NB End Aug 84 - 16.10.84	This covered by the case summary enclosed in the case note section. Please note that for this period the contents of correspondence, documents and reports sections are not covered in the case summary.
16.10.84	Agreed on the practicalities of contingency plans should Mr. and Mrs. Fraser attempt to visit Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. It was suggested by staff that Tommy and Lisa visit granny Tarbett's on Sunday and I agreed to visit granny to establish whether this was feasible. Following this meeting I spoke to Tommy and Lisa who were both reasonably settled. I asked them about visiting granny's and they were both pleased at this prospect.
17.10.84	Visited granny Tarbett. Present were granny and Aunty Kathleen. I asked them if it would be possible for Tommy and Lisa to visit and they were both delighted to accommodate this. We agreed a time for the children to arrive, and be back at Carolina House.
1 10.84	Telephoned Carolina House and confirmed with the Staff the arrangements for Sunday.
19.10.84	Letter prepared for sending to Mr. Tarbett informing him of the decision not to pursue the foster placement. I also noted that he had not visited the children for several weeks and asked if he would like to discuss this with me. I also informed Mr. Tarbett of the visiting arrangements for Sunday. Later a letter received from Mr. Tarbett's solicitor querying future access arrangements - see under correspondence section Tommy's file. Later Mr. Tarbett to Happyhillock Office. I informed Mr. Tarbett of the contents of my letter and indeed as it had not been posted I let him read it. I told Mr. Tarbett that I could not discuss with him our reasons for not pursuing the foster placement but that it would definitely not be taking place. As for the contents of his solicitor's letter Mr. Tarbett told me that the reason he had not visited Carolina House was because of an instruction from a member of staff there. I told Mr. Tarbett that I felt he must have misinterpreted what had been said but that I would check this out at Carolina House. Mr. Tarbett said that he would be in his mother's to see the children on Sunday.
{	Afternoon. Meeting involving myself, Cliff Anderson, SSW; Anne Bell, Area Homefinder and Sue Williams, SW, to discuss my recent experiences with Mr. and Mrs. Fraser. My input to this discussion has already been covered in the case summary contained in the case notes. My The purpose of this meeting was to give information to the other workers, who through their various remits had some work going on with Mr. and Mrs. Fraser.
23.10.84	Received a memo from Anne Bell, Area Homefinder informing me that the review of Mr. and Mrs. Fraser would be taking place on Thursday 8.11.84 at 2.00pm and my attendance was requested.
	Later visited Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. Before seeing the children, staff informed me that there had been no problems and no visible reaction to events of the recent past. When speaking to Tommy and Lisa, Tommy asked me when he was going to be allowed to visit his father on his own. I told Tommy that this would have to be discussed at the review and that I would present Tommy's viewpoint at a review if he wasn't present. Both children didn't give any indication of any major upset about the Foster Placement.
24.10.84	A letter prepared and sent to Mr. Fitzpatrick of Rollo, Steven and Bond, Mr. Tarbett's solicitor. This letter rebutted Mr. Tarbett's allegations that he had been denied access to his children at Carolina House and also stated that the Department's policy on access for Mr. Tarbett would be decided in the near future and would be conveyed to him as soon as possible. Also this date, a response to cont./....

	the request of Mr. and Mrs. Fraser for ^{written} strict reasons as to why the Foster Placement was not to take place was prepared by myself, as per instructions of Ann Crawford, Area Fieldwork Manager, Dundee West. Again as per instructions this letter was not sent and was undated, reason being we await future developments with Mr. and Mrs. Fraser before sending this letter. See correspondence section, Tommy's file this date.
25.10.84	Annual Review Children's Hearing Report prepared on Tommy and Lisa and these were typed this date. Also School Reports received from Glebelands Primary on both children. See the reports section in appropriate files.
31.10.84	Annual Review Children's Hearing on both Tommy and Lisa. Present:- both children, Lynn Craig (Key Residential Worker); Bill Black, (Officer-in-Charge, Carolina House) and myself.
	After consideration of the reports and due discussion, the Children's Hearing renewed the residential supervision orders naming Carolina House on both children. Following the Hearing I took Tommy and Lisa to the Keiller Centre for a cup of coffee. The main topic of conversation was again from Tommy the request that he be allowed to visit his father's house on his own. I informed the children about my recent visit with their father and that I had encouraged him to visit them at Carolina House but it appears that he still has not done so.
2.11.84	Visited Carolina House and spoke to Senior Management about the necessity in the near future of holding a special case review of Tommy and Lisa to decide the Department's policy regarding access for the natural parent. Later had tea with Tommy and Lisa and following that I had individual chats with both children about how they were feeling about their Foster Placement in the past and about the future. In Lisa's case she had mixed feeling about her period with the Fraser's although she had been quite strong in her criticism of aspects of ^{her} their stay there. Lisa had some fond memories of her times with them. Lisa still showed an interest in the possibility of fostering at some time in the future, although she didn't feel that this could happen very quickly for her or that she would be able to cope with this at too early a stage.
	My discussion with Tommy regarding the past was more brief in that he did not really have anything positive to say about his stay with the Fraser's and was very cagey in talking about the future, but he did not describe ^{discuss} the possibility of fostering at some stage.
6.11.84	Letter received from Mr. Tarbett's solicitor to confirm their receipt of my letter of 24.10.85.
7.11.84	Visited Tommy and Lisa in Carolina House. I chatted to the children about the previous meeting and asked if they had any further thoughts, or anything that had occurred since we last spoke about their fostering issue. Neither Tommy or Lisa had anything of any significance to say about this matter.
8.11.84	Meeting at Paradise Road to discuss Mr. and Mrs. Fraser. See copy of minute in reports section Tommy's file.
13.11.84	Visited Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. I informed them that I would be raising the question of their visiting their father at the review which was to take place tomorrow. I also said that I would be asked about their feelings regarding the foster placement in the past and about future possibilities. I said that I would convey their feelings to the review.
14.11.84	Departmental Review, to consider primarily the access arrangements for Mr. Tarbett and his children in the future. Much of the debate was around the breakdown of the fostering situation but the conclusions reached by the Review regarding access can be seen by consulting the minute - the appropriate recommendations for this are recommendation (b) (c) and (d). See reports section of Tommy's file.
	cont./....

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16.11.84	By arrangement had tea with Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House, I told Tommy and Lisa about the outcome of the Review and in particular the recommendations about access. Both Tommy and Lisa were delighted to hear this, I told them that the system recommended would only come into operation once I had been able to visit and discussed this with their father. I told them that I hoped that this could take place as soon as possible.
19.11.84	Prepared a draft letter to send to Mr Tarbett confirming the access arrangement. This letter only to be sent after both Cliff Anderson and myself had visited Mr Tarbett. This letter was conveyed to Helen Swinton the Regional Solicitor for her advice about it. Once seen the letter Mrs Swinton said that she was satisfied and that there was no problem with what we were saying.
11.84	Telephone call from Lynn Craig at Carolina House. Lynn informed me that Granny Tarbett had had a heart attack the previous Saturday and Mr Tarbett had called at Carolina House and taken the children to hospital to see their granny. He returned them at 8.30 on Saturday evening. Mr Tarbett also called on the Sunday and he returned them the Sunday evening. Later visited the children at Carolina House and spoke to them about their granny's illness. Neither child seemed overly concerned about their granny but it was obvious they had both been happy to see their dad at the weekend and talked about this at great length.
27.11.84	Following consultation with Cliff Anderson a letter sent to Mr Tarbett detailing an appointment with him on 5th December to discuss access. See correspondence section of Tommy's file.
30.11.84	Evening visit to Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. I informed the children that we hope to visit their father on the 5th December and that we had sent him a letter about this. Tommy and Lisa were both happy to know about this progress.
12.84	Cliff Anderson to Happyhillock office where we had a discussion about the contemporary situation with Tommy and Lisa. I informed Cliff that I had talked to both children about their past fostering experience and about their future and that Tommy's view currently is fairly clear in that he doesn't want to consider fostering again. He is quite happy and secure living in Carolina House. Lisa's viewpoint is more ambivalent in that she is not sure at the moment about her own feelings but has stated that she doesn't want to think about it at the moment but would be willing to talk about it again in the future. Following this discussion Cliff and I visited Mr Tarbett's home in Whitfield as per the arrangement, however he was not at home, a note was left telling him of our call. Later, evening visit to Carolina House where I saw both children. I informed them of their fathers absence when Cliff and I called and the children were disappointed with this. I said that however that we would call again in the near future and try and have this matter cleared up.
11.12.84	Letter delivered by myself to Mr Tarbett's home informing him that Cliff Anderson and myself would visit the following day i.e. 12.12.84 re the access situation. See correspondence section in Tommy's file.

12.12.84	As per arrangement visit made to Mr Tarbett's home, yet again no on e at home. Note left telling him of our call. Cliff and I had a brief discussion in the car at which it was decided that we should write to both Mr Tarbett and to his solicitor informing them of the importance of our request for a Meeting with Mr Tarbett and that until this had been achieved the children would not be allowed to visit the family unaccompanied. See correspondence section for both letter's in Tommy's file. Evening visit to Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. I told both children that yet again we called on their father and he was not at home but that I had written a letter to him stating how urgent it was that we see him. Tommy particularly was dissappointed by our failure to have discussion with his father.
21.12.84	Received copy of letter from David Middleton Assitant Director of Fieldwork to Mr and Mrs Fraser. See correspondence section in TommY's file.
24.12.84	Visited Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House with their Christmas presents. The children informed me that they were going to Granny Tarbett's on Christmas day and were looking forward to this.
25.12.84	to 3.1.85. PUBLIC HOLIDAYS
3.1.85	Visit to Carolina House, children on holiday from school. Both Tommy and Lisa told me they had a nice christmas and they showed me some of the presents they had received. Children invited me for tea the following week and I agreed. Staff were informed of this before I left. I told the children that I would like to use next weeks opportunity to have a further chat about fostering with them.
9.1.85	As per arrangement called at Carolina House to have tea with the children. I was informed that Lisa had gone out to have tea with a friend and that she had obviously forgotten about the arrangement. I did however get the opportunity for a chat with Tommy about fostering. Tommy has maintained his feeling about fostering in that he stated quite clearly that he stated quite clearly that he sees his long term future at Carolina House and that he doesn't really want to move any where else. Following this discussion Tommy asked me through to the games room and I played pool with him. After playing for about a quarter of an hour Tommy went in a huff about a minor matter concerning the game and would not continue. Tommy decided that he didn't want me to stay for tea and told me so. Before leaving I told Tommy that I thought our discussion about fostering had been very worth while and that I would call in and see both him and Lisa next week. Before leaving I informed the staff about the situation.
10.1.85	Letter to Mr Tarbett informing of my wish to call on the 15th re Tommy and Lisa's access arrangements. See correspondence section of Tommy's file. Later this date received a letter from Tommy apologising for his behaviour the previous night; see under correspondence section in Tommy's file.
11.1.85	Returned to Carolina House and saw Tommy and Lisa and thanked Tommy for his letter and told him it was a very nice gesture by him to write. I had a opportunity for a chat with Lisa and although she does not discard the idea of fostering she stated quite strongly that she wanted to stay with Tommy. Later bumped into Mr Tarbett in the Wellgate Centre he told me that the arrangement that we made for Tuesday was not suitable as he /..

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Venue - Carolina House.

Date - 12.2.85.

Purpose - To discuss the current feelings of the Tarbett children, Tommy and Lisa as regards fostering and to take a decision regarding whether to pursue this course of action.

Relevant Information

Gordon explained that he had discussed the breakdown of the fostering arrangement with Tommy and Lisa on average every other time they were visited. Basically it boils down to the fact that Tommy does not wish to be fostered by a family and the subject has been exhausted by Gordon.

Lisa for her part is less definite about not being fostered although she is adamant that she does not wish to be separated from Tommy.

These statements of Gordon's were confirmed by Harry Tosh who has come to the same conclusions in conjunction with all those involved with the children.

It was recognised that the children were demonstrating more "moody" behaviour since the fostering episode and it is apparent that family influences were being brought to bear.

Residential care is viewed as a "legitimate" substitute by the family as this is prevalent in the family pathology, however other alternatives are not viewed in the same way and this results in "pressure" for Tommy and Lisa.

We discussed how much understanding the children had of the reasons for saying no to foster care but concluded that their commitment would remain negative in the main due to the family pressure and ties coupled with what proved to be an unhelpful fostering experience. All present were anxious that a similar experience could be significantly damaging to them and should not be considered at this time.

Decision of the Meeting

The children require to be given a clear message. All agreed that we should tell them that we are clear they are saying no to foster care and consequently we do not intend to seek foster parents for them.

We do require to hold a continuing dialogue with them concerning where to after Carolina House and to that end all options remain open. They are therefore free to re-examine foster care mainstay or whatever appears to be appropriate.

This tactic was felt to be the best way of helping them move forward as any other direct approach will be credited with the element of coercion and ultimately produce a counter productive reaction.

17.1.85	Letter sent to Mr Tarbett confirming the details of yesterday's meeting. Copies of this letter sent to other appropriate persons involved in the case. See copy under correspondence section in Tommy's file.
17.1.85	Called on granny Tarbett at Drumlanrig Drive to appraise her of the access situation. There were no problems as far as this was concerned.
18.1.85	Called at Carolina House and after brief discussion with the Officer in Charge a date for departmental review was set for Monday 18th February. Following this I spoke to the children privately and informed them of the outcome of my visit to the father both Tommy and Lisa were delighted that this access would be started on Sunday.
22.1.85	Memo sent to all appropriate persons concerned with the departmental review to take place on 18.2.85.
23.1.85	Evening visit to Tommy and Lisa at Carolina House. Tommy told me that when he had been at Granny's the previous week aunty Maureen from Beechwood had been there and had said to the children that she would willingly have the children at her house on the Sundays that they were not visiting fathers. I told the children that I could not sanction this as a regular arrangement but that if aunty Maureen or any other member of the family known to us wished to visit the children at Carolina and take them out for a short period we had no objection to this at all. Tommy reluctantly accepted this.
1.2.85	Evening visit to Tommy and Lisa. Lisa showed me to her new room and told me that she had moved the previous day and that she was sharing with a new resident of Carolina House and a 11 year old called [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is known to me through a group I am involved in outwith Carolina House and I feel that she and Lisa will get on reasonably well together. Lisa in particular seemed happy to be sharing with a girl closer to her own age than previously. Tommy was more interested in watching television and I got very little conversation out of him on this occasion.
4.2.85	Telephone call from Cliff Anderson asking me to attend the case management meeting on Tommy and Lisa at Paradise Road on 12.2.85. This being for discussion around the fostering issue.

12.2.85.	Case Management Meeting at Carolina House. Meeting convened by Cliff Anderson, S.S.W. Present - Gordon McIntosh, caseworker, Peter Devlin, future caseworker, Ann Bell, Dundee West Home-finder, Harry Tosh, Depute Officer-in-Charge, Carolina House. The meeting discussed the fostering experience with the Frasers and the future for Tommy and Lisa. The meeting heard that Tommy had fairly fixed views about his future i.e. that he was to remain at Carolina House and did not wish to be fostered. Lisa was less certain of her future, but certainly saw it being spent in the company of her brother. It was agreed by those present that fostering does not appear to be a viable option at this time and that no action should be taken to identify a potential family for these children. It was also agreed following a suggestion from Cliff Anderson, that following the Review on 18.2.85 and before the next Review, both Tommy and Lisa should be helped by residential staff to write their own feelings about their future. The group's decisions on both these matters were unanimous. G. McIntosh.
