Historic social work / residential care records - applicant: Thomas Lundie Tarbett (also recorded as Tommy Tarbett)

Review set: 100 uploaded PDFs were present in the conversation. Hash comparison identified 80 unique file contents and 20 exact duplicate uploads. The schedule analyses the unique contents and maps exact duplicates in an appendix.

Method and limitations. The records are largely scanned historic documents. They were reviewed page-by-page using rendered-page inspection and OCR-assisted retrieval. OCR can misread names, dates and handwriting, so decisive facts were cross-checked against the page image or repeated records where possible. Highlighted copies are provided separately. The classifications below are evidential labels for review, not findings of fact or legal conclusions. "Direct" means the record itself states the fact; "corroborative" means it supports context/pattern without proving the alleged act; "impact" records consequences; "contradictory" identifies positive or inconsistent contemporaneous material that should not be ignored.

Important scope distinction. Several serious entries concern parental/family neglect or violence before or during family contact, rather than abuse by residential staff. Those entries are included because they explain reception into care and impact, but they are expressly identified as such. Likewise, the 28 June 1985 sexualised incident is not evidence that the applicant was sexually abused; the records describe the applicant as a participant and document the institution's response.

Key findings at a glance

- **Placement evidence is strong.** The set repeatedly records emergency/voluntary placements at Duncan Place, Roineach Mhor and Nimmo Place in 1980; Burnside House from 14 September 1981; Carolina House from 3 February 1982; later supported accommodation at 10 Fintryside and Section 24 aftercare / Campbell's Close.
- **Strongest direct physical-harm entry:** on 10 May 1984 Tommy attended a fostering group with a "rather colourful black eye" and avoided explaining its cause. No perpetrator or mechanism is recorded.
- **Other direct physical incident:** a 1987 review records Tommy being assaulted by his elder brother Derek during family access while he remained in care.
- **Indirect/contemporaneous disclosure material:** in the May 1984 fostering group Tommy said that when "people are drunk they come and pull you out of bed"; the group leaders later recorded that some fears about parenting standards were based on the children's personal experiences.
- **Sexual-abuse evidence:** no record in this set was identified that directly states the applicant was sexually abused. A 1985 sexualised incident involving Tommy and a girl was investigated by Carolina House; it is included as contextual/institutional-response evidence only.
- **Emotional/psychological impact:** records describe tearfulness, upset, insecurity, moodiness, withdrawal, bed-wetting and agitation, particularly around family contact, failed fostering plans and inconsistent adult contact.
- **Service shortcomings:** later reviews acknowledge sporadic/less-than-intended social-worker contact, and one records Tommy feeling fed up/agitated about this. This is relevant to service quality but is not itself proof of abuse.
- **Contradictory/positive material:** many reports also describe Tommy as settled, happy/popular, in good health and having good relationships with staff/peers. These entries are scheduled rather than omitted.
- **Substance misuse:** no clear evidence was identified that the applicant misused alcohol/drugs or used substances to cope. References to intoxication generally concern his father.

8. Frequency, duration and pattern - synthesis

The records show a long care history rather than one short placement: emergency placements in 1980; continuous care from September 1981 through age 18; Carolina House for roughly eight-and-a-half years; and supported/aftercare arrangements thereafter. The specific abuse/harm-related entries found in this record set are not documented as a repeated staff-abuse pattern. Recurrent themes are instead family instability, missed/inconsistent contact, emotional upset around family relationships, and progressive long-term residential care planning.

9. Mental-health and psychological impact - absence of later psychiatric evidence

The reviewed set contains behavioural/emotional indicators (tearfulness, upset, insecurity, moodiness, withdrawal, bed-wetting and agitation), but no clear record was identified in these documents of PTSD diagnosis, psychiatric admission, self-harm, suicidal thoughts/attempts, antidepressant treatment, psychotherapy or specialist trauma treatment. If separate adult GP or mental-health records exist, those would need a separate review.

Appendix B - evidential interpretation notes

- **Direct evidence** means the record itself states the event, placement, injury or response. It does not necessarily establish who caused an unexplained injury.
- **Corroborative evidence** supports context, pattern, contemporaneous fear or institutional knowledge but may not identify a perpetrator or prove causation.
- **Impact evidence** records emotional, behavioural, educational, medical or life consequences without assuming the cause unless the record makes the link.

- **Contradictory/positive evidence** is included because records stating the child was settled or doing well should be addressed, not hidden. Such entries do not automatically disprove abuse.
- **Pre-care/family evidence** is separated from institutional evidence. It is relevant to reception into care and harm but should not be attributed to a care establishment unless the record supports that attribution.
