bed and Breakfast in jeopardy.

I received a call from Claire on 27/02/03 to say she had moved to Aberdeen to stay at her cousin's house (current address) for good. Aberdeen Social Work Services have been contacted and are aware of Claire's new address. Claire's cousin has been checked and this placement is acceptable to them.

Claire's family are open to helping Claire to look at her career options and to assist her to access her benefits.

Assessment and Recommendation

Claire is over sixteen, and as such, will take more responsibility for where she wants to live. In Inverness, she found things difficult, being known in the community. She has sought family and friends in Aberdeen, and has made contact with Social Work Services. As a previously Looked After Child, Claire is entitled to support into adult life.

Claire appears to be taking positive action, in terms of family support, and career options. As said, she is entitled to ongoing support from Social Work Services, and she is aware of where to make contact.

With this in place, it is recommended that Claire is no longer in need of compulsory measures of Supervision, and that the Supervision Requirement is terminated.

Claire's mother Tracey MacKintosh was released from prison on Friday 3 August 2001 and is awaiting trial at the end of August beginning of September. Since her release Ms MacKintosh has been living in accommodation owned by her partner and his mother however Claire is not keen to move to this address and is presently continuing her placement at the Rogers.
