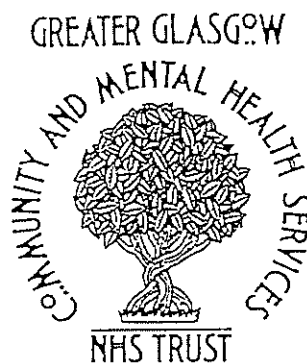

Thank you for referring the above named young man to the Community Mental Health Team. I saw William at Carswell House on 9 November 1994.

William explained to me how he took an overdose of his [redacted] tablets approximately one month ago. The reason he states for this was because his girlfriend had left with his cousin and he also told me that [redacted] on 16 October of this year aged 26 with a blood clot on the brain. Although you would expect his brothers death to be quite significant William states that it was infact not very traumatic for him as he had not seen [redacted] and had never got on with him. William states that now he feels alright, he has no further suicidal thoughts. William has had no past psychiatric history and states that his only medical history to talk of is his chronic asthma which he is on inhaler and pain killers for.

William was born and brought up in Glasgow, he describes his childhood as very rough, growing up in Easterhouse. He states that he has no happy memories of his childhood and says that the best times was when he was in LIST D School. He was brought up by his [redacted] until he was nine years old when they separated, William feels that this is when he started getting into trouble. His schooling was also very troubled stating that he never attended much he was put into a childrens home at age 14 and he did start back to school then however, he was expelled on the first day and that was when he went to List D School. He then worked labouring for a short time and joined the Army for three months.

He states that he joined the Army to get away from [REDACTED] but when [REDACTED] died he went AWOL and did not want to return. He has had a couple of odd jobs on and off since then but nothing stable. He has [REDACTED] years, to a previous [REDACTED] but he does not see [REDACTED]

William tells me that his [REDACTED] has a long standing psychiatric history however he is not quite sure what, he states that her last admission was to Stobhill Hospital under Dr McGovern and she has also been in Gartloch Hospital and had ECT. My only real concern with this young boy would be his drinking habits he tells me he drinks quite a lot when I asked him to explain this he said that he drinks everyday as much as he can get, he does however not see this as a problem and states that the only problem he has is not being able to get enough. He is presently living with his Mum in a two bedroom flat and states that he likes this fine and gets on well with his Mum. He states that he has lots of interests and keeps himself quite active.

Overall in summary William presented as quite a cheerful young man who was appropriately dressed. He is no longer presenting with any thoughts of suicide or evidence of low mood. As I stated earlier my only concern would be his drinking habits. On discussion with Dr Brodie we feel that at present there is no further need for our involvement. I thank you once again for your referral.

The above named gentleman was assessed at McCartney House today at your request.

The assessment indicated that he has no psychotic features. There is a history of suicide / self harm and harm to others. However, this is all linked to domestic violence in his three relationships and the break-up of these relationships. He has a history of alcohol abuse and in fact at present drinks eight cans of lager on a daily basis. I suspect that alcohol has significantly contributed to the break-up of his relationships.

In my view he is not suitable for our team but I have advised him to seek help from the Community Alcohol Team (CAT) to whom he is well known and from the Probation Service at the time of sentencing at the Crown Court.

I reiterate that he is not appropriate for our team and therefore I am unable to help him further. However should there be a significant change in future, please do not hesitate to contact us.

I hope you will find this information useful.

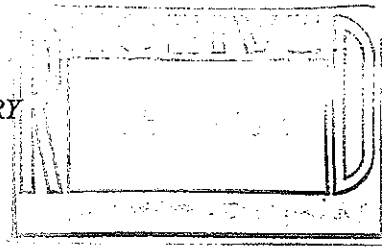

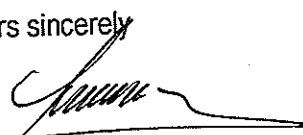

Thank you for referring Mr Gallagher to Mr Wilkinson's Clinic. He is a thirty-three year old unemployed man, since January this year, he was previously a team leader in a warehouse. He is complaining of a lump in the left flank, which he has had for five years, it is occasionally painful and progressively bigger. He is allergic to Penicillin, an asthmatic on inhalers including Ventolin and Becloforte. He smokes twenty cigarettes a day and he drinks six pints of lager a week and in the past he had an operation on his nose for a fracture. There are no other current medical problems.

Examination today showed a soft, lax abdomen, a lipoma in the left renal area measuring 3 x 4 cm in diameter. He had a tinge of jaundice today and I arranged for him to have U & E's and liver function tests to rule out jaundice and I have put his name on the waiting list for excision biopsy of the lump to be done under a local anaesthetic as a day case and he signed the consent form for me today, having explained all the possible complications and side-effects.

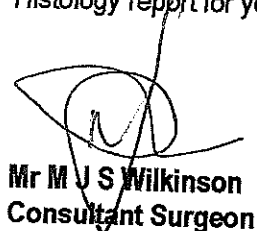

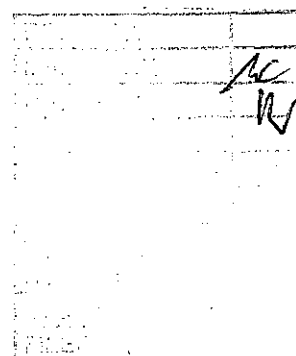

Thank you for your letter dated 8th June, 2004 requesting a report on Mr. Gallagher. I saw Mr. Gallagher for a screening assessment on 6th November, 2003 when it was agreed that he be seen initially in the anger management group and subsequently for individual therapy. He has completed the anger management group run by Kerry McCullough and I have met with him on a regular basis since 22nd April, 2004 for further assessment and then individual therapy.

Mr. Gallagher has had good attendance at sessions and appears to be extremely motivated to work on his problems. The main areas that we have agreed to address relate to dealing with issues arising from his past experiences of abuse as a child and to help him find more constructive ways of dealing with stressful situations in the here and now. He appears to have benefited significantly from the anger management group and appears to be coping well with conflict situations. During the session we have begun to work on helping him make links between some of his current problems and his past experiences as a child and to help him to adjust to his experiences. Our sessions have also focussed on how he manages the stressors in his current life, in particular those surrounding his contact with social and legal services. Mr. Gallagher reported that he has recently received feedback from the social worker and guardian about some difficulties with specific aspects of parenting. Both Mr. Gallagher and myself feel that he would also benefit from attending a parenting course. Our session may be able to indirectly address his parenting difficulties.

I will be continuing to meet with Mr. Gallagher on a regular basis and I envisage that he will require a further six months and will review at this time. He has made good use of the sessions to date and has shown some significant progress, particularly in relation to managing his anger. He has also made some adjustments to his past traumas and has made some positive changes in the way he interacts with others. He has shown a willingness to look at all aspects of himself, not only those which relate to him as a parent and envisage that he will continue to benefit from our input.

I have continued to meet with Mr Gallagher for individual work at the Department of Clinical Psychology, Lever Chambers Bolton. Following his initial screening assessment I met with William for further assessment and intervention from 1 April 2004 and our last appointment has been arranged for 15 March 2005. I will be going off for a period of maternity leave and have made arrangements for William's case to be transferred to my colleague Carol Ryan for further therapy.

In terms of the therapeutic services available to Mr Gallagher he will be given the option of a more extended period of therapeutic work. The exact time scale will be agreed between Carol Ryan and Mr Gallagher. If he wishes to attend for some joint sessions with Miss Thomas in order to address any relationship issues this is an option open to them. Miss Thomas has already attended for some limited joint sessions with Mr Gallagher. If Ms Thomas herself requires any individual therapeutic work this would have to have been initiated through a GP referral and acceptance into our service would be based on whether her mental health problems met our service criteria.

Mr Gallagher has engaged extremely well in therapy, attending the majority of sessions and making significant changes throughout our contact. Miss Thomas attended for two joint sessions on 7 December and 21 December 2004 where some limited couple therapy was provided. This joint work did not continue because they were no longer experiencing any significant relationship difficulties. I envisage Mr Gallagher continuing to derive significant benefit from future therapeutic input.
