Tommy was last reviewed at 10 Fintryside on 20 September 1990 and has remained there since.

Tommy copes well with his flat and his budgeting and has daily contact with Carolina House staff. Tommy reacts to having the flat in a mature manner and there have been no major problems.

He has a wide circle of friends both through sporting interests and school and has plenty of activities to fill his leisure time.

Tommy has just finished 6th year at Morgan Academy and is starting a course in physical education in August. He has submitted a bursary application for this but this has been rejected as we are his "parents". Tommy will therefore require to be supplemented by the department.

He lives near his family home in Whitfield and has regular contact with his father and brothers. Tommy is able to control this at his level and appears happy with this.

Tommy has been offered a bedsit from Gowrie Housing through Carolina House.

Carolina were holding the tenancy for a period to see how he coped with this and then transfer it to Tommy. The bedsit would be furnished and negotiations would then take place between Carolina and Tommy to allow him to buy this. Tommy's out of care grant would be considered at this time to allow him to purchase whatever else was necessary.

In discussion with Carolina House it was felt that this department should take over Tommy's supplementation from his 18th birthday on 16 July when it is envisaged he will transfer to Section 24 of the Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968.
