

Evidence Extraction Sheet

Scottish Redress – review of supplied records

Prepared from the supplied social-work, residential-care, education, criminal-justice, occupational-therapy, adult-support and case-note records. This is an evidence-extraction exercise only. It does not make a legal finding that abuse occurred, did not occur, or caused later harm.

Method and limitations

The supplied PDFs are predominantly scanned images. PDF page numbers in this schedule are the page positions in the supplied PDFs. Internal/form page numbers are recorded where they are legible and materially useful. Because the source pages are image scans, the accompanying highlighted copies use translucent section-level highlighting rather than searchable word-level highlights. Redacted names are not reconstructed. Where handwriting is unclear, the entry is described cautiously rather than guessed. Routine daily leave/return entries are very numerous; the schedule extracts legally significant placement, incident, disclosure, impact and transition evidence rather than reproducing every routine evening/weekend movement.

Overall findings against the requested categories

1. Proof of placement and eligibility

Strong. The historic Dundee/Tayside records repeatedly confirm care from October 1974, St Francis Children's Home, statutory supervision, grandmother/foster arrangements, Carolina House from March 1980, and discharge from care at age 18 in July 1987.

2. Direct physical abuse / violence

Direct peer-on-peer violence is documented, including a 27 June 1984 fight causing a back injury requiring two paper stitches. A 23 May 1984 staff use-of-force entry records Sharon being physically removed, but records no injury and does not characterize the action as abusive/inappropriate.

3. Direct sexual abuse

No direct record of rape, sexual assault, inappropriate touching, sexual exploitation, forced sexualised nudity or a sexual-abuse disclosure was identified in the reviewed records.

4. Emotional / psychological abuse

No clear direct institutional emotional-abuse allegation was identified. Records do contain contemporaneous emotional/psychological difficulties: insecurity, poor self-image, mood swings, family-contact stress and running away.

5. Neglect

Family neglect/desertion is part of the reason for care. No clear direct evidence of institutional neglect by St Francis or Carolina House was identified in these records.

6. Contemporaneous disclosures / complaints

No explicit contemporaneous disclosure by Sharon of institutional physical or sexual abuse was identified. Incidents, behaviour and family-contact concerns were nevertheless recorded contemporaneously.

7. Institutional knowledge / failure to act

No clear evidence of prior staff complaints, disciplinary action, concealment, or a documented failure to report an abuse allegation was identified. For the peer incidents located, staff intervention/first aid was recorded.

8. Frequency / duration / pattern

The records provide a continuous care chronology. They also record several running-away episodes in 1982, peer fights in 1983/1984, and extensive routine home/grandmother leave and return entries.

9. Mental-health / psychological impact

A 1983 Carolina House report describes Sharon as very insecure with poor self-image and marked mood issues. Later adult records include anxiety/distrust and, in 2025, "mental health problems" as the primary support reason. The later records do not attribute these symptoms to childhood abuse.

10. Physical / medical consequences

The 1984 peer-fight injury is contemporaneous. Adult records document substantial chronic physical conditions and mobility limitations, but no reviewed medical record connects those conditions to childhood abuse.

11. Substance use / coping

A 1984 care log records adolescent alcohol use and a residential sanction. A 2016 report says Sharon did not then use alcohol/illicit drugs; a 2017 adult-protection record lists an unverified concern about illegal highs/prescribed medication. No record links substance use to childhood trauma.

12. Education, relationships and life impact

School records show remedial/learning needs. A 2016 report records leaving school at 16 without qualifications, later violent adult relationships, and inability to work because of health. No reviewed record expressly attributes these outcomes to childhood abuse.

13. Apparently contradictory / qualifying evidence

Admission is variously recorded as 30 or 31 October 1974. A 2016 report imprecisely says Sharon was “born and raised” in a children’s home. Many contemporaneous logs also describe her as settled, well behaved, in good health or having “no problems”; those entries qualify the record but do not logically negate specific incidents.
