Wanted it checked as was concerned it could be serious as father had prostate ca and also had back and leg pain. Longstanding symptoms include sleep disturbance at night, IM pain during the day but most of the day, aggravated by bending and lifting, occasionally after rising from sitting. Walking can be limited by leg pain at times. No bladder / bowel changes, saddle anaesthesia / paraesthesia or any other reported CES signs. Has had physiotherapy via work but not this year. Uses daily ibuprofen and anadin, using it more frequently now but not helping. Has tried co-codamol which helps but would like it prescribed.
Examination	Examination Normal spine alignment. AROM lx: flexion hands to knees, all else full, no affect. SLR right +ve at 50.
Social Comment	Social Forklift driver F/t normal duties. Walking dogs. Comment Chronic low back pain and sciatica. Struggling with pain therefore plan was to send request to GP for co-codamol but pt already has a GP appointment after this so will ask for it then. Shown MSKphysiotherapy NHS ggc website for back exercises and advice and CES warnings.. I have suggested self-referral to MSK physiotherapy. Advised to arrange an APP review if symptoms worsen, fail to improve or if there are any other ongoing concerns.

Building up and maintain exercise activity improves your fitness, makes you stronger, and helps you manage your COPD and stay out of hospital. Sometimes referral for a program of exercise and education called 'pulmonary rehabilitation' will be appropriate. Pulmonary rehabilitation has been proven to have significant health benefits for people with COPD and other lung conditions. Ask your GP team if you should be referred for this.

Cardiovascular risk assessment We know that having COPD can put you at higher risk of developing problems with the heart, as well as increase the risk of having a stroke. If a diagnosis of COPD is confirmed, your GP may consider undertaking a simple assessment of your cardiovascular system to see if you would benefit from starting medication to help reduce your risk of future events.

The next step is to arrange to discuss this letter and test outcome with the GP team who referred you.

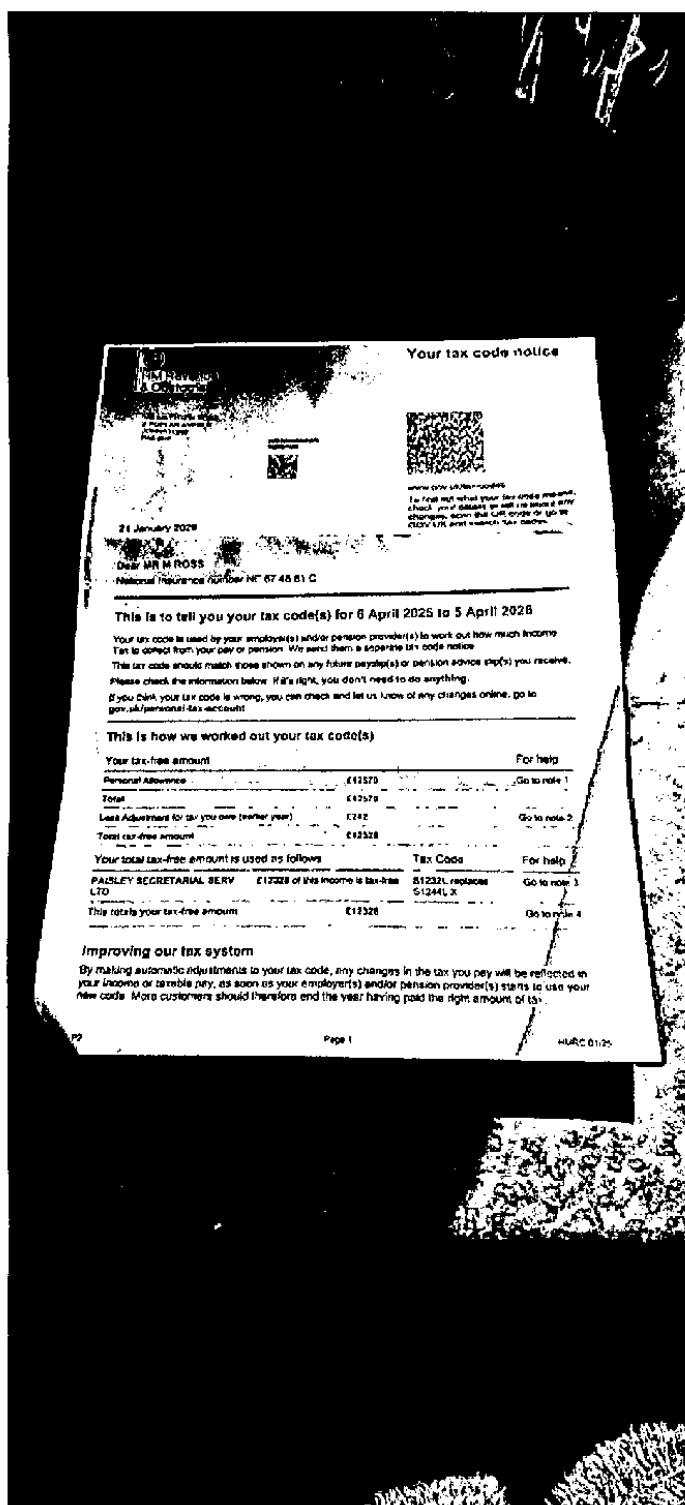

I reviewed Mr Ross for the first time on 18th on this month when he was referred to the clinic with diagnosis of corneal abrasion in the right eye. On examination he was found to have quite a big abrasion on the central cornea on the right side. I commenced him on Cyclopentolate 1% tid along with Chloramphenicol 4 times a day in the right eye. I also asked him to patch the eye all the time. On reviewing him again the next day he was feeling better but the abrasion was still there. I reviewed him again in the eye clinic today. He is feeling much better now. There is no staining over the right cornea. Intraocular pressure is normal and there is no inflammation in the anterior chamber.

I have asked him to stop Gutt Cyclopentolate and to continue with Chloramphenicol 4 times a day for 3 days and twice a day for one week and then stop it. I am discharging him from the clinic to your care but will be happy to see him again if the need arise.
