Steven was admitted to Touch after the Children's Hearing on 11th February and arrangements were made for him to start school the following day, which he failed to do and has consistently failed to attend school since his admittance to Touch. He spends his day wandering around Abbeyview, coming and going when he pleases and on several occasions he has failed to return to Touch, staying out overnight. Both Miss Lessells and myself have spent time with Steven discussing the situation and Steven has stated quite clearly that he has no intention of going to school and doesn't want to stay at Touch because he finds the setting too unstructured - a contrast to Rimpleton perhaps?

It is my opinion that this experience is more than just settling in difficulties and from my contact with Steven it is clear that he has no commitment to this placement. I therefore see no alternative but to seek an alternative placement and have made application to Geilsland List D school on Steven's behalf. Steven and I visited Geilsland this week and Steven seemed more positive about what this placement has to offer. Geilsland can take Steven next week and I have therefore written to the Reporter requesting a review hearing as soon as possible.
