Clinical summary:

Mrs Margery was admitted on the 5/2/22 after a 3 week history of a chronic productive cough with associated pleuritic chest pain and shortness of breath. On examination, there was bilateral wheeze in her chest and some left sided loin pain and tenderness over her lower spine. Her admission bloods were grossly normal. A CT KUB was done which showed no acute abnormalities other than some acute and subacute left lateral rib fractures for which she was managed conservatively with analgesia.

Mrs Margery clinically improved during her admission and was discharged when deemed medically fit.
