This patient was sent up to our Department last night by his General Practitioner. Briefly, he attended us on 10.12.93, having been involved in a Road Traffic Accident. He was a pedestrian and was knocked down coming out of a pub. He attended us and had skull x-rays done at that stage and he was subsequently discharged.

Since the beginning of the year he has complained of frequent frontal headaches, which occur most days and last for up to one hour, and these are usually relieved by oral analgesics, frequently associated with nausea. He has also complained of minor memory deficits and of a persistent post-nasal drip, and also an intermittent watery discharge from his left nostril. He stated that this tasted salty. He is otherwise well and is still managing to work for a heating/ventilation company.

Examining him today, he is fully alert and orientated, with no neurological signs. I could not demonstrate any obvious memory deficit on clinical examination. He had a normal sense, smell and taste. Skull x-rays taken today did not reveal any evidence of intra-cranial air.

Despite his negative findings, I thought his history was suggestive of a possible persistent CFS leak and I feel this still needs to be excluded.

This young lad originally sustained a head injury during an RTA on 10.12.93. He was treated at the Western Infirmary, where his x-rays were reported as normal, and he was discharged from hospital later that day. He subsequently developed a headache, which has been intermittent but persistent and recently he started complaining of a persistent liquid discharge from the back of his nose into his throat. He has also noted a faltering memory, with a strange sense of fear around him whenever he goes out of the house. He has tried taking Anadin for the headache, which was of little benefit.

On examination he was found to be neurologically normal. There was no clinical evidence of any fluid discharge at the back of his nose.

He was observed overnight in the Short Stay Ward and remained unchanged. He was discharged home on 8.4.94 with further analgesics and a prophylactic course of penicillin V 500mg 4 times a day.

In view of the possible suggestion in history, but lack of evidence, it was felt that he should be investigated further at the Institute of Neurological Sciences. Arrangements have been made for him to be followed up and investigated there in the near future. He will be sent an appointment to attend the Institute in due course.

This young man was involved in a car accident about nine months ago and since that time has complained of a variety of symptoms including anxiety, paranoia, frontal headaches, diminished temper control, neuro-debility and a feeling that he has to swallow continuously. Despite the fact that he describes this as a post-nasal salty sensation, I do not think the likelihood of a persistent CSF leak after nine months is high. He is a smoker and this may be contributing to this symptom.

I doubt that there will be any physical cause that can be rectified and I suspect that many of his symptoms are simply attributable to a head injury which was worse than originally suspected.

I will arrange for an out-patient C.T. scan and he may benefit from some psychological counselling.
