Redress Comments:

Patient walked into the MIU unaccompanied and with a normal gait and with no issues walking. Patient states she feels systemically well in herself today. Patient has brought her own dressings with her today. Patient informed me that she went to see her GP yesterday as her leg was so sore and he has prescribed her a 7 day course of Flucloxacillin as the wound has become infected. Patient states she is now on the second day of the course. Patient also informed me that she has taken some Oramorph approximately an hour ago so that she can tolerate the redressing of the wound. Patient states a friend has driven her to the MIU today as she is unable to drive haven taken the Oramorph. Upon examination the wound has approx 70% slough and 30% granulation, the wound edges are beginning to epithilise well. However, the surrounding skin to the wound has is infected with heat and erythema present and is very sloughy and wet. There is some malodour to the wound also. No sign of deformity, swelling, bruising or active bleeding present. Capillary refill and full sensation intact. Wound irrigated with Prontosan to clean, Aquacell Ag applied as a primary dressing, to promote moist wound healing, help deslough, prevent infection and reduce bacterial load, secured with Adaptic touch to aid wound closure, covered and secured with Duoderm dressing to promote moist wound healing, cushion, protect and help to deslough wound. Patient given a First Choice Dressing prescription for Aquacell Ag. Rationale for the Ag dressing is because the wound is infected and very wet and there is a need to reduce the bacterial load sitting in the wound bed. Patient states she will take the prescription to the GP surgery today. Patient to return to the MIU on Friday or sooner if the dressing to the wound becomes too wet.
