AO - Subject Access Request dated 09 July 2026 | 1,072-page GP record

Scope and limitation. The record was reviewed for care-placement evidence, abuse, injury, mental health, medication, therapy, self-harm, substance use, social impact, attachments and contradictory/neutral findings. No entry was identified that records a childhood care establishment as the patient's address or confirms admission, discharge or residence in a children's home, residential school, foster placement or assessment centre. No explicit sexual-abuse disclosure was identified. The entries below therefore primarily evidence adult mental-health, addiction, self-harm, assault/injury and treatment history. Medical symptoms have not been treated as proof of abuse unless the record itself makes that connection.

Evidence of placement in care	No qualifying childhood placement/address/admission/discharge evidence identified in this GP record.
Physical abuse	Page 2 contains the coded entry "History of abuse - Physical - mother". It is not linked to a care placement.
Sexual abuse	No explicit disclosure or clinician-recorded link identified. Genitourinary/sexual-health symptoms were not treated as corroboration without an explicit link.
Self-harm and suicide	Coded intent self-harm (2025), historical deliberate self-harm, suicidal ideation (2022), and fleeting suicidal thoughts with no plan (2026).
Mental health	Anxiety/depression, psychosis history, severe mental-illness monitoring, psychiatric follow-up and antipsychotic depot treatment.
Substance use	Long history of heroin, methadone, cocaine/crack, cannabis, alcohol dependence and heavy amphetamine use; addiction workers, harm reduction and rehabilitation documented.
Physical consequences	Sharp-object assaults/stabbing with laparotomy, colon surgery, elbow debridement, scar, and nerve injury; no childhood-care link recorded.

Category review and neutral/contradictory findings

Category	Result of review
Placement in care	No childhood care-setting address, admission/discharge record, GP registration linked to a placement, institutional staff accompaniment, or correspondence from a children's establishment was identified. Adult references to a rehabilitation centre, support workers and the code "resident institution" do not establish childhood care placement.
Physical abuse	One explicit coded history: physical abuse by mother (page 2/51). Assault/stabbing injuries are recorded, but perpetrators and childhood-care context are not.
Sexual abuse	No explicit or indirect disclosure linked by a clinician to sexual abuse. Sexual-health/genitourinary consultations should remain neutral medical entries unless supported by another source.
Emotional abuse / neglect	No clear disclosure of emotional abuse or neglect in care. Anxiety, distress and treatment non-attendance are documented but not linked to childhood treatment or a named institution.
Mental health and treatment	Strong evidence of anxiety/depression, psychosis history, severe mental-illness monitoring, suicidal thoughts, psychiatric follow-up and antipsychotic/antidepressant medication. No explicit clinical link to childhood abuse was identified in the reviewed entries.
Substance use and coping	Extensive and longitudinal evidence of addiction and treatment. The record does not expressly state that substances were used to block childhood memories or cope with abuse. Causation should not be inferred.
Contradictory / neutral findings	The 04-Feb-2026 consultation records fleeting suicidal thoughts but expressly records no plan. Several entries state the patient was not psychotic or showed no thought disorder. These are negative/qualifying findings and should be retained in context.
Third-party records	The report includes references to hospital, psychiatry, addiction-service and support-worker correspondence and an attachment index near pages 1062-1072. The extracted evidence sheet records the substantive text available in the GP report; original attachment images should be checked where a referenced letter is required verbatim.
