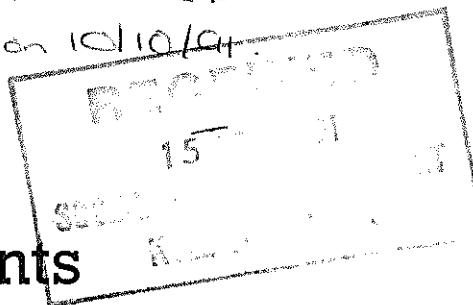

Minutes of Review Meeting

Lee has again gone through a period of absconding and has been charged with further offences.

Summary of Discussion:

Form D and the Education Report were distributed and read and introductions made. [REDACTED] also circulated a copy of a report for the Children's Panel which the school had been asked to complete. This report was in relation to a charge of shoplifting which Lee denies.

[REDACTED] explained to Lee that at this review we would be looking at the positives and the negatives of Lee's behaviour and attitude. Also we would be looking to the future as Lee would soon be approaching the end of his time at school.

[REDACTED] was asked to update the review on her involvement with Lee. [REDACTED] advised that Lee had gone through two periods of absconding where he came and went from the school almost at will. [REDACTED] felt there was, however, a positive side to this in that Lee did call to see her and although promising to return to Kerelaw he later presented himself at Stranraer Police Station. Lee did enjoy a trip to Germany during which he behaved well, but on his return went through a very unsettled period. His time at home over the summer months was uneventful with Lee coping well, however, when the time approached for returning to school he was not keen to do so. [REDACTED] advised that Lee had been grounded within the school over the past few weeks due to his absconding but he had his first home leave the previous weekend and this went well. Lee has very good support from [REDACTED] & [REDACTED]

Summary of Discussion contd/.....

Discussion then centred on Lee's outstanding charges. There is one charge of shoplifting which took place in July. The police also came to the school to interview Lee in relation to a housebreaking in Girvan. Lee was quite vague but claims he was charged with this and the theft of a bicycle. There have been no further offences since August.

It was felt that at this point in time we should be looking to the future for Lee as he will be leaving school in a very short period of time. M & M, Lee himself and the school are all keen that Lee should return home on a permanent basis when he leaves school. M explained to Lee that before this would be possible the Children's Panel have to terminate the residential order and for this to happen Lee has to prove his commitment for the future to them.

It was felt it would be beneficial if some work experience could be found for Lee. It was acknowledged, however, that the work available in the area is limited. Following the October school holidays Lee would be allowed to work 15 - 20 days on work experience up until Christmas, this perhaps linking in with his home leave and also still fulfilling the conditions of the residential order. M advised that in discussion Lee had indicated that he would like to do gardening work. Lee had been doing this type of work at Penkill Castle near Dailly during a period of absconding and felt he had enjoyed this and would like to pursue a permanent job there. It was felt, however, that this may only be seasonal/casual work but M undertook to look into this. It was also suggested that Auchincruive be approached regarding whether they would be in a position to provide anything for Lee in the agricultural side. Lee had also expressed an interest in going out on the fishing boats but there were some concerns raised regarding this. It was felt this did not always provide a guaranteed income and also Lee had to take into account how his parents would feel about this, also the question of insurance cover for a boy of his age in the type of employment. The question was raised of perhaps Lee attending college to gain further qualifications and M undertook to obtain the syllabus from both Ayr and Kilmarnock colleges to see if there was anything of interest to Lee. Lee himself indicated he would like to work with his father M. It was explained to Lee that it would not be easy to gain this type of employment but he was encouraged that perhaps undertaking some college courses etc may lay the groundwork for this. M suggested that he arrange a careers interview for Lee this hopefully enlightening as to other possibilities around. The possibility of experience within the Community Service Volunteer Scheme was raised and this was explained to Lee. M undertook to discuss this option with M, Assistant District Officer (Child Care).

There was then discussion on home leave for Lee. M recommended Lee going home that weekend from Friday to Sunday night, the next weekend is the holiday weekend so it was agreed Lee would go home from Friday until Tuesday night, he would stay at Kerelaw until Thursday and then would go home again until Monday morning. It was pointed out to Lee if we are able to gain work experience for him we would try and link this with home leave and he would be at home as much as possible.

M enquired as to Lee's health. M felt the only problem was Lee's persistent blockage in his nose.

He did feel that this was made worse if Lee felt anxious or under pressure. Otherwise, he was fit and healthy taking part in all the sports activities within the school. The question was raised as to whether a medical examination should be done on Lee's discharge from care and [REDACTED] undertook to check this out.

[REDACTED] closed the meeting by thanking all for their attendance.

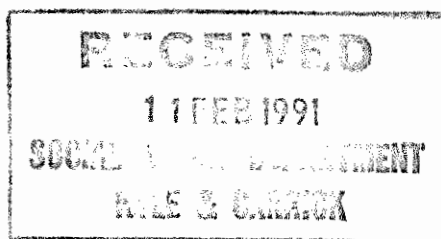

Lee did go through a period where he seemed to be unsettled.

Summary of Discussion: Form D was distributed and read and [redacted] explained the purpose of the review to [redacted] and Lee.

Lee was admitted to Kerelaw on 19th December 1990 under Section 44(1)(b) Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 following an extended stay at Newfield Assessment Centre whilst awaiting a vacancy at Kerelaw. His admission to residential care was precipitated by recurring offending and the deterioration in his school attendance, behaviour at Redbrae List G Residential School, Maybole.

[redacted] advised that Lee has settled in well, he has a good relationship with the staff and mixes well with peer group. Lee has absconded on two occasions, on each occasion he said that he had done so as he was afraid to stay because of certain boys in the unit. It was felt this was due to one particular boy who has now left the school and the unit has settled down since his leaving. The care plan for Lee is to get him into a structured leave pattern, integrating him back into the community, initially to attend on a residential basis but working back towards either day boy status or mainstream education. [redacted] is going to look into activities outwith the school and Lee suggested that he would like to become involved in the local football activities. Lee did spend a few days in Crosshouse Hospital recently. It was felt that further enquiries should be made with the GP as to the nature of his illness as it was not made fully clear as to what was actually wrong. With regard to family contact Mr Norwood felt that [redacted] & [redacted] have been very supportive to staff.

[redacted] informed that there has been a real improvement in Lee's attitude and behaviour while at home and both [redacted] are very pleased with his progress.

Summary of Discussion contd/.....

Mrs Ali also felt that Lee is much more positive about himself now, he appears much more relaxed and is able to talk more.

██████████ then went on to give reports from Lee's teachers on how he is coping academically as this would obviously be an important factor if we were considering any move back to mainstream education. The general feeling from Lee's teachers was that he was a pleasant, well behaved boy in class and if he continued to apply himself to his studies he would have no major problems.

It was felt that ██████████, Educational Psychologist, should have been asked to attend the review as she was involved with Lee prior to his admission to care and in the future if considering mainstream education she would be involved in liaison with the school.

A home leave pattern for Lee was then discussed. At present this is from Friday night to Sunday night and it was agreed this could be increased from Friday night to Monday morning on the understanding that Lee be back at school for 9 am. There is a long weekend due fairly soon and this arrangement will be tested then, if successful then midweek stays will be looked at. Lee will have extended leave for two weeks over the Easter holidays with one overnight stay per week at the school to comply with the conditions of his order.

In summation, in the short term Lee will remain at Kerelaw with flexible extended home leave at the agreement of staff and parents. In the long term the objective is eventual rehabilitation home with the family and back to either day boy status or mainstream education. Consideration will be given to what option is best at the time of the next review.

Lee has to stabilize his position free from offending and attention seeking behaviour. It is important to maintain his links with the community. To fail to do so would mean that Lee would have difficulty in sustaining himself in the community environment. He needs to be encouraged to manager peer group situations as currently he has problems in relating to his peers. His home base is important and contact with parents should be maximised.

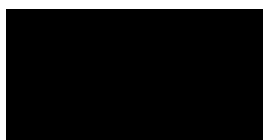
