UK General Data Protection Regulation & Data Protection Act 2018 Information Request

I am writing to advise we do not hold the requested information.

The Care Inspectorate was established on 1 April 2011 by s44 of the Public Services Reform (Scotland) Act 2010. In terms of s102 of that Act, it is the statutory successor to the Scottish Commission for the Regulation of Care, which was established on 1 April 2002 by the Regulation of Care (Scotland) Act 2001. The Scottish Commission for the Regulation of Care was not the statutory successor to any predecessor body.

Our predecessor, the Care Commission, assumed responsibility for the regulation of care services in [Scotland](#) from 2002 and were in situ until 31 March 2011. This responsibility was previously held by NHS boards, local authorities, Social Work Inspection Agency (SWIA) and [Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education](#) (HMIE).

The [Public Services Reform \(Scotland\) Act 2010](#) then came into force in April 2011. It aimed to reduce and streamline the number of Government agencies, including the different regulators. As a result, the previous work of the Care Commission, of 'SWIA', who regulated social work services in Scotland, and of 'HMIE' who had the remit of scrutinising education services and had a specific role to monitor child protection services, were absorbed into the new Social Care and Social Work Improvement Scotland ('SCSWIS'). Care services in Scotland became regulated by SCSWIS, who from September 2011, adopted the name of the Care Inspectorate. In order to seek care service information prior to 2002 we would suggest contacting the relevant NHS board or local authority which ever is appropriate in your circumstances as the Care Inspectorate do not hold records prior to the year 2002 within our own electronic or hard copy depositories.
