



Thank you for your full referral letter on this 29 years old labourer. I saw him at Corby Diagnostic Centre with Dr. Williams, G.P.V.T. I find Mr. Clacker a rather vague historian and difficult to establish rapport with. His main complaint was of family problems. He said that he had discovered that his wife had been seeing another man whilst he was in prison 6 months ago for a 6-month sentence for defrauding Social Security by working whilst he was signed on as unemployed. Since that time he has had an affair with a fellow employee which was leading to problems both at home and at work as the boss had found out "he had told the lassie lies". He also told me that whilst he was in prison his mother had died. He described his mother as the only person who had ever helped him. He said that whilst she was terminally ill with cancer, he was transferred to Barlinnie Prison in Glasgow in order to visit her but when he got there he did not see his mother. He describes that since he came out of prison he had been feeling down and low with great difficulty in getting to sleep. He was not eating well and getting into trouble with poor timekeeping at work. He described that he did occasionally go on a major drinking binge, perhaps once every two months but he denied being violent during these. He went on to tell me that three days previously he had taken an overdose of half a bottle of Sinequan tablets. He had done this in front of his wife during a row about his affair. When she went to telephone he said he had cut the telephone wire, but she had eventually phoned but he refused to enter the ambulance when it arrived. The G.P. was informed and had advised that he should be taken into hospital should he become unconscious.

Current medication: Sinequan 50 mg. at night; past medical history: nil of note; past psychiatric history: inpatient treatment at Hartwood Hospital, Lanarkshire for several weeks following a "violent blow up" but he was very vague about what treatment he had received. In 1984 he overdosed on Tomazepam following a marital discord. At that time he was diagnosed as personality disorder. Family history: he was 4th of 5 children, born in Glasgow. His father was a steelworker, a regular heavy drinker with whom he had lost contact. His mother died in December 1986 of carcinoma. He has one brother Billy in Leeds who is a heavy drinker and another brother in Scotland called Malcolm with whom he keeps contact. He has two sisters who are also in Glasgow. In his personal history he describes having had problems with the Police from the age of 12 when he started to break in. He was examined by a Children's panel and sent to an

assessment centre at the age of 12, on the grounds of being out of control. He was eventually returned home at the age of 15 when he was about to leave school. At about this time he was in a children's home which he says was burnt to the ground with no casualties. He married his wife Barbara aged 21, after a year's courtship. He said his mother in law lived in Corby and never approved of him because he had been in trouble and had not been prepared to give him a second chance.

I was not able to get a very clear picture of what he had done since leaving school but it seems to have involved travelling between Scotland and Corby, being in and out of temporary employment and trouble with the Police with breaking and entering though he says he has only been in prison on one occasion.

I felt there was some doubt about this history as the assessment in 1984 mentioned a previous prison sentence. He says that the house and all its contents are in his wife's name. The couple have two children, Kelly aged 7 and Liam aged 2½. He says there are no problems with the children. His current employment is as a general labourer in a small printing firm in Carlton Park.

Mental state examination: he was fairly casually dressed and initially looked rather anxious. He spoke softly in a strong scottish accent, rather slowly but at times it was difficult to follow. His thought processes were formally normal; he said he sometimes felt that the boss was talking about him at the other end of the factory and he recounted two episodes in a shopping centre when he thought someone had called his name but there was nobody there but there was no convincing evidence of hallucinations. His affect was certainly flat and he described himself as having been down for some months. He was fully orientated in time and place and though not formally tested I would estimate his intelligence as being within the low average range.

My impression was that this man has an impulsive psychopathic personality disorder but on top of this he seems to have some degree of reactive depression to the combination of his mother's death and his marital problems. When I suggested that he could raise the Sinequan from 50 mg. at night he told me he had already tried this and had taken quite a number in the evenings but they had not helped him sleep and he really seemed more interested in having sleeping tablets than any other medication. At the time of the interview he denied being suicidal but with his impulsive nature it could not be ruled out he would try to overdose again. His flatness of affect and difficulty in establishing rapport did make me wonder if there was a schizoprenic process going on but I could find no positive evidence of this in the interview.

I will ask for a sight of the notes from Hartwood Hospital to see what that breakdown was. I asked him to come back in two weeks with his wife if she is agreeable to see Dr. Williams to assess if there is any hope in working with them as a couple, perhaps involving one of the Corby mental health team. About an hour later I had a phone call from Mr. Clacker asking to be admitted to hospital and I asked him to return to the Corby Diagnostic Centre to talk to me about this. He had not returned by 2 o'clock when I left. Shortly after doing this I had a phone call from his wife saying that he had gone off to work and that he had phoned asking to go in hospital asking to get her sympathy. She told me that following his overdose at the weekend, following cutting the telephone wire, he had threatened her with a knife if she called for an ambulance and she had shut herself in the bathroom. She also said he had been knocking her about in front of the children and that she had seen her solicitor with a view to starting

divorce proceedings. She has not told him this as she is frightened of this but says he is going to Scotland at the weekend and his sister will tell him then that she does not want him back. I suggested to her that the violence was a matter for the police and she should also speak to her solicitor about it.

I would be grateful for your help and opinion on this man. He recently underwent six months prison sentence for D.H.S.S. fraud, during which time his mother died. Since coming home he has returned to in fact, a better job. However he has remained depressed, with problems sleeping, occasional bouts of heavy drinking, poor appetite and marital problems.

He has a long history of mild anxiety and depression for which he has been treated initially with Triazolam which we were finally able to wean him off and recently has had treatment with Sinequan 25mgs. at night and Prothiaden 150 mgs. at night. However despite six weeks of treatment with the latter, he has shown no improvement.

In 1984 he took an overdose of Temazepam and was followed up briefly after this, at that time there was considerable family and financial problems. The financial problems have mostly resolved, however his relationship with his wife is still fairly stormy and she is actually saying to me that unless he sorts it out, she intends leaving him. His childhood background is fairly stormy and his father also drank heavily and I think he is probably reacting in a similar way presumably by modelling himself on his own experiences.

I am not sure what psychiatrically you would be able to offer him or whether his main problems are partly a bereavement reaction to his mother's death, partly depression, or probably in the main a personality disorder.

In view of the dangers to the continuation of his marriage and problems thereafter, I would be grateful for your opinion and help re his further management. He is at present continuing with his Prothiaden medication.

I saw this man on Harroden 'B' ward following an overdose of ten Temazepam tablets which he took the previous night at 11.00 p.m. This is his first overdose and at the time he meant to kill himself because of arguments with his wife.


He tells me that his wife is suffering from schizophrenia and his mother is suffering from cancer. He works as a packer for Golden Wonder crisps for the past two weeks, and previously he was unemployed for quite some time. He has been married for three years and has a girl aged four. He tells me that his wife has never received any psychiatric treatment and she acts funnily and some times does not talk. On a few occasions she has threatened to leave him.

He has been involved with the law several times for stealing and drunken driving for which he received a prison sentence a year ago. He lives in a council house and admits to no financial difficulties. The marital relationship is rather stormy and he admits that he has hit his wife on several occasions. He smokes occasionally and drinks socially.

At interview he was quite stable and not unduly depressed, not showing any suicidal ideas and his higher intellectual functions are within the normal limits. In my opinion, this man may be suffering from personality problems coupled with social stresses. I am therefore discharging him back into your care. I do not think any psychiatric intervention is necessary in this case but I am requesting the Social Services to visit him and see if any possible assistance can be given to the family.



Problems: (i) Bronchitis and possible asthma – undergoing further assessment
(ii) Previous history of high alcohol intake
(iii) Cigarette smoker

Thank you for your letter about this 41 year old man whom I saw at the Respiratory Clinic this morning because of bronchitis and possible asthma. I found the history very difficult to elicit and have arranged to assess further.

History

He described chest problems since childhood and he was unable to undertake gym or sporting activities because of breathlessness. However, I could not elicit clear asthma features and there had been no exacerbations of these symptoms. Now, he describes breathlessness on exertion. There may be some cough and wheezy breathlessness in the mornings but there is no sleep disturbance. He finds inhalers helpful.

There is a background of eczema but no other atopic features. I note the history of high alcohol intake and his continued cigarette smoking.

Examination

He is plump and looks well. There are harsh rhonchi in the lower zones of the lungs. Blood pressure 140/70. The remainder of the examination is normal.

Investigation

The chest radiograph is normal. Spirometry shows minimal airflow obstruction which is unchanged after Salbutamol. Pulse oximetry normal at 98%. The ECG shows sinus rhythm with a minor intraventricular conduction defect.

I have checked his routine bloods.

Summary and Management

This man has a productive cough and some airway symptoms. The history is very difficult to clarify but the presence of a similar problem in childhood might suggest asthma. Nevertheless, the clinical picture was more like smoking related bronchitis.

I have asked him to monitor his peak flow twice daily at home to assess the stability of airway tone.

I suggest increasing the inhaled steroid by switching from Becotide 100 1 puff bd to Becloforte 2 puffs by volumatic. He should continue with Ventolin 2 puffs as required but might stop the low dose Salmeterol and low dose Slo-Phyllin at present. His other treatment comprises Transvasin, Ranitidine, Zydol and Nitrazepam.

I have arranged review at the clinic in 3 months.

I would be grateful if you could see this man who has a long history of behavioural problems, intermingled with personal/social ones. The current situation is that he takes 40mg of temazepam daily and claims he cannot sleep without this.

A brief history is that he has been in trouble with the police of and on since the age of 12 since he started to break into houses and at that time was examined by the childrens panel and sent to an assessment centre where he stayed from the age of 12 to 15. He married when he was 21 and had 2 children who would now be around 11 and 6. He split up from his wife around 1987 following a long history of marital discord and his wife ultimately met someone else. At that time he lived in Corby and he returned to Bellshill in 1988. He has guilt feelings over his mother death and he

He was in prison in 1987 when she died with cancer. In the past he has overdosed with Sinequan and on another 2-3 occasions with temazepam and alcohol.
