Reveille as normal in all houses with routines being followed reasonably well. Mr West called in sick at 9<sup>00</sup> AM. All weekend incidents followed up as requested by Mr Walker. S. Martin once again absconded, he ran away from an Assessment Centre on Sunday afternoon. [redacted] being returned on Tuesday by his H.A.S.W. All days events as per diary. Evening activities were sports hall, video, TV and house games. W/H taken to the sports hall by Mr Crawford and Mr Aagaard. On paying a routine check to the hall, Mr Jenkins found boys returning to the house very disgruntled. This apparently was due to [redacted] and Mr Aagaard having a confrontation over football, with [redacted] offering Mr Aagaard a square go as Mr Jenkins arrived in the hall. [redacted] returned to the house with Mr Crawford. Mr Aagaard stated that Shaw had deliberately kicked the ball at him and was warned of the consequences if this were repeated.
