2015-10-02 Police Concern Report

Lisa Hughes Female 17/01/1980 Perpetrator

8, CARHAM CRESCENT, GLASGOW, G52 2HN Joint Home (residence of both victim & accused)

Lisa Hughes and [] have been in a relationship for the past 20 years and have 8 children together. Recently their relationship have begun to struggle and two weeks ago Lisa asked [] to move out. Approximately 3 days ago Lisa agreed to take [] back into the family home. Today [] and Lisa arranged babysitters and went out to the cinema and for lunch. Upon returning home they commenced drinking and watching Tv. At one point, after consuming an adequate amount of alcohol, Lisa seemed to completely 'lose it' and began to smash up the house. There seems to have been no provocation and her outburst was completely irrational. ... however Lisa then threw a bookcase off of him Police attended a short time later and found Lisa in the living room dialling random numbers on the phone and shouting and screaming "I want my mammy" to whoever answered. She did not/could not answer any questions put to her and indeed seemed completely oblivious to the presence of the police. At one point she smashed the house phone off of the wall and continued to shout and scream uncontrollably and refused to calm down. She required to be cuffed by the officers and was then removed to the Southern General Hospital to be mentally assessed. Prior to being seen by a doctor Lisa calmed down and stated she could barely remember anything that had happened. It is possible that the mixture of prescription medication and alcohol has been a contributory factor in her behaviour. ... It was later discovered that Lisa had been in possession of a knife at one point and repeatedly stabbed a kitchen cabinet. She was discharged from the hospital without treatment and was then detained for further police enquiry. ... The family have an allocated social worker Alex Meiklejohn at Rowan Park social work. The family have a significant history of domestic incidents dating back to 2004. There have been 22 domestic incidents reported to police during this time. ... There are currently bail conditions in place for Lisa not to contact/communicate with [] in relation to ongoing court case, ... Both Lisa & [] are in an on/off relationship. ... Lisa is said to be supported by her mother who assists her with the care of the children. Alex visits the family regularly & reacts to incidents as & when reported. ... [Procurator Fiscal] also expressed concern at the mental state of Lisa during these incidents. Alex (SW) stated that Lisa had engaged with Mental Health Team & has not been diagnosed with any Mental Health condition. ... Please find a synopsis of all the child concern incidents notified to police from 2014 - 2016...

SUSPECT THEREAFTER LEANED DOWN AND HIT HER HEAD OFF THE FLOOR WHILST SHOUTING THREATS TO KILL HER

4.1 Antecedents

The accused Lisa Hughes is 35 years of age and resides at the stated address with her 8 children. The accused is unemployed and in receipt of an unknown amount of state benefits. The accused takes a variety of medication which do not mix well with alcohol including Citalopram and Diazepam. At the time of the offence the accused had no pending cases and 1 previous conviction for nonpossession of a TV license. The accused has 7 dependants. The accused was not on bail at the time of the offence. There has been 18 previous domestic incidents recorded between the accused Hughes and the witness []. The accused Hughes is the perpetrator in 4 of these incidents.

The locus for this offence is the home address of the accused, 8 Carham Crescent in Cardonald in Glasgow. Within the locus at the material time were the accused ... This property is a semi-detached house which the accused has resided in with her children for 6 years. ...

WITNESS EVIDENCE

The now accused Lisa Hughes and the witness [] have been in a relationship for 20 years. ... The now accused and the witness [] are not cohabiting partners. The

relationship between the now accused and the witness [] is on and off. The now accused has suffered from Depression after the birth of her twins in the year 2008. Early September 2015, the now accused and the witness [] decided to take a break from one another. On Friday 2nd October 2015 the witness [] and the now accused resolved their differences ... Afterwards he and the now accused spent a pleasant day together enjoying one another's company. After both parties collected the children from school, they returned to the now accused's home address where they ate dinner as a family before relaxing for the evening. The now accused and the witness [] shared some alcoholic beverages. ...

About 21:30 hours on the same day and date the now accused became angry after allegedly receiving messages ... The now accused began to shout at the witness [] requesting him to block [] on Facebook threatening not to have communication with him ever again. ... As soon as the now accused overheard the witness [] speaking with a family member the now accused came into the living room in a hurry and began to grab hold of a book case and threw it, along with numerous items, onto the living room floor causing it to break apart. The witness [] and the accused left the living room and made their way into the kitchen when the now accused picked up a green kitchen knife and began to request the witness [] to leave the locus. ... the now accused became angry and stated to the witness [] " IF YOU DON'T LEAVE, THIS IS WHAT I'M GOING TO DO " The accused thereafter began making stabbing motions against the kitchen cupboard door with such force, causing significant indents and holes. ... the now accused was under the influence and acting irrationally, shouting and screaming and wrecking the house. ...The police witnesses [police] were on uniform mobile patrol within a marked police vehicle and were instructed to attend at 8 Carham Crescent in relation to a female causing a disturbance at locus. ... The police witnesses attended immediately. ... On entering the locus the police witnesses could hear the now accused screaming. ... The now accused was observed on her landline and was shouting at the person on the other side of the telephone. The accused began waving her arms and legs around acting irrational throwing her mobile against the living room wall. The police witnesses noted that the now accused was under the influence of alcohol. The now accused refused to communicate with police. As a result, the police witness [police] informed the accused that she would be conveyed to hospital to be assessed by a doctor. ...About 02:04 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2015 after the now accused was assessed by [Doctor] and was fit to be released. The police witness [police] informed the now accused that she was detained under Section 14 Criminal Procedure Scotland Act 1995 in relation to a Domestic Section 38 Criminal Justice Licence Scotland Act 2010. The now accused was conveyed to Helen Street Police Office where she was processed as a detained person and afforded her rights to solicitor access via the SARF procedure...About 06:05 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2015 the police witness [police] interviewed the accused under caution. The accused made admissions (See Police Interview/ Txt of Admission) ... The accused was informed that she was no longer a detained person and was now under arrest. The accused was informed that she would be held custody pending her appearance at Glasgow Sheriff Court on Monday 5th October 2015. ... The accused sustained no injuries.

Q. Do you know [] ?

A. Yes

Q. Who is he to you ?

A. My kids dad

Q. Are you currently in a relationship with [] ?

A. No

Q. Were you recently in a relationship with [] ?

A. Yes

Q. Do you have children ?

A. 8 children

Q. Who do the children live with ?

A. Myself

Q. Does [] live with you and the children ?

A. No

Q. Where do you and the children live at ?

A. 8 Carham Crescent, Glasgow

Q. Police received a call via 999 regarding a disturbance within your home address on 02/10/2015 about 21:30 hours and 22:07 hours.

Can you tell me anything about that ?

A. Myself and [] had a row. I don't know what it was about. I remember he was on the phone to his sister saying things that weren't true. I can't even remember.

Q. Who was in the house at this time ?

A. The five younger children [children] were all in bed.

Q. Who else was in the house ?

A. Myself and [] and the five younger children who were in bed.

Q. Had yourself and [] consumed alcohol and if so how much ?

A. I remember having three glasses of brandy, three doubles of brandy mixed with lemonade...

Q. How many hours had you both been drinking alcohol ?

A. Not long at all. I started drinking just after 5pm. I remember ... when we went to the pictures at ten past twelve in the afternoon of 02/10/2015.

Q. How did you feel when [] was on the phone to his sister ?

A. I don't know. I just remember shouting. I don't believe I smashed my living room.

Q. You mentioned something about a knife. What did you mean ?

A. I picked up a bread knife and told him to get out.

Q. Did you swing the knife towards [] in an attempt to hurt him ?

A. No it was an attempt to frighten him. I just wanted him out of my house.

Q. What else did you use the knife for ? What did you do with the knife ?

A. I used the knife in a swinging motion and told him if he didn't leave this is what I would do to

Q. What did you do with the knife ?

A. I hit the knife off the middle cupboard door. Not much of a role model, I suppose.

Q. Did you damage the cupboard door ?

A. I don't know. Probably pin holes, maybe.

Q. When we entered your home address we observed you sitting in a dark living room screaming. Do you remember ?

A. When I was shouting to someone on the phone. I was talking to someone through a window.

Q. It was a police van. Do you remember that ?

A. I wasn't really intoxicated was I ?

Q. Did you run around the home shouting at the children and [] ?

A. No I would never shout at my children, just []. I think [] trashed my living room. I don't know.

Q. Do you remember seeing your children upset ?

A. No I still don't even see them. I thought they were in bed.

Q. Why do you think you can't remember ?

A. Alcohol. Why would I wreck my living room. I know for a first, I didn't trash my living room.

Caution and charge/reply

About 06:41 hours on Saturday 3rd October 2015 in the presence of the police witness [police] cautioned and charged the accused as libelled within interview room 3 of Helen Street Police Office. The accused made no reply to the charge.

Domestic Abuse

Remarks

When the police witnesses [police] attended the locus the accused appeared to be having a complete mental breakdown: shouting and screaming at officers, dialling random numbers on the telephone and shouting and screaming at any person who answered, smashing the telephone off of the wall and flailing her arms and legs uncontrollably. She was unable to answer basic questions and no person at the scene seemed to be able to provide a reason for her sudden and extreme outburst. She was taken to the Southern General Hospital for assessment initially however prior to being seen by [doctor] she became lucid and stated she could not remember the majority of the previous events. It is unclear how in control of her actions the accused was at the time of the offence.

BAIL OPINION

The reporting officer has requested bail be imposed due to the threatening behaviour of the accused towards [] whilst being in possession of a knife....The support and assistance received from [] is greatly appreciated by the now accused which she expressed to the reporting officer. ... Bail being imposed would greatly impact on the support the accused and her children receive. The accused appears as the victim of domestic abuse 3 times in the last 12 months. One occasion was her ex-partner, the witness [], breaching his bail. The other occasions are the witness [] placing her in a state of fear and alarm by shouting and swearing at her and the witness [] assaulting her by holding her on the ground by placing his knee on her chest and attempting to strangle her. The accused freely stated to police witnesses [police] at various points that she would happily kill the witness [] and spend the rest of her life in prison. She further stated that the only reason she does not do this is because of her children. The officers are unsure if this is merely bravado on the part of the accused or if it is said with sincerity.

4.1 Antecedents

The now accused Lisa Hughes is 35 years of age having been born in Glasgow on 17/01/1980 and is currently unemployed. She resides at the stated address with her eight children and has 8 dependants which she financially provides for. The accused had 1 previous convictions and pending cases at the time of the offence. She was subject to bail set at Glasgow Sheriff Court on 05/10/2015 with special conditions not to contact []...

4.2.1 Description of locus

The locus for this incident is 8 Carham Crescent Glasgow. This a family home in a residential area of Glasgow.

4.2.2 Description of event

Witness Evidence:. ... They have eight children as a result of this union. The accused Lisa Hughes, knowing she had bail conditions not to contact he partner [] invited him over to her house on 29/11/2015. ... Whilst together at the home of the accused, about 2230 hours on the same date, both she and the Witness [] were in the living room drinking and watching TV. The Accused consumed a bottle of Buckfast and two cans of beer. The accused then went to her bed The accused then jumped out of bed and stated "I'M NO A TART" The accused thereafter shouted, "JUST WAIT TIL YOUR SLEEPING, I'LL KILL YOU" ... An argument ensued thereafter between the witness [] and the accused. The accused then picked up the television which was within the room and threatened to throw it and also stated she was going to start smashing the

house windows. ...The accused's then began attacking the witness [] by clawing his neck, face and torso. She also kicked him and ripped off his boxer shorts and was kicking him. ... whilst doing this she bit him to his arm. ... The accused then ran outside screaming and shouting ... Whilst in attendance the accused had stated to officers she had breached her bail conditions. About 0130 hours on the same day and date Police witnesses [police] conveyed the accused to the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital as she was complaining of injuries to her chest and arm. ...These statements corroborated the accused attacking the witness []. About 0350 hours the Police Witnesses [police] attended at Helen Street Police Office custody suite where the accused was being held after being discharged from hospital. The accused was cautioned at common law by the Police witness [police] then formally charged as libelled by Police witness [police]...

Exculpatory Evidence: The accused provided officers with a statement before information was obtained in her being the accused in this incident. This statement is thought to be false but however outlines an entirely different chain of events.

4.2.5 Caution and charge/reply

The accused was cautioned at common law by Police Constable [police] at 0350 hours on Monday the 30 November within the custody suite of Helen street Police Office to which she understood and replied "not guilty". The accused was charged by Police Constable [police] at 0355 hours on same day and date with breaching bail conditions contrary to the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995, Section 27(1) (b) to which she stated she understood and replied "He comes to me".

The accused was charged by Police Constable [police] at 0355 hours on same day and date with Assault to which she stated she did not understand and stated "I did not, that was self defence". The accused was charged by Police Constable [police] at 0357 hours on same day and date Section 38 Criminal Justice and Licensing (Scotland) Act 2010 to which she stated she did not understand and began to shout and cry at officers.

Lisa Hughes was recently involved in a domestic incident with her partner with this incident spilling into the family home, whereby Lisa assaulted her daughter, []. As a result of this incident Lisa appeared at Glasgow Sheriff Court on Wednesday 3 August 2016. At this time, Lisa was released from custody with bail conditions. In response to the incident, Lisa's 6 children were removed from her care. On Monday 8 August 2016, Lisa left the home address (where she still stays with her 18 year old daughter) about 1200 hours at this time handing her bank card and post office card to her daughter [] telling her to keep it safe. ... About 1650 hours, Ambulance received a call from a member of the public advising that he had come across a female (Lisa) lying on a grass verge adjacent to Craigiehall Street, Glasgow. He further advised that Lisa intimated to him she intended to jump into the Clyde and made reference to her children being taken off her. Officers and Ambulance attended whereby Lisa was observed to be lying on the ground unable to speak to even engage with officers. She was, at this time, unresponsive. It was thought by paramedics that Lisa had taken a quantity of drugs alongside alcohol. She was conveyed to the Southern General Hospital for assessment. Upon Lisa's arrival within A&E, she was immediately abusive to staff, shouting and swearing at the top of her voice with the ward, police were thereafter contacted to attend again. Officers did so whereby Lisa appeared calm. Shortly thereafter Lisa again became irate and unpredictable, she began kicking hospital furniture with force and screaming at officers, screaming "YOU TOOK MY FUCKING KIDS OFF ME. I DON'T FUCKING WANT THEM ANYWAY, CUNTS" "DO I NEED TO HIT YOU TO GET AWAY" "FUCK OFF" alongside other remarks. This was all ongoing within a busy hospital ward. Officers thereafter had to restrain Lisa whereby she punched the police witness [] to the left arm. As a result, she was handcuffed whereby she resisted arrest, fighting against officers and kicking out. She was difficult to manage and after quick assessment by medical staff, it was concluded she had taken a large quantity of alcohol however no drugs, she was deemed fit to be detained and subsequently arrested and conveyed to Helen Street Police Office. Lisa's conduct within the hospital and throughout this incident was irate and unpredictable, one

minute Lisa was happy to talk to officers and the next, she was screaming at them, attempting to spit at them, shouting, swearing and hitting out towards them. Immediately upon being placed within her police cell, Lisa tied her underwear around her neck and had to be further restrained,

5. Ms Hughes and [] have been in a relationship for approximately 20 years. Their relationship is characterised by incidents of domestic abuse perpetrated by both Ms Hughes and [] against each other. The incidents of domestic abuse are on occasions fuelled by consumption of alcohol ...

- a) On 24th January 2015 within the family home, [] assaulted Ms Hughes, by knocking her to the ground, grabbing her by the neck and threatening to kill her. [] and Ms Hughes had been consuming Alcohol
- b) On 2nd October 2015 within the family home Ms Hughes behaved in a threatening and violent manner, threw down a bookcase and threatened [] with a knife. Ms Hughes had been consuming alcohol...
- c) On the 29th November 2015 within the family home Ms Hughes assaulted [] by scratching and kicking him to his injury and threatened to kill him Ms Hughes had been consuming alcohol.
- d) On the 7th June 2016 at the family home, [] assaulted Ms Hughes by pushing her off a chair and repeatedly punching her in the back and on her mouth. [] and Ms Hughes had been consuming alcohol.
- e) On the 2 August 2016 within the family home, Ms Hughes attacked [] by attempting to stab him with two kitchen knives, Ms Hughes had been consuming alcohol and was shouting and screaming throughout.
- 6. On the 2 August 2016, within the family home, Ms Hughes assaulted her daughter, [] by threatening her with the aforementioned two knives and kicking and punching her to her face and body causing bruising.
- 7. Supporting fact 6 demonstrates that Ms Hughes assaulted [] (5.3.2000) to her injury. This is an offence in terms of Schedule 1(3) of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 more specifically an offence involving bodily injury to a child under the age of 17.
- 9. At times, Ms Hughes and [] abuse alcohol .Conflict between them often arises following consumption of alcohol.
- 10. Ms Hughes has an emotionally unstable personality disorder as a result of which experiences emotions at a high intensity, and this is likely to lead to impulsive behaviours, At times Ms Hughes behaves in an erratic, unpredictable and aggressive manner. For example
 - a) On the 12th October 2015 Ms Hughes attempted suicide by taking an overdose of an unknown substance. Ms Hughes was admitted to Leverndale Hospital as a result.
 - b) On the 7th June 2016 following the incident at the family home referred to in supporting fact 5 d), Ms Hughes behaviour was erratic and violent She damaged property within the family home and shouted obscenities at the children who were all present.
 - c) On the 7th June 2016 following the incident referred to in supporting fact 10(b) Ms Hughes was taken to the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital where she became hysterical and agitated and made threats against []. She also stated that she intended to throw herself into the Clyde and that she did not care about her children
 - d) On 8 August 2016 close to Craigiehall Street, Glasgow and the Clyde river, Ms Hughes threatened to commit suicide.
 - e) On August 2016 at the Southern General Hospital, Ms Hughes behaved in a threatening, abusive and violent manner towards hospital staff and property. Ms Hughes also assaulted a police officer. Ms Hughes was under the influence of alcohol
- 11. The domestic abuse perpetrated by Ms Hughes and [] against each other and Ms Hughes erratic and aggressive behaviours are likely to negatively impact on the children's emotional and physical welfare and development...
- 12. Ms Hughes and [] have shown a lack of insight into the impact on their children of their behaviours and alcohol misuse and have been unable to maintain positive improvements in their parenting.

There are concerns with regards the impact on the children with regards mum and dad's violent behaviour, normally fuelled by alcohol, not to mention mum's poor mental health. Mum has been diagnosed with an emotional personality disorder. Both parents have in the past been involved in domestic incidents which has been witnessed by some of the children. Both parents have in the past blamed the misuse of alcohol for their behaviour. Both parents have in the past agreed to separate and agreed that their relationship is too volatile. ...

... [] reported that sometimes dad would walk the children to school and mum would pick them up. ... [] advised the SG that he thinks mum and dad are the best. ... [] was also keen to advise the SG that mum was by far the better cook in the house, and that mum and dad took turns taking the children and collecting the children from school... [] was keen to talk about her mum and dad, in particular who was the best cook. She reported that dad is good but mum is better.

Safeguarder's consultation with Lisa (mum)

The Safeguarder met with mum at the family home, who was keen to advise the safeguarder about the good progress she was making for the sake of her family. Mum advised the SG that she was working hard with social work, and attending all meetings. Mum advised that the school attendance was good for all of the children, ... Mum advised that the children's dad had recently moved back into the family home, and that they were trying to make a new start for the children's sake. Mum advised that both parents took turns at household chores and also took turns in taking the younger children to school. Mum advised that dad normally takes the children in the morning and she collects them at night. Mum did advise that both parents are taking things very slowly. ... Mum advised that both parents are keen to become involved in the children's school progress, and to fully work with all agencies. Mum advised the SG that they

have a great group of neighbour who are keen to become involved with the family offering support and helping with gardening work. Mum advised that Cordia used to attend 7 days a week and then it was cut to three days and then two. Mum advised that the children are on the Child Protection Register and that Social work visit the family home weekly and attend school weekly. Mum advised that although the house has x 4 bedrooms, ... As already stated mum confirmed all of the different activities that the children take part in. Mum advised the SG that if she needs any help or advise she will not hesitate to lift the phone and speak with social work. Mum advised the SG that she was in a really good place, and that there was no alcohol issues in her life. Mum advised that she was totally focused and motivated, and was keen to point out that she has never ever taken drugs. Mum advised that her mental health was stable and she is considering the next step of seeing a counsellor. Mum advised that she has been asked to engage with a psychologist and she is also given this due consideration. Mum advised that she has a good relationship with her General practitioner, and if she feels overwhelmed she does not hesitate to pick up the telephone to make an appointment. Mum also advised the SG that she has no outstanding offences and is getting out of the house more. Mum advised that they have a family night on a Tuesday and a Saturday where they watch a movie. Mum, was also was keen to talk about the whole family taking part in an arts and craft activity in the back garden where they all hand-painted mugs. Mum was also pleased to talk about the garden and vegetable patch. Mum advised that when any medical appointments come in that both parents take turns to attend with the children...

...MUM AND DAD ARE BOTH IN NEED OF SOCIAL WORK SUPPORT TO ENSURE THAT THEY HAVE ANY ADDITIONAL NEEDS THAT MAY HELP THEM TO LOOK AFTER THE CHILDREN...

...Decision 2: The children's welfare is being safeguarded at present by their mother... Decision 3:,...The panel heard from both parents that it is their priority to have the children's best interests at heart and for the children to have contact with both parents. ...whilst Lisa Hughes may or may not be present...Although the communication is good between both parents at the moment, ...

2018-05-10 Social Work Report

Lisa Hughes – Mother

Relationships between []'s siblings & Lisa Hughes are very strained & there is high levels of animosity. Ms Hughes advised she was brought up in the south side of Glasgow by her mother, []. She advised that her mother married her stepfather when she was young & she reports that she had a poor relationship with him which resulted in her being received into care during her teenage years. Ms Hughes & her mother have indicated that domestic abuse/violence was a significant feature of [] relationship & Ms Hughes was exposed to violence & conflict regularly. Ms Hughes reported that her biological father was a not a feature in her life until she was 15 years old. Ms Hughes described a good relationship with her mother & that this improved once her mother's relationship with her stepfather ended. Ms Hughes' reported that she remains close to her siblings. Ms Hughes' identified her family members as positive supports but states that due to their own employment commitments they are not always available to support her with child care etc.

[] & Ms Hughes report that they met around 20 years ago & entered into a relationship. They have 8 children to this union. ... Whereas Ms Hughes described a volatile & abusive relationship throughout this period. As highlighted within the chronology there have been repeated instances of [] & Ms Hughes separating & then reconciling, often very quickly after a domestic incident/argument. This information would suggest that [] & Ms Hughes have a co-dependent relationship. Since 2004 there has been a regular pattern of domestic incidents between [] & Ms Hughes & concerns about the level of violence & conflict within their relationship has been frequently reiterated by various agencies involved with the family. However, both parents repeatedly failed to prioritise the needs, safety & well-being of their children & instead prioritised their own wishes & need to remain in a relationship. Social work records indicate that the family had very limited involvement with social work services until October 2014. Ms Hughes did receive support from the Family Resource Team between 2004-2006 to assist her with housing issues, social isolation, child care, positive parenting techniques & support to access other services. ... Ms Hughes was evidently struggling to meet the needs of her 5 young children at the time. There were also numerous referrals received by social work services in relation to the domestic incidents that occurred but these were mainly dealt with on a duty basis & often Ms Hughes refused ongoing support from services offered.

... There were also concerns noted about the effect of this on Ms Hughes' mental health & consequently the impact this was having on her parenting capacity. ...there have been ongoing domestic incidents reported & concerns began to accumulate around [] & Ms Hughes' relationship ... Social work records indicate that since the family first became known to social work in 2004 there have been concerns noted about Ms Hughes' mental health & her ability to regulate her emotions appropriately during periods of stress. However, these concerns were low level until July 2009 when concerns were raised that Ms Hughes' was experiencing post-natal depression & required psychiatric assessment/input. Following this there have continued to be significant concerns raised at times regarding Ms Hughes' emotional presentation & mental health & as highlighted within the chronology there have been several instances where she has been escorted to Hospital by police officers, often following domestic incidents, to be assessed by mental health professionals. Ms Hughes' was also admitted to Leverndale Hospital in October 2015 following a deliberate overdose. The outcome of these mental health assessments have generally been that Ms Hughes' presentation is a reaction to the current stressful circumstances rather than a diagnosed mental health issue. It is also frequently noted that alcohol has been a contributing factor to Ms Hughes' poor mental health. When Ms Hughes is in poor mental health & has been consuming alcohol her behaviour becomes extremely erratic, volatile & physically threatening. This behaviour has resulted in Ms Hughes' receiving police charges. During the CP investigation in August 2016 Ms Hughes has experienced suicidal ideation & went to the river Clyde, heavily intoxicated. Police officers were called & Ms Hughes' behaviour became very volatile resulting in her being arrested & charged by police. ... Ms Hughes received several police charges in relation to this incident & has subsequently been convicted of the assault There were also significant concerns noted about Ms Hughes' mental health at this time. ... They returned to their mother's care on 05/09/16 following the initial child protection case conference when all of their names were placed on the child protection register under the risk indicators of domestic abuse, parental mental health issues & parental alcohol misuse.... They engaged well with many of the supports provided i.e Functional Family Therapy & there was evidenced progress made in terms of the

parent's level of insight into their behaviour, particularly Ms Hughes' as well as the family's functioning. No domestic incidents were reported & Ms Hughes was able to consistently meet the physical & emotional care needs of the children. There was also no evidence of parental alcohol misuse in the family home... the parents attempted to resolve issues within their relationship & cohabit. However, although the parents managed short periods of time living together they were unable to sustain this. It should be noted that as historical records indicate prior to child protection registration when [] & Ms Hughes separated in the past this often resulted in incidents of domestic abuse/violence & frequently resulted in parental alcohol misuse. However, this was not the case during the period of registration. At times of stress Ms Hughes was able demonstrate that she could end her relationship with [] & ask him to leave the family home prior to tension building up to the point of the children being exposed to violence/parental alcohol misuse in the family home.

...Ms Hughes has remained the main carer for the children & has continued to ensure their daily care needs are met to a high standard. Although the parents reconciled in October 2017, they separated again in January 2018. There was an incident involving police when the relationship ended on 23/01/18 as Ms Hughes contacted the police as she stated [] was refusing to leave the family home. ...

Lisa & [] have not always made positive choices that are in the best interests of their children ...

The benefits of being involved in (out of school) activities was explained to Lisa ... Lisa has sourced a local clubs/activities for [] to attend ... Lisa has been observed to make efforts to encourage the children. A referral was also made to cordia befriending services to encourage more involvement in pro-social activities. However, this service was declined by the family as Lisa stated she felt it was no longer required & the children expressed they would rather go out with their mother. Lisa has presented as being motivated in visits to getting the children out and about ... Lisa has continued to take the children on outings independently which they enjoy and Lisa has been observed to be more confident in managing this. Lisa has also taken the children on holiday during the Summer.

During visits it is evident that Lisa is the main carer for the children, ..., Lisa tends to be undertaking the majority of physical and emotional care tasks for the children. In general Lisa manages to maintain the same positive routine for the children that she has established over the period of registration ... It has been observed that when Lisa's mood is low or she is stressed her responsiveness to the children's emotional needs are poorer ... However, overall Ms Hughes' mental health has been stable during the period of registration & following this. If Ms Hughes has been feeling overwhelmed or stressed she has sought appropriate support from agencies involved & this has prevented her entering into crisis or utilising negative coping strategies.

There have been no concerns about efforts to maintain the family home to an acceptable standard. It was highlighted that some of the rooms, in particular the bedrooms, were sparse & the furniture was in a state of disrepair. However, social work have made charity applications & Ms Hughes has sourced other decorating materials to improve the conditions of the family home.

When the children's names were first placed on the children protection register in September 2016 there were bail conditions between the parents stating they could have no contact. The parents both stated they had separated & had no intention of reconciling. There were significant concerns about the level of animosity between []

& Ms Hughes but there was also a clear pattern of repeated reconciliation between the couple without their being any real reflection from them about the impact of the conflict & violence within their relationship had on their children. There was also concerns about parental alcohol misuse & that this contributed to each parent's offending behaviour. Furthermore, there was an evidenced history of dishonesty from both parents & a non-adherence to bail conditions in place & this poor engagement with services increased the risk of the children being exposed to further incidents of conflict & harm. ... Cordia reports consistently indicated that workers always gained access to the family home & Ms Hughes engaged with workers. Ms Hughes she found this service supportive & that is maintained her motivation.

... From December 2016 [] & Ms Hughes reported they had resumed their relationship ... Given the progress made by Ms Hughes during the first 3 months of registration then it was considered at the review case conference in December 2016 that cordia checks could be reduced. ... There were no further domestic incidents reported by the Police, children or parents & the family situation appeared settled. Both parents were observed to be communicating positively with one another & supporting each other by sharing the parenting tasks. ... Ms Hughes has reported that she has found it difficult when the cordia checks have been reduced as she found this a helpful emotional support. However, she has managed to adapt to these changes.

On 09/01/17 [] appeared in court in relation to a domestic incident where he was the perpetrator of violence towards Ms Hughes... During CP visits Ms Hughes presented as being more stressed, overwhelmed & reported low mood which was of concern. Ms Hughes could also be tearful at times, her motivation appeared to be lacking & she reported more difficulty in maintaining the children's routine. It is positive Ms Hughes sought support & guidance from the writer during this time & we were able to consider additional supports. at times Ms Hughes has presented at being stressed by their behaviour. ... Ms Hughes was slightly resistant to this support continuing following the initial visit & it was felt this was partly due to her anxiety about introducing a new worker to the care plan but also because of her low mood. Ms Hughes has agreed to continue with FFT input & has expressed she has found following sessions useful & informative.

... During the CP visits undertaken within this period Ms Hughes expressed a deterioration in the children's behaviour & ongoing issues with the lack of communication within the household ... This has also been observed by workers visiting the family home. It has frequently been reiterated that the issues raised by Ms Hughes can be addressed with the support of FFT as well as other services involved & she has been urged to engage with these services. Since [] and Ms Hughes have separated (in July 2017) Ms Hughes has invited [] to continue to attend FFT sessions ... There have not been any concerns raised about either parent's misusing alcohol within the family home during this period of registration. ... In terms of Ms Hughes' mental health difficulties Dr Llwelyn from Cardonald Medical Centre provided health information during the child protection investigation. Dr Llwelyn confirmed that Ms Hughes is diagnosed with an emotionally unstable personality disorder. Ms Hughes is prescribed olanzapine an (anti-psychotic drug), citalopram (an anti-depressant) & medication for her thyroid. Dr Llwelyn also advised that Ms Hughes had previously been prescribed diazepam but had decided to stop taking these, against medical advice. It has consistently been reiterated to Ms Hughes that she should not consume alcohol when taking her medication as it can cause side effects. It is recorded that Ms Hughes is compliant with her medication, she collects it weekly. From GP records it is noted that Ms Hughes's engagement with mental health services has been sporadic & she has not engaged constructively or for a substantial period of time with

psychological services when she has been referred for support. Following the incident on 08.08.16 Dr Lllwellyn has re-referred Ms Hughes to psychological services which Ms Hughes was in agreement with. Ms Hughes was given an appointment with the CPN on 24.08.16 which she subsequently missed as she stated she overslept. Ms Hughes also missed a further GP appointment on 18.08.16. Ms Hughes did attend an appointment with CPN services but was discharged from the service. Kerry Brady CPN reported that from what Ms Hughes disclosed during her appointment it was felt that her family circumstances & alcohol use were the main issues & had contributed to her poor mental health & therefore these issues required to be addressed in the first instance. Ms Hughes did not feel input from mental health services was required at this point. Ms Hughes was referred to women's aid outreach support & lifelink counselling service for support. Ms Hughes did not attend any appointments with Women's Aid & has been discharged from this service. Ms Hughes had also not engaged with the lifelink service, citing a lack of available time due to being the sole carer for the children Ms Hughes' non-engagement with these support services is of concern. However, during visits in May 2017 where Ms Hughes' mood has been observed to be low & very emotional she has agreed to a re-referral to Lifelink which was actioned on 11/05/17. Ms Hughes was given an initial appointment on 01/06/17. Ms Hughes reported she found this appointment very difficult & felt uncomfortable. Ms Hughes also reports that she was told by the therapist that Lifelink was not an appropriate service for her & that she required input from psychological services. The allocated worker has contacted Lifelink for some feedback around this as psychological services have previously assessed Ms Hughes & they advised counselling services would be the most appropriate for supporting her as they are a time limited services & feel Ms Hughes will require ongoing support. Lifelink have suggested a re-referral to psychological services. The above was discussed with Dr Fiscan who confirmed that Ms Hughes had attended the GP on 08/06/17 in quite a distressed state, citing low mood & feeling overwhelmed. Ms Hughes was provided with medication & offered a follow up appointment to discuss whether a re-referral to psychological services was required. GP services are unsure about the appropriateness of this referral due to Ms Hughes' lengthy history of non-compliance with services. GP services have found that Ms Hughes' mood is very reactive & changeable & therefore often she is offered ongoing therapeutic support but fails to engage with this as she "feels better" therefore does not think additional support is required. Over the period of the writer's involvement Ms Hughes' mood has been variable & it is evidenced that during periods when her mental health is poor that this negatively impacts on the children's behaviour, emotional well-being & Ms Hughes' ability to respond to their needs. However, Ms Hughes has reflected on this & demonstrated that during times of stress she can seek out relevant supports via her GP & SW when required which is a significant positive. Ms Hughes is showing a greater ability to reflect on the supports being offered to benefit the whole ... Prior to separating Ms Hughes reported ongoing issues with the level of tension between herself & [] in the house ... It is of concern that if the parents do not address their individual issues that some of the same problems that arose within their relationship previously that led to domestic incidents have a higher likelihood of reoccurring if they were in a relationship... There has been some ongoing conflict between the parents, mainly via text message/social media. Over the writer's involvement it has been addressed with both parents that they need to consider the impact this has on their children & the inappropriate exposure to adult matters. Mediation support was previously considered for the parents. Ms Hughes was keen to access this ... Ms

Hughes states she does not have an issue with Mr [] having contact with the children but is unhappy about his lack of commitment to them. Ms Hughes states that although she previously allowed [] to have contact within the family home she does not feel that this is currently appropriate due to their own difficulties & it giving the children mixed messages. Cordia support was a significant feature during the child protection plan that Ms Hughes found beneficial. ... Lisa has been offering a high level of support to []. This has impacted on Lisa's energy levels, the family's finances & the general household routine. However, despite this, Lisa has shown insight into this, she has been coping well & making necessary changes to ensure disruption for [] has been kept to a minimum.

Specific Issues/ Concerns/ Risk Analysis (include child/ family strengths)

Since the children's names have been removed from the child protection register in August 2017 there have been no further incidents of domestic violence, no concerns about parental substance misuse within the family home ... The parents are currently separated ... Both parents have shown some insight into the effect their past actions have had on their children's emotional wellbeing and have stated their wish to amend this behaviour. Ms Hughes has stated this is one of the reasons she feels she cannot reside with [] or be in a relationship with him. Ms Hughes in particular has been able to reflect fully on the impact of the conflict & violence within the house & has stated a commitment to engage with services to improve the family situation. Ms Hughes has continued to engage very positively with the social work department & other services involved. ... Ms Hughes seeks appropriate medical attention if necessary. She also appears to manage day to day routines within the home. ... Ms Hughes has made more efforts to spend more quality time with the children since the writer's involvement & get them involved in local clubs & they are all benefitting from this. Ms Hughes' mental health has been relatively stable throughout this period of registration with no major incidents of self-harm or suicidal ideation. Ms Hughes has not formally engaged with therapeutic mental health services but has sought advice & guidance from services involved i.e. GP & SWS when required. Since the writer's involvement the family have engaged well with many of the supports provided & there has been evidenced progress made in terms of the parent's level of insight into their behaviour, as well as the family's functioning.

Parent/ Carer / Relevant Person Views

Lisa Hughes

Lisa does not feel she has an issue with alcohol. Lisa does state that alcohol can change her demeanour and personality. Lisa has now stated that she has separated from []. She felt that they were unable to address the difficulties within their relationship & she was concerned about the level of tension between them and this escalating. Lisa has been able to reflect on some of the unhealthy aspects of her relationship with [] in the past & is better able to acknowledge the risk this posed to her children. Lisa states she feels more relaxed living alone with the children & that she feels motivated. Lisa has stated she is willing to work with services identified within the children's care plans....

Ms Hughes has maintained a good standard of care for the children & continues to engage well with the social work department...

Measures required to improve/ enhance outcomes

Lisa to ensure that [child]'s home environment is safe and secure and that [child] is not exposed to any conflict or subjected to any form of physical chastisement.

Lisa to ensure the house is kept clean and tidy and that [child] is provided with all essential items to ensure [child] health, safety and well-being.

Social Work services to discuss safe care plan with Lisa & [] to ensure the children's safety & welfare

Both Lisa & [] to abstain from alcohol use in the family home

[Child] to be supported by parents to attend the dentist, opticians, GP and other necessary medical services regularly.

Lisa to monitor [child]'s presentation and hygiene and provide support when necessary.

Lisa or [] to support [child] to attend all medical appointments and ensure [child] receives medical attention when necessary.

[Child] to be encouraged and given opportunities by her parents to access pro-social activities within her local community...

[Child] to attend ... school every day... Lisa to support [child] with this.

... Therefore Ms Hughes sourced a football club for [child] which [child] is thoroughly enjoyed. Unfortunately this ended & Ms Hughes is in the process of waiting for a spot at another football club becoming available. Lisa has also signed [child] up for a boxing club previously. Prior to CP registration Ms Hughes advised that she struggled at times to manage all of the children during outings independently & this caused her significant anxiety. However, during the writer's involvement Ms Hughes' level of confidence has increased & she has continued to take the children on outings independently which they enjoy and has been observed to be more confident in managing this. Lisa has also taken the children on holiday during the Summer to a caravan site....

'Need for Compulsory Supervision:

Parenting: The relationship between Lisa and [] came to an end in January 2018 and there has been no further reconciliation since then. [] and Lisa present as having a much more stable and civil relationship since Christmas 2020, ...

Family & Environmental Factors: ...Lisa Hughes to undertake a Non-Offending Carers Risk Assessment (NOCRA) to ascertain if she can be a protective factor in her children's life with regards to []. The couple confirmed that they have been in a relationship since January 2019 and that [] moved into the family home in June 2020. The got engaged in the summer of 2020 and that there had never been any issues within their relationship in terms of domestic abuse.

Reasons for Conclusion: Police involvement on the 17/10/2020, 18/10/2020 and on the 17/12/2020 due to ongoing disputes between the children's parents, Lisa Hughes and [].

History of Co-operation/Impact of Intervention: ... an 18 months Supervision Order with a Conduct Order requirement - 'that the accused does not see or contact [children] unless they are with their mother Lisa Hughes'. The couple were clear that [] always adhered to the bail conditions that were applied ... Lisa advised that she did seek assistance from []'s solicitor to have the restrictions in relation to herself removed so that she could have contact with [].

Current Motivation to Change/Willingness to Co-operate: ... Lisa, mother was the person that contacted the police following the incident ... and has assured SW that if she ever thought [] was a risk to her children or had harmed them then she would call the police, as she did before.

... the overall extent of concern is low, mainly due to the parents acceptance of need for all of their children and their willingness to cooperate with the care plan, ... Ms Hughes requires to undertake a NOCRA ...'

... The relationship between Lisa and [] came to an end in January 2018 and there has been no further reconciliation since then. The family's case was closed off to social work services in March 2019 in recognition of the positive progress which had been achieved by Lisa, and that she had been able to sustain this to the benefit of her children. ... the family's case was re-opened. Lisa advised the then allocated worker that [] had begun to harass her again ... There were several more over the summer months, with [] attending at the house, shouting abuse at both Lisa and [], and banging on windows. The family were then again closed off to social work services in May 2020... [] contacted Lisa to advise that ... On receiving this information, Lisa Hughes immediately called the Police, who attended and [] was removed from the home. Lisa was reported by OOHs social work to be in a state of shock. Social work records indicate that at this time Lisa was clear about her role in protecting her children and did not express any regrets over the action she had taken in calling Police. The couple had been together since January 2019, ... and they had recently gotten engaged... The writer's first discussion with Lisa about the incident was on 14.09 via telephone, when she was very upset and stated "I know there has to be a perfectly reasonable explanation for this". ... and whilst Lisa was not disbelieving [child], she very much felt that her ex-partner, [], had a hand in it somehow as he was "always out to destroy her". She advised that since the allegation was made that she has been receiving threatening messages from [], stating "you're going to get what's coming to you" and "you deserve this". Lisa was able to speak about reassuring [child] that she believed her ..., but had also spoken with the children about making sure that they were always clear to tell the truth on everything, as there could be serious consequences if not. She said she was trying not to talk to [child] about the event specifically, as she did not want to put words in [child]'s mouth. ... Lisa spoke about knowing that people can be blinded in relationships but that this was not the case for them, ... Lisa stated that she had been clear to the other kids not to say anything to [child] as she was right to speak up if she was uncomfortable. On 18.09.20 there was a domestic incident via telephone when Lisa alleges that [] threatened to kill her, this was not heard by others in the house due to not being on speaker mode. Lisa contacted the police to report the threat. ... When the writer addressed this with Lisa, she was shocked, stating that [child] was not presenting out of the ordinary when at home. Lisa advised that she has spoken with [child] about the allegation and [child] had said "you don't believe anything I say!". Lisa stated that she again stressed to [child] that this was not the case, and that she would always be there for her children. ... Lisa also advised at this time that she had been in touch with []'s solicitor to seek his assistance in having the Bail conditions pertaining to herself removed, so that she could have contact with him. ... Lisa contacted the police after becoming aware that [child] ... refused to return home. From early October 2020, Lisa was advising of difficulties in managing [child]'s behaviour, ... Police returned [child] to the care of her mum, Lisa. ... The police records indicate that when they contacted Lisa regarding [child], that she told them to call Emergency Social Work and that she would not be coming to collect her. ... The reporting officer stressed to Out of Hours social work that Lisa did not seem at all concerned for her wellbeing and wanted nothing to do with the situation. When the writer spoke with Lisa about this she disputed the report by police

that she had not cared, stating that she had told them that they would need to contact social work as she was not at home and was at a hotel with [] and unable to get home as she had no money, ... It was noted that Lisa was also keeping [child] and [child] off from school at this time due to fears that their father would remove them from school, as relations between the parents were particularly poor at this time. ... The writer also spoke with Lisa the same day, she confirmed that [child] and [child] remained out of the house and she had no intention of speaking with them as they were saying that they hated her. ... She furthered that she had removed both [children's] name from her tenancy and her benefit application in order that they could now be added to their dad's. On this call Lisa also spoke of her desire to move away from the area as she had had enough, and that she would move with the children and enrol them in new schools. Attendance was again discussed ... with Lisa having now had discussions at that point with Sarah Campbell about the absences having been due to her anxieties around their dad removing them from school. Around this time there was an ongoing issue in relation to birth certificates for the children, which the writer provided clear advice to both parents on how to resolve without the other given that relations were poor, but this advice was not followed through on. It was the writer's assessment that the parents were more focused on their dislike of each other than actually resolving the matter at hand. ... Lisa stated that the police were already in the building so attended at the scene and had to physically remove [] from the situation. ... Lisa stated that it was her belief that [] sole purpose was to come in to the shop to make trouble and cause a scene. Lisa was also reportedly told by police to calm down or she would have been arrested, which she was not happy about. ... When the writer spoke with each parent, they advised that relations between themselves had improved considerably... Lisa also confirmed that [] had appeared in Court on 08.01.21 ... She stated her feelings of frustration that the actions of 2 children "egged on" by [], had had such an impact on []'s life ... She confirmed at this time that [] still wanted their relationship to resume but that she was wary about what his conviction would mean for the children. On speaking with Lisa later that day, she confirmed that [] had not been placed on the Sex Offenders Register (SOR), ... Lisa again made reference to her belief that her children were more concerned about upsetting their dad, and that he had a problem with []. Lisa still maintained that it was a misunderstanding that had resulted in []'s conviction. ... Lisa was contacted by Carol Boddie (SW TL) who asked that [] reside elsewhere. ... A safe care plan was subsequently agreed ... whereby [] was not to be alone with any of Lisa's children, and Lisa was to be around her children at all times. Lisa assured Carol that she was already doing this and was asked to be mindful of situations that were particularly risky to the children, such as when they were bathing and getting changed, and that she ensured that doors were shut and was mindful of what [] was doing. It was acknowledged that at times Lisa would need to briefly leave the children if she was going to the bathroom. Lisa had said that she did not have a bath until the children were in bed at night, and continually assured the writer that her children would not be alone with [] until there had been further SW assessment. Lisa reminded Carol that she contacted the police following the incident where [] was charged with voyeurism, and assured Carol that if she ever thought [] was a risk to her children or had harmed them then she would call the police, as she did before. Lisa stated that she would prefer to be the one to tell [] that [] was now a registered sex offender, and this was agreed by Carol. The writer subsequently checked with Lisa on a visit to the home on 09.02.21 that she had shared this information with [], which she stated she had ...

The writer was then able to meeting with Lisa and [] on 22.02.21. The couple were clear that [] always adhered to the bail conditions ...Lisa advised that she did seek assistance from []'s solicitor to have the restrictions in relation to herself removed so that she could have contact with []. Lisa says that she did ask her children how they felt about what was happening with [], ...Lisa maintains that nothing about the overall situation and the allegations which lead to []'s conviction makes sense to her. Lisa reiterated that she had only allowed [] to return to her house on the grounds that her children were ok with it. She furthered that she made it clear to the children that if they were at all uncomfortable then it would not be the case that [] would return, but she did not believe there to be any tensions/stress, and she did not have any concerns... Lisa maintained that she still believes the whole situation to have been a misunderstanding, adding that she was abused herself at a very young age and feels that this has been her incredibly vigilant to any potential risks around for her children. Specific Issues/ Concerns/ Risk Analysis (include child/ family strengths)

RISKS

- Lisa requested []'s Bail conditions against her be removed 12 days after the incident so that she could have contact with him...
- It is the writer's assessment that history of dispute between the parents overshadowed what had happened to [child] in the months at the end of 2020...
- The needs and safety of the children do not present as being the priority for Lisa in regards to []'s conviction and that he is on the SOR.
- Both parents have presented as more focused on their own poor relationship at times than on the needs of the children.
- Lisa's representation to workers of the views of her children,...
- The safe care plan which has been agreed with social work relies on Lisa's honesty in confirming her supervision of [] within the home, however it has become apparent that she was not honest in telling workers that she had informed [] that [] was on the SOR.
- Lisa continues to hold the view that the whole situation has been a misunderstanding and minimises the decision of the Sheriff.

PROTECTIVE

...[] and Lisa present as having a much more stable and civil relationship since Christmas 2020...

Parent/ Carer / Relevant Person Views

Regarding her views on whether or not CP Registration would be required for the children, Lisa stated that she understood why the Case Conference was being convened, but feels that she is more than capable of safeguarding and caring for her own children. Lisa advised that she struggles with how it looks but felt that it was the specific knowledge of the context of the incident which was important. She added that she holds a lot of guilt with regards to her children, and also with regards to [] and his helplessness. ...

Should compulsory measures be considered/ reviewed? Give reasons. Are any additional measures required? Include assessment in relation to contact arrangements, if applicable.

Recommendation:

It is the recommendation of social work that a Child Protection conference be convened [children's] names be placed on GCC's Child Protection Register due to ...and Lisa's Hughes continued minimisation and dismissive attitude towards his conviction and the impact that this has on her children.

- Lisa Hughes to undertake a Non-Offending Carers Risk Assessment (NOCRA) to ascertain if she can be a protective factor in her children's life with regards to [].

2022-05-23 Prosecution Report [child]

..the police witness [] contacted the offender []'s mother - Lisa Hugh and informed her of the charge libelled against the offender [].... The mother was positively engaging with police ... The mother would like the offender to reside with her as she could better monitor her behaviour.
