Maureen also advised that William's last contact with Mr Tarbett was fraught. William became quite stressed and angry when his father refused to buy him very expensive ice skates. There was an incident at school, where he hit a boy, and at the end of that week William became very upset and exploded. [REDACTED] feels he is holding on to something but won't say. [REDACTED] feels there has been quite a change since Christmas, from occasional overtly difficult behaviour to more moodiness, with high's and lows. (cont)

	We looked at possible reasons for this, including maturational, emotional etc and discussed helping William learn to cope with the painful parts of life. As he is getting older, he is more able to reflect on this. [REDACTED] is quite anxious that he is too old to really help now, and much more aware now that however much she tries, she will never love William in the same way she loves her own sons. I encouraged [REDACTED] to be more accepting of her own feelings, rather than guilty, and to look at William's progress the other way round: that every month and year spent with them is reversing some of the damage caused to William. [REDACTED] informed that she has received a letter from the curator, from Jack Brown & Co who will shortly be coming out to see William re the Section 11 hearing. 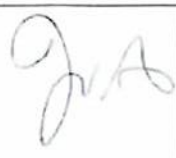

16.05.02 Discussion with M Imlay, SW	Margaret Imlay advised that Maureen went out to see Linda Robertson and found her very drunk, with [REDACTED]. She brought them into Kirkton SWD. Linda became very aggressive towards Maureen and other workers. Linda's mother refused to have care of the children, as she had been assaulted by Linda the night before when she was looking after the children. The situation dragged on all day. Finally Linda was advised that either she agreed to the children being accommodated overnight on Section 25, or a Child Protection Order would be requested. Linda reluctantly agreed. The children were placed with the [REDACTED]. Linda was taken to Bell Street Police Station overnight.

I advised [REDACTED] of events re Linda Robertson, in case Mr Tarbett knows of these events and talks with William about it this afternoon during contact. 10.06.02 Tel discussion with Mrs McCallum, Head Teacher, Auchterhouse School	Will send in school report for Review, but cannot attend. Informed that William still a delightful and popular boy to have in the school, but academic progress made over the first year at Auchterhouse and has fallen back. William appears to be lacking in ability to concentrate, to link concepts and memorise, and is demotivated as a result. Particularly poor progress in Maths and Reading. Mrs McCallum has requested further learning support for William next year, as he responds to one-to-one attention, but cannot cope in a group learning situation. Head Teacher has also been in touch with Monifieth High School re William's entry there next year. No behavioural problems of note. I discussed with Mrs McCallum whether it might be useful to have the functional level of William's dyspraxia re assessed, with a view to further treatment and advice re strategies in the classroom. Pat had not been advised of William's history. Pat informed me that there was an incident yesterday, where [REDACTED] jumped up onto William's bed while the latter was asleep.

	Further discussion with [REDACTED] was placed on 16th August. He and William have immediately started swapping 'care stories', but also fighting. In respect of the bed incident, I was satisfied that this was a one-off incident to which William did not respond. [REDACTED] dealt with it appropriately. Both boys have been told that they are not allowed in each others beds, or anybody elses' on any occasion, and that they must have adult permission to enter each other's rooms. [REDACTED] advised that the holiday went OK. Contact with [REDACTED] on August 17th was cancelled as the [REDACTED] were away again, but they will be arranging another date in September. 29.08.02 Letter to Linda Robertson	Re contact re-arranged for Tuesday 2 nd . Impressed on Linda the need to attend this contact, and the work she needs to do with William around her current difficulties, and why this may have made her unreliable re contact.
29.08.02 Meeting with [REDACTED]	[REDACTED] turned up unexpectedly, requesting to meet with me. [REDACTED] wishing to advise that the placement currently very difficult, and acknowledge that perhaps they should not have taken [REDACTED] on placement as well, because of the impact on William. Williams behaviour has changed for the worse over the last few weeks, at home, at the afterschool club, in school and socially with his peers. He has become physically aggressive, getting into serious fights in the park with his friends. He is identifying with [REDACTED] as a 'Child in Care' and has regressed to the behaviours previously seen when he was with [REDACTED]. He is beginning to disassociate from the family. [REDACTED] think there are multiple causes: Mum's unreliability re contact, [REDACTED] arrival, puberty(?). [REDACTED] have adopted a strategy of (a) splitting [REDACTED] and William up (b) increasing the amount of structured time and (c) placing some restrictions on movement (more on [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] wished to reassure me that, if the situation continues, it will be [REDACTED] placement which will be terminated, not William's.
Email to Brenda Kidd, resource worker, copy Gail Aboim	Advised of meeting with [REDACTED] and expressed my concern that [REDACTED] placement was jeopardising William's longstanding placement.
05.09.02 Discussion with Maureen Petrie, SWA	Linda Robertson attended contact with William and spoke to him about [REDACTED] death and its impact on her. The contact went well. See detailed record.

09.09.02 Session with William	William wanted a 'magical mystery tour' in the car - he always feels very relaxed and able to talk in this situation. William reported feeling very settled and enjoying being back in school. He sees himself as different from [REDACTED] and reports that they do get into arguments. He still very much regards the [REDACTED] as his 'family', and endlessly referred to 'home'. William volunteered to tell me that he got into a bad fight in the park with his friend [REDACTED] but said that they were now friends again. I asked William what were the good things for him at the moment. William said (a) his 'girlfriend' Jackie (b) Seeing his mother and father and (c) going on holiday in October. I arranged to meet with [REDACTED] Thursday 12th at 11am to discuss the current situation.
10.09.02 Letter to Mr Tarbett Letter to Linda Robertson	Re next contact session. Schedule of contact dates to January 2003 enclosed.
12.09.02 Meeting with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] carer	[REDACTED] described William as very unresponsive at present, moody and cheeky, and unwilling to take any responsibility within the family. Unwilling to accept affection, touching etc. She wanted to know how to address his behaviour. Reminded [REDACTED] of issues from the past which may be affecting his responses when the household becomes less stable: past 'bad' touching, and told not to touch?, divided loyalties between [REDACTED] and birth parents? fear of rejection and possibly ejection from [REDACTED] household. Agreed to (a) continue strategies as outlined by [REDACTED] as they seem to be working to an extent (b) focus on teaching William how to function socially, within family and without, so instead of saying 'don't do this', model what he should be doing instead. [REDACTED] agreed that this was important - she cited the fact that she is always bemoaning his lack of a smile, whereas she could be encouraging him to smile. Also discussed his relationship with Jackie, and the importance of basic sex education. [REDACTED] agreed that she and [REDACTED] would address this issue with him. William wants his ear pierced. I will get a consent letter from Linda Robertson, who has already verbally agreed to this.

24.09.02 William/Linda Robertson contact	Supervised by myself in Maureen's absence. Linda did not turn up. I telephoned - no response. William clearly upset. Took him on a magical mystery tour at his request, so that we could talk about what happened. Despite the disappointment I got the impression from William that things were going OK for him at home. I spoke to [REDACTED] on our return. [REDACTED] reported that the tension in the household has much reduced. [REDACTED] and William have generally gone their separate ways and William has reverted quite successfully to his old way of life and friends. I reflected that it was useful to know how easily it was to destabilise William, but also to know the length of time and strategies required to stabilise him again.

(b) The [REDACTED] withdrew from the planned adoption matching. (c) Sheriff's judgement has been received re Mr Tarbett's application for parental responsibilities. The application has been rejected.

Maureen feels that the placement is breaking down, primarily because William is unable to form an appropriate attachment to his carers. My view is that the situation is more complicated: William is trying to balance loyalties between his parents and the [REDACTED] he is not feeling 'claimed' by the [REDACTED], the [REDACTED] expectations are very high, he has been 'usurped' by the arrival of [REDACTED] he is entering puberty

	and he is facing significant change, namely school.

Mrs MacCallum described William as generally happy. Both he and [REDACTED] talk a lot about home, particularly the impact of [REDACTED] arrival. Both say that they are receiving less attention, especially with homework. [REDACTED] was on one occasion very distressed and crying at the thought that [REDACTED] would still be with them for Christmas. William is making satisfactory academic progress within his limitations. He is now in a mainstream reading group. Learning Support continues to be provided. William's needs have already been discussed with Monifeith High School, where he will continue to receive learning support within a small class setting.

[REDACTED] was very ambivalent and reluctant to participate. He did eventually confirm that people were allowed to be angry, but then contradicted this. [REDACTED] made it quite clear that [REDACTED] has 'special needs' and that everyone else must [REDACTED] and William were reluctant to establish eye contact with each other. Discussion with [REDACTED] on his own at the end of William's session confirmed that the placement is likely to end. [REDACTED] stated quite aggressively that he was unprepared to engage in any sort of behavioural programme to help William and that he was not prepared for his family and home to be 'like a children's home'.

Event: Session with William

William volunteered that there has been a lot of fighting and arguments at home and also at school. He says he is arguing with [REDACTED] William depicts himself as not strong enough to resist getting drawn in to conflict, particularly at school. He said he was nearly excluded last week. We discussed and demonstrated ways in which he could learn (a) to say 'no' and (b) he could learn to withdraw from situations and express his anger in safer ways.

William also said that he did not believe that the [REDACTED] loved him and that he was receiving far less attention since [REDACTED] arrived. When he argues with [REDACTED] who gets the attention. He also does not have any privacy from [REDACTED] who regularly comes into his room without permission.

His sense of self-worth is very low at the moment.

William informed me that respite care was being arranged and he did not want to go. It transpired that his main concern was a fear that he would have to have respite with [REDACTED] I assured him that this would not be the case under any circumstances.

This information was conveyed to [REDACTED] at the end of the session. [REDACTED] confirmed that it was certainly true about the decreased attention, which was due to [REDACTED] needs, and that they were aware of the privacy issue.

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
