

Patrick Bell & Kevin Bishop

This report should be read in conjunction with previous report dated 25.03.92.

Plans for the children were laid down in last report, but could not be implemented at the time due to the fact that Miss Bell had not taken up her tenancy at 5 Logan Drive, Paisley. There were also concerns with regards to Miss Bell's alcohol consumption, particularly the effect this was having on her access arrangement at Gryffe. A pattern had developed in that when sober she displayed a high level of commitment and motivation to keeping to access times, but when on a drinking bout would fail to turn up at Gryffe and also fail to notify staff that she would not be visiting.

However over the past 3 months Miss Bell has shown a very positive attitude towards the access arrangements and rehabilitation plans. She moved into her tenancy in April and has worked hard at turning it into a suitable home base for Kevin and Partick. Furniture and household items were provided through Sec. 12 payments and local resources.

The house is a 5 apartment council flat situated within an area of priority treatment. It is basically furnished and reflects a reasonable standard of maintenance.

At a Child in Care Review held at Gryffe Children's Home on 6th July plans were made to begin overnight access at home on 4 nights per week, with the main aim of working intensively towards rehabilitation being achieved around the start of the new school term in August.

These plans have been very successful and the children would appear to value the increased contact with their mother. Miss Bell is now attending the Renfrew Council on Alcohol for help and support with her alcohol problem, and to the writer's knowledge, has not consumed alcohol at all over the past 8 weeks. The future work plan for this family will be initially to rehabilitate the children back home on a permanent basis, whilst closely monitoring the home situation. A homemaker who is currently involved with the family will continue to offer any practical assistance deemed necessary, and there is also the possibility of Home Support and Day Care providing a child minding service to allow Miss Bell some free time if required. Patrick's Befriender, Basil Letham has stated his intention of continuing the very worthwhile relationship he has succeeded in building with Patrick over the past few months. Psychological Services have agreed to liaise closely with this department and St Fergus Primary with regards to Patrick's disturbed behaviour.

Myself as the caseworker will play an active part in closely monitoring the home environment, family relationships, and the children's progress and behaviour both at school and in the community. Taking these factors into consideration it is therefore my recommendation that the children be returned home, and their present Supervision Order be varied.

Patrick expresses anger when talking about his mother and the reasons he is in care. He talks with fondness of his gran Babsy. ~~He likes school~~ who recently died.

Patrick's stay ^{within Gryffe} ~~in Gryffe~~ was initially comfortable to settle Patrick to the degree that he felt comfortable talking and relating to staff. ~~He settles~~ With older peers he tends to get their attention by shoving objects from rooms and being verbally abusive and aggressive towards them this in turn unsettles the unit. Within the past few weeks there has been a marked regression in Patrick's behaviour and demands on staff attention have grown to the point that Patrick cannot accept sees his peers as intruders between him and staff.

Patrick enjoys the relationship between ~~the~~ social worker and himself looking forward to her visits.

Patrick's behaviour in school has been problematic in the past few weeks resulting in him being returned home on one occasion.

Areas of concern as indicated in residential review form:

Patrick - during his outbursts, tends to try and inflict injuries upon himself. Staff are concerned that when not under close supervision, he may be successful in these attempts. Staff are further concerned that Patrick's difficult behaviour is having an adverse effect on the younger members within the Family Unit.

Areas of concern as indicated in Social Worker's review form:

1. Miss Bell's lack of co-operation with Social Work Department. Her motivation in keeping to arranged access has decreased steadily over the past 3 weeks.
- 2.. Patrick's continued unpredictable behaviour and the knock-on effect this has on the younger children in the home.

Summary of Discussion:**INTRODUCTION**

Forms D and C were circulated and read by all members of the meeting. Apologies were noted from Psychological Services, Bill Allison has been in touch with St. Fillan's and advised them of decisions of last review. They will be happy to work with boys for a time limited period. Mr. Jamieson from St. Fergus also sent his apologies but he will be informed of decisions of today's meeting.

The chairman explained that today's meeting was a Social Work Department Child in Care Review and its purpose was to discuss Kevin and Patrick's placement in Gryffe, Miss Bell's situation at home, pick up on issues that arose from last review and move on to make plans for the future. He explained the current Legal position as being when the boys were received into care on a Place of Safety a warrant to detain them for 21 days, this was renewed for a further 21 days. A Proof Hearing was scheduled for last Thursday, but was rescheduled for this Thursday at 2.30p.m. as Ms Bell failed to appear. Miss Bell was advised to consult a solicitor to represent her at Court as a matter of urgency.

REPORT FROM GRYFFE

Patrick -Karen reported that since last review Patrick's aggressive behaviour has escalated, having outbursts sometimes 3 times a day and these can last between 20 minutes to 1½ hours. Staff have tried to establish if there is a pattern to Patrick's behaviour. He is not aggressive towards other children, only staff. At times Patrick tries to harm himself by trying to punch his fist through windows, and kicking doors with his bare feet, he is hurling verbal abuse at staff whilst doing this.

Patrick talks about Mum and her drinking in the past, staying with Gran etc, and how much he misses his pet dog. Staff feel there is so much anger within Patrick it is almost tangible.

Patrick will come out of these moods by himself, but staff cannot get through to him, he will not listen to them,

putting his hands over his eyes and his fingers in his ears. At times when Mum visits he will run and hide and on 1 occasion he threw a bin at her.

Patrick is at the point of telling the other children to disobey staff.

When going on outings staff are reluctant to include him as he refuses to obey staff and wants to run off. He needs 1 to 1 supervision.

Miss Bell stated that Patrick did not display threatening behaviour or try to injure himself whilst at home.

St. Fergus school had noted that Patrick was a difficult child whilst there, but St. Fillan's school are saying he is doing fine there and mixes well with peers.

Lesley Watson felt it appears as if Patrick is engineering situations, becoming disruptive especially when staff are busy i.e. mornings and meal times.

Karen stated Patrick is constantly seeking attention and Andrea felt it was very worrying and unusual for a boy of Patrick's age to harbour so much anger.

Patrick's health is very good. He now has 2 pairs of glasses for longsightedness.

Jean stated that she had received an appointment for Patrick to attend Yorkhill in July regarding his undescended testicles.

Andrea stated that as Patrick and Kevin share a bedroom, they have, on occasions to move Kevin as Patrick can take from 20 minutes to an hour to settle down.

REPORT FROM SOCIAL WORKER

Since last review Jean has had limited contact with Patrick and Kevin due to being off work for a week on a course.

On one occasion when she had spoken to Patrick and Kevin on their own, Patrick was very open and asked if he would be home for Easter. Jean felt she was still building a relationship with the boys.

Patrick has stated to Jean that he did not wish to return to Mum, but rather he would prefer foster parents, saying that when he returned home from school Mum was never there.

Kevin wishes to return to his mother's care.

Miss Bell at this point stated that she hardly saw Patrick, he was always at Gran Bishop's and he would return to her home when it suited him, she felt that Patrick was adept at telling lies and putting up a brick wall to everyone.

The chairman felt that Patrick was a very angry young boy with deep problems which could not be fathomed by those involved with him.

Jean stated that Patrick put blame on Mum's drinking as the reason for him being in care and Karen added that he also blamed staff at Gryffe, but when the situation was explained he shifted the blame from Gryffe to Mum.

MISS BELL'S SITUATION:

Miss Bell has not taken up her tenancy at 5 Logan Drive although furniture had been provided and was delivered on Friday. Miss Bell saying that her house had been broken into, access being gained through loft, although furniture was still there and had not been destroyed. A neighbour has been keeping an eye on the house and within next few weeks social worker is hoping to provide bed and bedding, these being the only remaining articles required.

Patrick Bell, Kevin Bishop continued.

Access over past 3 weeks has decreased, Ms. Bell often failed to notify either staff at Gryffe or Social Worker. Ms. Bell felt that Patrick is at times an embarrassment to her (after bin throwing incident) and stated that on occasions he does not wish to be included in visit.

General Discussion

Bill Allison of Psychological Services had made comment that work with Patrick would be a long process and Patrick required intensive input.

Lesley felt that when Patrick ran off to his gran's he felt in control of the situation, knowing that he could return to Mum's when it suited him, but in the longer term, when he became older, real problems would come to light. She felt it would be helpful for staff at Gryffe to contact Psychological Services regarding day to day care of Patrick at the moment and to build in as many supports as possible in short term including behavioural management and additional staff if this was possible.

The chairman stated that the aim of the Department was to return children to mother within a short time scale, the maximum being 2 months and queried if recommendation to children's hearing be that they are returned home in which case Dept and Miss Bell should be aware of aims tasks.

His feeling was that - As it was the children's first time in care we should try to ensure they get home and work on problems there. The Housing situation is not fully resolved but we are nearer to getting a home established and an application should be made for financial assistance for bed and bedding.

Miss Bell's alcohol problem was raised and she stated she has not had a drink over past 2 weeks although she felt that if problems did arise she would take a drink. She was adamant that she would not attend R.C.A. feeling that she can stop drinking on her own. She had informed social worker that she would abstain from alcohol if the boys were returned to her.

The chairman informed Miss Bell that her contact with the boys needed to be improved and that if they are acting up during her visit, she should take control of situation and not look to a member of staff. He stressed the need for her to adhere to all accesses as boys need to know she is reliable and wants them home.

The chairman stated that children should be returned home at next full Children's Hearing.

Jean at this point stated she had grave concerns about the boys returning home at the moment her concerns being:-

1. Why didn't Miss Bell contact social worker or Gryffe when she was unable to keep access?
2. Miss Bell's relationship with Patrick - social worker is not 100% sure that Mum can cope with him.

Social Worker had previously seen Miss Bell and Patrick who was playing up. Miss Bell was shouting that Patrick drives her to drink and she wanted him taken into care. Social Worker was concerned if Miss Bell is drinking and that Mrs. Bishop is not able or prepared to look after Patrick, then what would happen to him?

The chairman acknowledged risks around but his feeling was that the children be returned home.

School Issue

St. Fillans are aware of problems concerning Patrick but are prepared to offer a package of work involving Bill Allison.

Lesley acknowledged that Patrick has problems, but felt that behavioural problem was not a reason for him to remain in care and that keeping him in Gryffe would not help his relationship with Mum.

Jean felt that Celia has a serious drink problem, but she will not admit to this.

The chairman explained concerns to Ms. Bell and stated if children were returned to her care she would need to look at her drinking pattern, but the balance of feeling was to return children home at first full Hearing.

The chairman would discuss today's review with Area Manager as the decision was not unanimous.

Work is now focussing on employment training issues. Aileen from Careers Employment Initiative arranged ^{extended} for ~~paid~~ work experience at Lamont Farm for Paddy, however ~~as for~~ Paddy left the placement after 3 or 4 weeks - he stated he didn't now wish to work with animals. ~~Patrick~~ Despite Aileen and my attempts, Paddy will not commit himself at this point to any form of work/training, mainly because he continues to have great difficulty in ~~mixing~~ mixing with his own peer group, especially in numbers of more than 1 or 2.

Paddy continues to work with Ronnie, sessional worker, who is attempting to look at ways of integrating Paddy into the community on a social basis by encouraging Paddy's interest in sport within the community.

June Summary

Patrick continues to progress well at his flat. Patrick has been introduced to a Careers Employers Initiative worker, Aileen. Aileen arranged a placement at Nestlé however, did not find this a positive experience. Aileen has ~~arranged~~ negotiated a training placement for Paddy at Carnont Farm - a prospect which Paddy is really excited about. Paddy continues to see seasonal worker weekly and finds this ~~to be~~ a very positive experience.

May Summary

Patrick continues to progress well at his flat. He continues to keep it impressively clean & tidy and appears to be budgeting well. Patrick has been introduced to a sessional worker (Ronnie Belshaw) to assist Paddy develop emotionally. Ronnie has assisted Paddy with assembling furniture, and is going to see Patrick on a weekly basis in a befriending role. So far Paddy and Ronnie have played pool, snooker and been for a meal together. Paddy has ~~not~~ developed well emotionally over the last year and is much more at ease in the company of adults. He is able to have a conversation and communicate well with ~~the~~ adults, however, he still does not communicate well with his own peer group and appears to have no friends or associates of his own age group. It is hoped that as he continues to progress in his relationship with adults this will make him more confident to make friends/be accepted when he starts his work placement.

April Summary

Paddy has now fully moved into his own flat and is the process of settling there. Patrick has impressed with the manner in which he has chosen furniture, carpets and decorating materials. Patrick's flat is now ~~very well~~ furnished and decorated to a high standard and Patrick ~~takes~~^{shows} an obvious pride ~~in his~~ ~~or~~ in his flat and keeps it very clean & tidy. Work has focussed on supporting Patrick to settle into his flat and live independently in the community. Patrick has not attended S.B.S. because of being busy with tasks relating to moving i.e. shopping, giving access to numerous tradesmen, however, he does intend to start S.B.S. placement next month.

March Summary

Patrick has now moved into his flat and is in the process of decorating the flat. Work has focussed on shopping, budgeting and generally assisting Paddy with moving into the flat. Patrick appears to be very capable of doing his own shopping, budgeting for electricity and gas and has been receiving ~~the~~ support from his family as well as Throughcare. Patrick is due to begin a placement with SBS at the beginning of April.

February Summary

Patrick has been offered and signed for his own tenancy at 6 Drums Crescent, Paisley. Patrick's aunt lives in the same close, his uncle across the road and his gran stays round the corner. Patrick is delighted and excited at the prospect of moving into his own flat, particularly close to where his family support is situated.

Patrick has been introduced to a support worker and a Section 29 application has been made. Work has also focussed on getting him registered at Careers and Job Centre. Patrick has applied for Under 18 Hardship Allowance.

January Summary

Paddy did not keep his careers appointment (no-one in when I called at his garage to take him). I have attempted to contact Paddy, however, he has not returned

by messages.

When I get in touch with Paddy, work will continue to focus on careers appointment, training and looking at his accommodation options.

December Summary

Patrick remains at his gran's, however, he is sending mixed signals about how he is progressing at his gran's.

On the one hand Paddy states that he is getting on reasonably well with his gran and enjoys having his own room with T.V. where he goes to be alone if there are any issues or problems with the rest of the house.

At the same time Paddy states that he would like his own flat close to his gran's. He feels that this would give him the best of both worlds i.e. his own independence, however, ~~also~~ ^{still} close to his gran's.

Paddy has shown no indication to pursue work or training placements. However, he has agreed for me to take him to Careers in January.

Patrick has now left the Kibble and is living with his gran.

Patrick appears to have settled well at his gran's. Patrick's Supervision Order has now been terminated, however, Patrick is still looking for support from Throughcare and his social worker (Mr Snodgrass).

Patrick has updated his housing application and states that he would like his own flat close to his gran's at some point next year. Patrick feels that he will be able to cope emotionally in his own flat as he is near to family support in Fergushie. Patrick has now left his work placement at Lament Farm - C.S.V. we are considering other placements for him.

September Summary

Patrick continues to avoid making a decision about West Cot. He has still only had overnight, however, has been up twice for a couple of hours. Patrick and I have visited other accommodation options i.e. Toner Dr, Clippers Farm and Naisdale (see attached report). Although Patrick appears to like the flat at West Cot, he is clearly not ^{ready or} prepared to live himself. Basically Patrick is really scared about moving on from the Kibble. 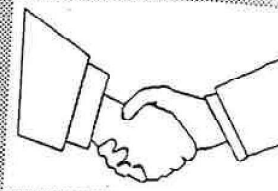

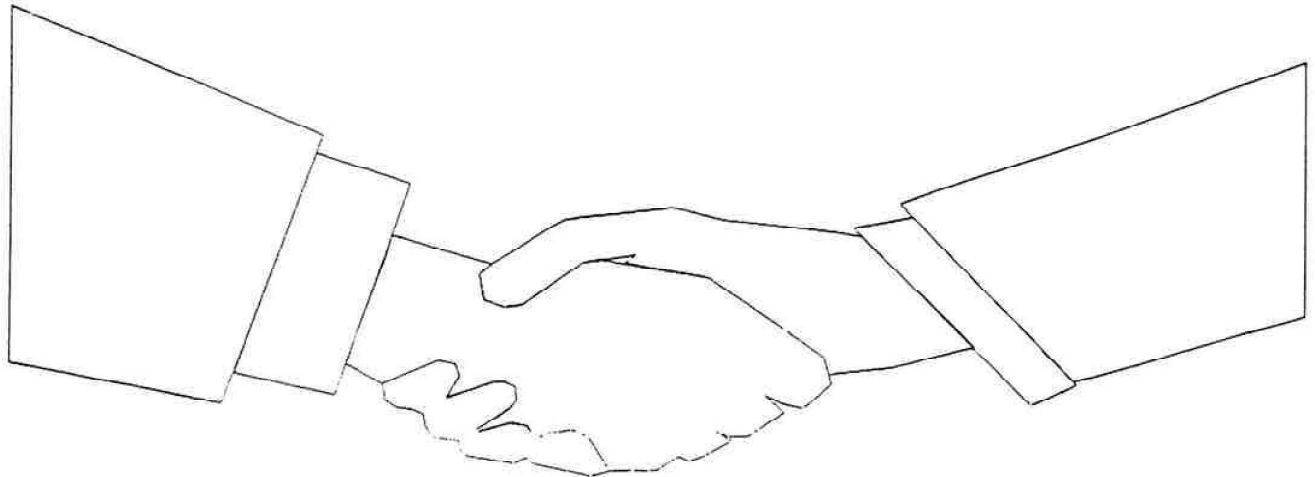

I refer to your letter dated 16.3.99 in which you informed me that you cannot award me a Community Care Grant.

I am writing to ask for a review of your decision.

I was accommodated by the Social Work Department since 1992 in a variety of residential care placements until 30.11.98 when I left the Kibble Residential Care Centre. On 30.11.98 I went to stay with my Gran, who agreed to accommodate me temporarily until the Housing Department offered me my own tenancy.
