I collected [redacted] then [redacted] then William and transported them all to Whitfield Child and Family Centre. We arrived a few minutes early and waited in the Family Centre. [redacted] and [redacted] were quite excited and wanted to explore all of the cupboards, which I discouraged because we would be going out to the park.

Mr Tarbett arrived. The children all ran out of the room to speak to him. Mr Tarbett was carrying a carrier bag full of sweets and fruit. One of the children asked where [redacted] was. Mr Tarbett said that [redacted] would be coming.

Mr Tarbett agreed he wanted to go to the nearby playpark with the children, and that we wouldn't need to wait for [redacted] because she knew where the playpark was.

We all walked across, Mr Tarbett and [redacted] leading. At the playpark Mr Tarbett and the children divided the sweets and fruit into 3 separate bags. Everyone took something to eat, plus their bottle of juice, and then went off to play.

We stayed in the playpark from 2.45 ish to 3.55 ish. For the majority of this time Mr Tarbett sat on a seat as I did, while the children played singly or together on the swings, slide etc. Occasionally the children returned to Mr Tarbett to take another sweet. [redacted] asked about [redacted] and at one point left the park (telling me dad had sent her to see if [redacted] was coming - Mr Tarbett said he hadn't asked her to do this).

At one point William said he needed the toilet and was going to pee in the bushes. I said that he was too old for that and that we would all need to return to the Family Centre. [redacted] was willing to come but [redacted] refused. I asked Mr Tarbett to tell [redacted] he had to come. Mr Tarbett told [redacted] still flatly refused. I decided to take William and [redacted] and told Mr Tarbett I was going and would return quickly and that in the meantime he should look out for [redacted]. We were away approx 5 minutes. When we returned I noted Michael was playing in the same place he had been when we left.

During the latter half of the time a group of boys arrived, two of whom knew William. William and [redacted] then spent time playing with/near these boys. One of them also seemed to know Mr Tarbett, who offered him a packet of sweets.

All of the children became agitated by the number of wasps around. They alternately ran from them and tried to hit/kill them, particularly [redacted]. I noticed the boys putting on a show of a lot of bravado/swagger, about "killing wasps".

When it was time to go I shouted for everyone. [redacted] wanted to linger but eventually came, with his dad telling him to come. Walking back to the car park [redacted] and William decided they needed the toilet, prompting them to run across to the Family Centre. [redacted] and Mr Tarbett followed. All 3 children went into the Family Centre and came out. [redacted] ran to hide around the "bin area".

[redacted] became quite upset following a brief incident where she asked to fill her juice bottle from the Family Centre toilet sink. I said "no" as this was not water for drinking, she then asked her dad who seemed to give her permission, and then went into the toilet, filled the bottle, came out and took a drink. She then "burst" into tears briefly and was consoled by her dad and then by myself. [redacted] resisted getting into the car and I had to "chase" him into the car. William and [redacted] then also got in, [redacted] choosing to sit in the front (as [redacted] had on the outward journey). I then returned the children to their foster homes, firstly William then [redacted]. [redacted] had recovered from her upsetness on the way to William's. She and [redacted] were talking in the car. [redacted] asked if [redacted] could come into her house. I agreed to this and said [redacted] and I would go in for a couple of minutes. [redacted] played out in the [redacted] back garden, with the other children living in the house.

Linda spoke about the plans in relation to [REDACTED] she is appealing a Children's Hearing decision to reduce her contact and also the recommendation of the Adoption and Permanence Panel to pursue permanence. She was prepared to go along with the plans of our own department in relation to [REDACTED] and William when it looked like permanent placements were going to be found. However, she is extremely concerned not only about the fact that neither of the children have been placed but, especially in relation to [REDACTED] the number of moves they have been experiencing.

We spoke about her own circumstances. Rehabilitation with [REDACTED] broke down only last year, what has now changed? Linda stated that her return to Dundee was not in an attempt to reconcile with Mr Tarbett but in order to be nearer to her extended family - her mother lives nearby, she has an uncle (?) living in the same tenement. Seems to be feeling closer to her mother and feels she would be a positive support with the care of the children. Linda claims that her excessive drinking had been a major feature of the breakdown in rehabilitation with [REDACTED]. Says she no longer drinks and is confident that she would be able to keep this under control.

Phillip and I raised the demands that would be involved in caring for all the children together - as we explored this further Linda then began to think that it may be best to start off with having one child returned, but which one and how would the others react? Clearly Linda's thoughts were very tentative in this respect. However, we acknowledged that as a Department, we were not meeting the children's needs in terms of long term security and therefore we had a responsibility to consider the circumstances of both parents with a view to pursuing rehabilitation if this looked at all possible. Phillip and I felt that we would probably need to discuss with our senior in the first instance and I advised that I was also attending the Adoption and Permanence Panel on 4th September who would probably have an opinion in this matter. It may be that we could ask an independent agency, such as Children 1st, to pursue.

Linda was quite clear that she was not looking to a reconciliation with Mr Tarbett. Claimed that she had no recent contact with him and as far as she was aware he did not know where she was living - as far as Mr Tarbett is aware, Linda is living with her mother, Mrs Brannan, in Dundee.

I advised Linda that I would be in touch (telephone) whenever I had details of [REDACTED] respite placement. Phillip and I would attempt to take forward her views regarding the children's return and arrange to meet again as soon as we were clearer about whether or not this was going to be considered.

She put them down on the coffee table.

Mr Tarbett was in the Family Centre, he was sitting at the table. [redacted] ran over to her dad calling him daddy, giving him a hug and sitting on his knee. I apologised to Mr Tarbett for being late due to having to wait on [redacted] coming out of school, he didn't comment. I emptied out bag of games, pointing out what I was doing. There was some conversation between [redacted] and Mr Tarbett, Mr Tarbett asking [redacted] how she was and about school, she wasn't very forthcoming, they also spoke about [redacted] birthday. Mr Tarbett stayed sitting at the table, where he sat throughout the visit apart from leaving the room to go to the toilet. Mr Tarbett tried to instigate conversation with the boys about what they have been doing, school, he got very little response from them. [redacted] seemed to want to wander about the room and cause chaos, he would climb on the units, furniture, touch cleaning materials, play with the blinds, windows in a controlled manner. Mr Tarbett and I had to continually tell/ask [redacted] not to do this, we were both met with swearing, foul language from [redacted], more so towards me and at one stage when [redacted] passed me he kicked me in the foot. I told [redacted] if his behaviour continued like this I would ask Philip to return him to Strathmore Cottages which Philip had told him he would do, [redacted] slightly improved. I suggested they make use of the games. [redacted] for a little while played with a game you play by yourself. [redacted] spoke about being battered, restrained by staff, not getting money his parents had given him, staff giving it to another child. Mr Tarbett told [redacted] his solicitor was coming to see him tonight and to tell her all of this. [redacted] and William both asked if [redacted] were coming to see them. Mr Tarbett said they were and [redacted] would maybe be coming. There was no real interest from the children towards each other about each other or what they have been doing.

Mr Tarbett was in the Child and Family Centre, he was sitting at the table. I apologised to Mr Tarbett for being late due to having to wait on [redacted] coming out of school, he did not comment. Mr Tarbett said to [redacted] her birthday present was on the table beside him. She went over and opened her presents, Spice girl bag a watch and a few other things, she didn't get the T-Shirt he had said he was getting for her. There was no mention of it from either of them. Time was spent with [redacted] playing with her gifts, her showing them to me, very little conversation between [redacted] and her dad as [redacted] was not very forth coming when Mr Tarbett made brief conversation with her. [redacted] did ask if [redacted] was coming. Mr Tarbett said that he did not know. Mr Tarbett gave [redacted] her bag of goodies, he had a bag for her, [redacted] and William.

Mr Tarbett said that he did want next visit to take place on Tuesday 23rd of December.

[redacted] was brought to visit by worker from Strathmore Cottages [redacted] came in quite bouncy, he had his Christmas presents for his dad [redacted] and William with him. Giving his [redacted] and [redacted] theirs also giving [redacted] her birthday present. Mr Tarbett and I said there would be another visit with his dad before Christmas, but [redacted] would not listen, he wanted them to open their presents, he was verbally abusive towards me.

William arrived, he was brought to the visit by Phillip McGill, Social Worker. William was also given his Christmas present from [redacted] children were all quite hyper at the time while opening their presents. Mr Tarbett did not open his. [redacted] gave his dad present for [redacted]. Both boys asked if [redacted] would be coming to visit, Mr Tarbett told them he did not know. I managed to get [redacted] and William to play a game together but unfortunately this only lasted for a short time. Mr Tarbett asked [redacted] if he plays near Stack Leisure Park in Lochee as someone had told him he had seen him [redacted] did not seem to know where he was talking about and said he did not go there [redacted] spoke to his dad about China (brother) getting beaten-up. [redacted] speaking in a bravado manner said he, his older brother, his dad were going to get involved, get this person. William then joined in with this copying [redacted] Mr Tarbett did not discourage them from speaking like this or of any of them getting involved.

When I tried to discourage this [redacted] was again verbally abusive towards me. [redacted] also spoke about being beaten up by staff at Strathmore Cottages to his dad. Mr Tarbett asked when and what happened. [redacted] said when he is being bad, hurting himself or staff, staff stop him by putting his arm up his back.

[redacted] asked if anyone would like to play a game and tried to do this but no one took any interest of her.

Throughout the visit [redacted] would run about the room hitting and swearing at William and [redacted] encouraging them to do likewise which they did which then ended up with William in tears several times. When [redacted] wanted to sit at the table to write and draw in her book, he annoyed and disrupted her until she too ended up in tears. Mr Tarbett tried to put a stop to this but [redacted] paid very little attention to him.

It continued to be chaotic when they were getting ready to leave but all happily said goodbye to their dad. Worker for Strathmore Cottages returned for [redacted]. I returned William and [redacted] Home, they both chatted happily to each other in the car. William was keen to show [redacted] a certificate he had got from school, which was hanging up in the [redacted] and I both went in with William to see it, spent only a short time with him [redacted] continued to chat happily with me on the way home but became verbally abusive with me when I wanted her to put her coat on before leaving my car [redacted] became upset, she then calmed down.
