Comment Drug Use: Never had any illicit drugs.Smokes 15 cig/d.
Alcohol Use: Started drinking as a teenager but only at weekends. It became problematic for past 5 years binge drinking for up to 3 days when was drinking beer until passing out. It worsened for past 2 years drinking daily up to 15 cans of beer/d. He has drunk first thing in the morning if not having to go to work. Longest abstinent 3 weeks a year ago. Currently has gradually cut down his alcohol intake and last time he drunk only 1 pint of beer 2 days ago.
Physical Health: No issues. Not taking any prescribed medication.
Mental Health: No issues but is aware of the effect of alcohol in his mood. Never had any antidepressants.
Contact with Children: He has a 15 year-old daughter who lives with him and her mother. No SW involvement.

Social: Lives with his partner and daughter in his own tenancy. His partner drinks only socially. He works in construction. No financial issues.

Risk, Harm Reduction and Recovery Interventions: No driving license. Attending AA meetings and also engaged with GCA which is finding helpful.

He wants to remain abstinent from alcohol for sometime with the aim of being able to drink in a control manner in the future. He wishes to try Acamprosate first to relieve cravings for alcohol but will consider Disulfiram if not effective.

Recent LFT's and U + E's normal.

Prescription given for Acamprosate 666 mg/tds x 28 days.

Mark Campbell, his care manager will carry out an IPSU and will receive weekly home visit until he returns to this clinic in 4 weeks time.

First drink as a teenager, regular drinking from the age of 21years, feels it became problematic around 5 years ago, worse in the last 2 years.

Drinks in a binge fashion, drinks for 2-3 days over the weekend around 4-6 pints in the pub and then 6-10 cans of lager at home, denies any relief drinking. . States he drinks related to stress and becomes greedy with the drink, strong cravings for alcohol. Longest abstinence was around 6 weeks, years ago, most recently 10 days abstinence 3 months ago.Has experienced minor withdrawal symptoms in the past of slight tremor and sweats, denies any Delerium Tremens or seizures.

Keen for Acamprosate to relieve cravings. Does not wish Disulfiram at present but may consider in the future if acamprosate does not reduce his cravings.

Denies any illicit drug use

Orientated to all 3 spheres, thought form and content normal, mood was both objectively and subjectively euthymic, with no suicidal ideation past or present. No

delusional or perceptual abnormalities. No evidence of anxiety. Concentration and attention were good. Complaining of poor short term memory but appears cognitively intact although not formally tested.

Born and brought up in Glasgow one of 3 siblings, good childhood, enjoyed school. left school and became a painter and decorator to trade but now works in construction, No issues at work, although they are aware of his drinking.

Lives with his partner and 14 year old daughter, good relationship and is supportive, few arguments at home relating to his drinking.
