Summary of Discussion + Goals/Tasks for the Future (Goals to be listed separately)

Prior to commencement, Forms RDC45 and A016 as compiled by residential staff and fieldworker, were circulated within the group.

Lisa and Tommy were last the subject of a Review on 7th April, 1983, at which time the following recommendations were made.

- (a) Both Tommy and Lisa remain at Carolina House.
- (b) Family contact continue to be encouraged but monitored both by residential staff and fieldwork staff.
- (c) Any anxieties expressed by Tommy and Lisa (re fostering) be clarified by Lynne Craig and Mr McIntosh.
- (d) Liaison between residential staff and Mr McIntosh continue.
- (e) Mr Cura to contact Mr McIntosh within the next 6 weeks, i.e. Friday, 20th May, re Appeal decision, and possible setting up of the next Review.

Since the last Review, both Tommy and Lisa have continued to reside within Carolina House. Although the residents have recently been moved into new groups, Lisa and Tommy are still together. Their particular group consists of 9 residents, 6 boys and 3 girls. Lisa shares a bedroom with the two other girls, one older and one younger than herself.

Ongoing contact with Graham and David continues by virtue of Tommy and Lisa visiting Ann Street. The former only occasionally telephone Carolina House, and never visit. Mr Tarbett's visits to Carolina House have been more frequent of late, and he is known to frequent a licensed hotel directly across the road from the establishment. He had appeared at the door of Carolina House one evening, quite drunk, with his hair sprayed different colours. As yet, no decision has been taken as to the Appeal date regarding Parental Rights.

Tommy

Tommy's behaviour within Carolina House has been reasonable. He integrates well with the other children and tends to stick with his own age group. At the moment, his interests are mainly outwith Carolina House, e.g. he is now very keen on playing football and has joined a local juvenile team.

Tommy's relationships with residential staff are reasonably good, with some staff of the opinion that he is a bit quieter. He has household chores which he carries out.

There are no adverse reports from school, and Tommy does homework without requiring much in the way of assistance.

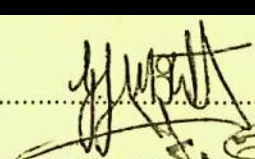
As previously mentioned, a great deal of Tommy's leisure time is taken up playing football. He will also watch football on television whenever he can, and regularly attends Senior football matches. Another of his pastimes is playing chess.

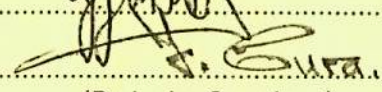
There are no problems concerning Tommy's health.

Whilst on holiday this year, Tommy had met a family ([REDACTED]) from Edinburgh and become quite friendly with their son. This contact has continued and the family had expressed a wish for Tommy to stay with them for short visits. They had contacted the Department and discussions had taken place with staff (fieldwork and residential) regarding a possible holiday for Tommy. Mr Tarbett had also been informed of this. No objections have been raised from any quarter. Mr McIntosh has visited Mr and Mrs [REDACTED] and also met their son. At that time he had explained the various procedures which were necessary. Police checks have been received and Mr McIntosh was presently awaiting communication from the [REDACTED] G.P.. Mr McIntosh had found the [REDACTED] to be a sensible couple. Mr McIntosh stressed that the Department would not be looking for Tommy to visit the the family on a regular basis, preferring an occasional holiday, and perhaps a weekend. Tommy also has school friends who visit him.

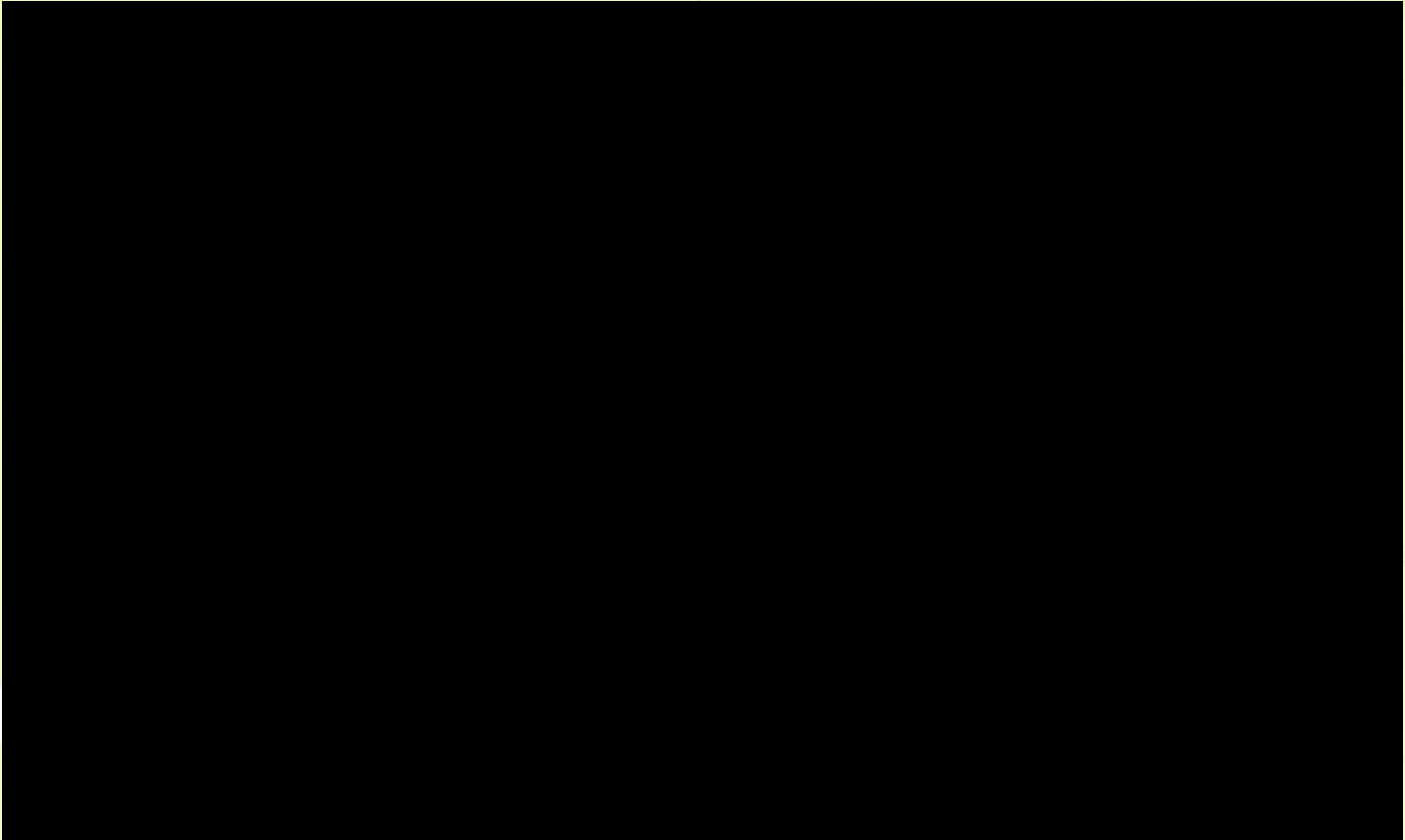
