You recently wrote requesting an up date as to whether Jordan McCourt was being seen here in Primary Care and whether we were continuing to prescribe him Methylphenidate.

On review of his medical records I can see that this drug was commenced back in April time and it appears as though the first prescription was dispensed from New Craigs. It appears as though he has not attended for further follow up since then.

I can confirm that we have had no contact from Jordan in the interim period. We have not provided any prescriptions for this drug.

The only point to note is that earlier correspondence from the Psychiatry Department had his address as ~~32 Rosehaugh Road, Inverness IV3 8SP~~. That is certainly still the address that we have on his records here at Crown. I know that this is also the address where his aunt and uncle reside.

Your most recent letter has a different address - ~~Room 1, Grosvenor Hotel, 39 High Street, Inverness IV1 4HB~~. I do wonder whether he has indeed received the appointments if there has been a mix up with his address in his contact details.

The mobile number that we have on record is 07780904062 if this is of any help.

If he does make contact with us here then I will get back in touch with you as we certainly wouldn't be happy to issue any prescriptions given the length of time since he was first seen.

Unfortunately Jordan failed to attend for his review appointment today and made no contact with us and sent no reason why. As you are aware we recently started Jordan on Methylphenidate and we would be keen to assess his progress. We will give him another appointment as soon as possible. I will also write directly to Jordan about the importance of monitoring his health while he's taking Methylphenidate. In case he makes contact with you in the meantime - we started him on 5 mgs of Methylphenidate three times daily initially. This can be increased to 10 mgs three times daily and then to 15 mgs three times daily every week as dictated by his symptoms and progress up to a maximum of 100 mgs of Methylphenidate in 24 hours.

Progress since Last Review:

According to Jordan's Gran there have been no significant changes in his behaviour since his last appointment. As before, Jordan has been denying that there was anything wrong with him in the first place but was willing to accept treatment. I went over the diagnostic criteria for ADHD with Jordan and his Gran and he appears to fulfil them. In discussion with Dr. Mannali, consultant, I obtained an informed consent for commencement of Methylphenidate from Jordan and the drug regime was subsequently discussed with the Pharmacy at New Craigs Hospital.

Thank you for having referred Jordan to us. I saw him in my out patient clinic on the 31st March 2011. Dr Mannali joined us for the last fifteen minutes of a one hour appointment. Jordan came with her gran who was the main informant throughout the interview.

Presenting Complaints:

There is no facility to have a meaningful conversation, Jordan 'loses head' at the slightest provocation and storms out, he swears, slams doors, he asked 'stupid questions'. He appears immature, doesn't know where to stop. When I asked Jordan directly what was wrong with him he would just say 'I'm okay, I don't know'.

History of Presenting Complaint:

Jordan thinks that he is not any worse than he has ever been. He says he has always been 'hyper, jumping about'. The problems with hyperactivity started when Jordan was four or five years old. He was diagnosed with ADHD at the age of fourteen and was attending a special school. He says that his appetite and weight are okay, he sleeps normally and he described his general health as 'okay'. Jordan says that he used to drink 'a lot'. He has cut down on his alcohol consumption recently. His last drink was Monday, to celebrate his Gran's birthday. Previously, he would drink three big bottles of beer everyday. He smokes ten to fifteen cigarettes per day but denies using street drugs.

Past Psychiatric History:

As mentioned above, Jordan was diagnosed with ADHD at the age of fourteen and was on medication for this, which was stopped, when he completed 16.

Past Medical History:

Jordan had an operation, laparotomy, which followed a stabbing in 2010 in Glasgow. Otherwise his past medical history is unremarkable.

Family History:

Family history is unremarkable. No history of mental illness, diabetes, heart disease, or other significant conditions.

Personal & Social History:



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Jordan was born normally. He says he can't remember much about his early childhood. He went to school at the age of five. He admits to having played truant often. He was moved to a special school at the age of twelve. He left school aged sixteen. When I asked him about his qualifications he said, 'I don't know'. He said he had been working as a 'support worker' since the age of seventeen, for about a year. This was in Paisley. He left his job because it was too far away from him to travel. He says he had a poor relationship with his teachers and other pupils and admitted to having bullied some of his peers. He said that teachers used to pick on him and that he often 'had to do that for himself'. Jordan says that his academic performance was below average. His favourite subjects were physical education and he likes playing football a lot. He wanted to become a professional football player but didn't quite make it. Currently he is neither working nor studying and is living with his uncle. He signed up at the Job Centre and he is looking for a job in the retail sector. While looking for a job he says he is helping his uncle with his cleaning business. He had a few relationships with females in the past, most of them lasted months however, one of them lasted almost four years. He is seeing a girl now who is a neighbour across the road.

He moved over from Glasgow to Inverness following the stabbing in 2010. Jordan describes this as a case of mistaken identity and a completely unprovoked attack. Despite that he seems to be fearful of staying in Glasgow and feels more comfortable here in Inverness.

Forensic History:

There is no obvious forensic history. Jordan denies any past or pending court cases.

Mental State Examination:

Jordan presented dressed adequately in casual attire. He was well kempt. His body frame was average. His gait was okay. His facial expression was unremarkable. Rapport was established easily. Jordan kept on fiddling constantly with a bottle of coke and kept on looking at the walls and out of the window. He appeared fidgety and restless. He maintained only intermittent eye contact and was very distractible. He was cooperative and his psychomotor activity was slightly elevated. In terms of his speech assessment, the most frequent answer he would give me was 'I don't know'. His speech was spontaneous, was relevant and coherent and there was no pressure. I elicited no abnormalities of thought or perception. His mood was objectively and subjectively euthymic with normal range and reactivity, congruent and appropriate. Jordan was fully orientated in time, place and himself. His memory was adequate. His intelligence appeared average. Jordan had some insight into what was going wrong with him and was willing to take treatment. His social and personal judgment was adequate.

This 17-year-old male attended as an emergency at 21.39 hours on 04.06.10 having been assaulted with a knife. He had sustained a solitary 1.5 cm long incised wound over his left buttock and lower left sacrum. His cardio-respiratory function was satisfactory. He was tender across the lower abdomen. Further assessment with CT scan that night demonstrated free fluid in the peritoneal cavity and a suggestion of trauma to the rectum and bladder. Consequently, he underwent exploratory laparotomy later that night. This demonstrated 1 litre of intra-peritoneal blood and a 2 cm long laceration to the right wall of the rectum above the peritoneal reflection. No other injury was detected; in particular there was no evidence of trauma to his bladder. The anterior wall of the rectum was opened by extending the stab injury to ensure there was not a through and through injury into the mesorectal space. Thereafter, he underwent primary repair of his rectum and peritoneal lavage. His post-operative recovery was satisfactory and he was discharged four days later. He will be reviewed in my clinic in due course.

Thank you for your referral of the above gentleman. I saw him at my clinic on 15th October.

He told me he had moved from Inverness 1½ years ago. He said that he used to be seen by CAMHS and they stopped his medication 1½ years ago. He said he was on Ritalin first and Concerta. He was very reluctant to talk about his personal history or about himself in general but I ascertained his forensic history. He said he drinks alcohol because he is bored and usually does this at the weekends. He has been arrested several times for antisocial behaviour, he is not sure how many times. He did not have any complaints of low mood or any ideas of deliberate self harm or suicide or harm to others. He admitted that he was aggressive verbally when he drinks.

He said he went to Kible which is a residential school when he was diagnosed with ADHD. There is uncertainty whether he has borderline learning disability as well. He socialises with younger people between the ages of 14 to 17 and this was flagged up to Social Services and investigated. He still prefers to be with younger people ~~especially young girls~~.

He told me he is sleeping well and has a good appetite. He said he is not able to understand social norms and is constantly shouting. He lives with his mother. Previously he used to live with his grandfather before moving here.

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Family History

~~He has a 16 year old brother who is in a secure unit for murdering his father~~
~~some two years ago. He has two step sisters 9 and 11 in foster care. He~~
lives with his mother, his oldest brother who is 21 years old and his younger
brother Ryan is 16 years old.

He is a smoker but denies illicit drug use. He said he has started a course for painting for the housing department. He spent from the age of 7 to 16 in Kible. There is no medical history of relevance. His mother suffers from suffers from anxiety and depression and he states that there are mental health problems in his father's family.

Personal History

He was born in Glasgow, he said he was a blue baby with the cord round his neck. He went to Kible from 11 years of age to 16 due to his behaviour problems, mainly he was very disruptive. He left Kible aged 16 years and moved here 1½ years ago. He lives with his mother and told me he intends to live with his mother for the rest of his life. ~~He has a two year old son from a previous relationship~~

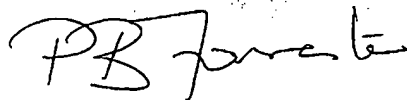
Mental State Examination

On examination he was casually dressed and appeared relaxed. He maintained good eye contact. He hardly spoke except for one word monosyllabic answers. He appeared euthymic in mood. I did not note any evidence of psychosis and he denied any ideas of self harm, suicide or harm to others. Generally he appeared quite immature and told me that there was nothing wrong with him.

Plan

I discussed how to progress with his case at our Feedback meeting. It was decided that we have nothing to offer him at this point hence we are discharging him back to your care.

Jordan was seen at Kibble School for review of his ADHD medication.

It had been previously discussed that Jordan may consider a transition from Concerta XL to Atomoxetine in an attempt to maximise treatment of ADHD symptoms over a 24 hour period, particularly as Jordan is making his transition from being accommodated at Kibble School and returning to live at home and striving for independent living now that he is 16 years old.

However, Jordan is adamant that he wants to discontinue his medication. We discussed at length the impact this decision may have on his daily functioning. Both care staff and employment workers at Kibble School notice a detrimental impact on Jordan's functioning and behaviour on the days when he is not taking his medication. He has also picked up criminal charges whilst out in the community when he has not taken his medication. Despite the evidence to suggest the benefits Jordan receives from his medication, he continues to insist that his medication be discontinued.

I have therefore recommended that he reduce from Concerta XL 54mg daily to 36mg for 7 days to 18mg for 7 days and then stopping. I have also recommended to him that if at any time he wishes to reconsider and recommence medication, he should approach his GP in the first instance to discuss this further.

It is important to mention that if Jordan was to recommence medication, Dr Philip, Consultant in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, would recommend Atomoxetine for the reasons previously mentioned in this letter.

I have been told that it is planned for Jordan to leave Kibble School in the very near future to return to living in the Glasgow area, so I have no other choice but to discharge him from CAMHS.

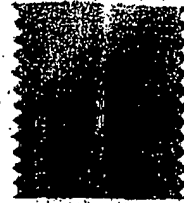

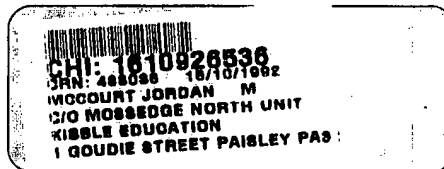

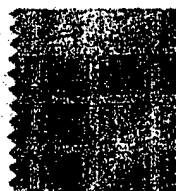

Jordan had his comprehensive developmental medical examination today at Foxbar LAC Clinic. He was accompanied by care staff from Kibble School.

This is Jordan's 2nd placement in care, prior to this he was in a children's unit in Glasgow. He was accommodated in Kibble Education and Care Centre in July 2005. He has settled well in Mossedge North Unit within Kibble School. He is happy and participates fully in the school curriculum. The education staff are pleased with his academic progress.

He is taking his Ritalin medication 15 mgm tid as prescribed by the CAMHS LAC Team in Glasgow.

He is not having any side effects from his medication. His appetite is good and growth satisfactory.

Jordan feels he becomes very restless and impulsive in the later part of the evening ie: nearing bedtime. During this period he becomes confrontational, verbally abusive and challenges authority. The care worker who accompanied him stated that Jordan can be abusive without any provocation. The care staff feel that he has attention seeking behaviour and they are able to cope. He plays football and has given up smoking.

Airth Drive Children's Unit contacted me last week to let me know that Jordan has now decided to try stimulant medication to control his ADHD symptoms. Apparently he had once again got into trouble at school and I think he realises that if things don't improve then he is unlikely to be able to remain in his present school placement.

I have accordingly commenced titration as we would normally do with a small amount - 5 mgs tid to begin with and then increasing to 10 mgs tid.

I spoke to unit staff yesterday who informed me that there has been no significant improvement as yet but Jordan is still quite reluctant to take medication and before increasing to 15 mgs bd the staff are going to discuss with Jordan the potential benefits of a further increase.

At present however, I would be grateful if Jordan could continue to be prescribed 10 mgs tid and I will let you know if we are able to increase the dose to 15 mgs tid.

I enclose a copy of an assessment letter undertaken by colleagues in Child & Adolescent Mental Health Services in respect to Jordan who is currently residing in Airth Dr Childrens Unit.

As you will see from the assessment it is our opinion that some of the reasons for Jordan's behavioural difficulties can be attributed to ADHD although there are likely to be other environmental factors involved in understanding causation.

However, with respect to ADHD there are clear medical interventions that are available to us to manage these problems. Initially Jordan was very reluctant to think about using medication and it was left in abeyance following his assessment last Autumn.

Recently the Looked After and Accommodated Childrens Health Nurse contacted myself as the local Adolescent Psychiatrist for South Glasgow, to let me know that Jordan has begun to think about engaging in trying medication to control his ADHD.

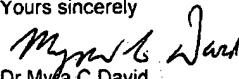
I therefore met with Jordan accompanied by a Key Worker from Airth Drive and Margaret Brown, LAC Nurse, on the 18th of March to discuss medication and commence him on it.

I certainly found Jordan quite impulsive and very easily distracted beyond what would be appropriate for a boy of his chronological age and certainly from reading the assessments carried out would concur with Dr Putter's formulation and recommendations.

I would therefore be grateful if Jordan could be commenced on Methylphenidate 5mg tid increasing to 10 mg tid. He has had his height and weight checked here in the clinic and this will continue to be monitored here and I shall be seeing him again in a couple of weeks time to review the impact of medication on Jordan's ADHD. The Unit have been given advice on how to monitor improvement as well as looking for side effects and they will make communication with school to get some objective evidence as to the impact of Methylphenidate in school time.

I shall keep you informed of how the diagnostic trial goes.

He was found to be tongue-tied and had an operation at 15 months under general anaesthetic for this to be remedied. Ms McCourt said that he was slow to talk and feels that his speech has always been delayed. Although she describes it as being better now it is still difficult to understand him when he is under pressure or excited. He attended Stepping Stones as a toddler then nursery school. He had no problems with separating and no behavioural problems were noted at the time. Mrs McCourt reported that although he was not more active than his siblings he was never able to sit still and would always be moving around and fidgeting. She felt that he has always been very distractible and impulsive. She feels that he currently has no road sense or sense of danger. He has pronounced difficulties with co-ordination, only learned to tie his shoelaces one year ago and has difficulty holding cutlery and is generally clumsy.

History of Schooling

Jordan is reported to have settled well into primary school and did well in P1 and P2 despite being a bit slow to understand the work. He did not have any significant behavioural problems at that stage. These seemed to start in P3 when Ryan also started attending the same school. Jordan and Ryan started playing truant together. Ms McCourt felt that Jordan was very vulnerable to Ryan's influence despite Ryan being the younger of the two. He currently is in P7 at St Stephen's primary and is reported to attend regularly and to enjoy school.

From Karina Woldt's school observations and reports from his school teacher he is described as being inattentive, hyperactive and impulsive within the school environment. His mother reported that she always had concerns about his academic performance but she did not know whether he was formally tested. We have therefore requested a neuropsychological assessment and Karina Woldt will send you a separate report on this.

Individual Assessment

I saw Jordan on two occasions at Airth Drive Children's Unit. Prior to these two occasions he did not want to see me at arranged times and on a third occasion he did not return to the unit for our appointed time. We therefore decided that the best time for me to meet Jordan would be early morning before he would leave the unit. On both occasions he could not tolerate being in an interview situation for longer than 15-20 minutes.

At our first interview he was woken up shortly before I arrived at the unit and was still sleepy. However, he managed to get dressed and get breakfast before the interview and was somewhat co-operative. He was eager to finish the interview so he could go out with his friends.

He denied having any problems and when I explained why I had come to see him he acknowledged that he had problems with listening to people or keeping his mind on a task. He tried to steer the conversation to his own interests and even when this was allowed he had difficulty sustaining a conversation about one topic. He agreed to a further interview provided it was done before school started the following week. I therefore saw him four days later, again first thing in the morning but I asked staff to wake him a while before I arrived so that he was not as sleepy as the time before.

During this interview Jordan had a lot of difficulty staying in the room. He could barely attend to any of the conversation. He changed seats after only minutes of sitting in one place and would fidget constantly when trying to sit still. Eventually he went to sit on the windowsill and kept opening the window. He was distracted by any activity outside and acknowledged that he could not wait to get out. However, he did acknowledge that this is how he felt at school and at home and that he has major difficulty in trying to control these feelings.

During both sessions I tried to discuss the possibility of Jordan having ADHD with him but on both occasions he indicated that he is not interested, that he does not think there is anything wrong with him and that he wouldn't take medication.

Summary

I saw Jordan specifically to assess the possibility of whether he has attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. From the developmental history given by his mother he seemed to have displayed distractibility and impulsivity since being a toddler and it has not improved with him becoming older. She describes hyperactivity in the sense of not being able to sit still or fidgeting for as long as she can remember.

Additionally his mother described problems with co-ordination and learning. He has been displaying problematic behaviours since approximately age 6.

In addition to his mother's report he is also reported by school and at school observation to be inattentive, hyperactive and impulsive within the school setting. These behaviours are all replicated at his current residence at Airth Drive and was prominently displayed in the short interviews that I had with him. Jordan meets the diagnostic criteria for attention deficit hyperactivity disorder having the core symptoms of inattention, hyperactivity and impulsivity from a young age in different settings.

Jordan expressed that he did not want any help with this even if it was present and that he would not take medication. However, I think that it would be important that this is kept in mind in his management programme in future. It may be that he would want to look at the implication of having ADHD at a later stage or that he might want to consider medication.

Recommendation

If in future Jordan would want to consider treatment for ADHD a referral to his local child and adolescent mental health service would be appropriate. Whether or not he would be deemed fit for medical treatment would be decided at that time.

However, in managing Jordan's behaviour it should be remembered that he has these difficulties. It would contribute to his antisocial behaviour but not be the cause of antisocial behaviour per se. He would require a consistent management plan which would take into account his difficulties in attending and controlling impulses specifically. His difficulty with hyperactivity and inattention should be remembered when trying to engage him in any programme and in school work. For example if he is given regular breaks where he is allowed to engage in physical activity this can help with increasing his ability to attend in the interim periods.

Further recommendations were made by ~~Marina Widdow~~ in her report on Jordan's cognitive neuropsychological assessment and I agree with all these recommendations.

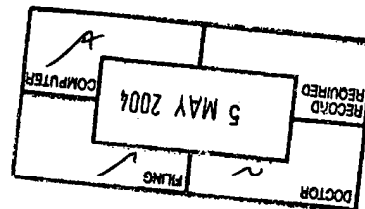

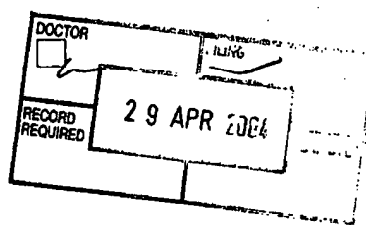

Developmental History

Jordan was born full term weighing 7lb 3oz Mrs McCourt recalls that Jordan was born with his cord around his neck, his face was blue, she remembered feeling concerned about him but within five minutes following the birth he was fine. As a baby he was quiet and loved his bed he didn't have any colic but at the age of around a year she discovered that Jordan was tongue tied. Mrs McCourt feels that from around the age of 18 months when he had an operation for this and also attended speech therapy that is when Jordan's difficult behaviour started. She felt that Jordan out of frustration would throw things when he couldn't make people understand what he wanted. Jordan still has difficulty in pronouncing his "R's" and his younger brother Ryan now corrects him. Jordan attained his developmental milestones within the normal range and there seemed to be no other difficulties. Jordan was out of day time nappies at just over 2 years of age and finished using night nappies at the age of 3 he does however still wet the bed, although Mrs McCourt wasn't raising this as a problem area.

When I met with Jordan and his mum Jordan was able to be easily contained in the room and occupied himself well with the toys. Towards the end of the meeting he was drawing and began to write his name. Jordan was able to pick out a couple of words for me that he could read and he was interested in his letterland alphabet that he was learning at school, mum was helping him with this by prompting him when he was attempting to spell his name. 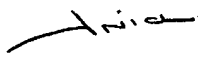

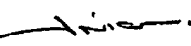

Thank you for your re-referral of Jordan McCourt. Dr. McKean wrote to us about him in July and we have now had access to previous notes on this case.

The case seems worrying for a number of reasons, mostly relating to the difficult situation in the family home with considerable alcohol consumption and a chaotic lifestyle. Jordan's behaviour in the context of this seems to be understandable, and we would be happy to see the family in due course. However, we feel that the urgency in this situation is to provide support for this family and the children in practical terms which will then allow more therapeutic work to go on. In terms of the Social Work Department, Jordan would be regarded as a child with special needs because he has alcohol abusing parents. The Social Work Department may be able to offer practical support in helping the family cope, providing some stability for these children. I would be grateful if you could pursue the possibility of Social Work involvement with the family and with the local Social Work Area Team.

In the meantime Jordan has been placed on our short waiting list, and I anticipate that he will be seen within the next few months.

RISK ASSESSMENT

Jordan McCourt DOB 16.10.92 CHI 6536
C/o Kibble School, Goudie Street, Paisley PA3 2LG

Jordan was assessed by [redacted] Forensic Social Worker. She was assisted by [redacted] Trainee Psychologist. The author has expertise in undertaking risk assessments. In addition the author has also completed specialist training in the treatment of youths who sexually offend.

It should be noted that this report has been completed using the Estimated Risk of Adolescent Sexual Offence Recidivism (ERASOR) (Worling and Curwen 2001). Forensic research and practice guidelines indicate that structured professional judgment is the approach of choice in risk assessments.

There is considerable controversy concerning the best approach to conducting risk assessments with sexual offenders. Everyone agrees that evaluators should consider valid risk factors and that evaluations based on multiple sources of information are more likely to be reliable than those based on a single source (particularly when the source is the offender). Disagreement arises however on the best method of combining risk factors in comprehensive evaluations. Many of these debates will remain active pending future research (Hanson) (For the Treatment of Sexual Abusers 2000)

The writer and [redacted] meet with: Mother ([redacted]), [redacted] Ennisege (social worker), [redacted] (Key Worker), Subject.

Social work records were also consulted

Behaviour at Interview

Jordan presented as relaxed though wary as to the nature of the interview which was perfectly normal given the details that were being discussed. He was able to sustain a meeting of approximately 45 minutes during which time the following were present:

Given the smallness of the room in which he was being interviewed and the number of people present Jordan remained calm throughout. It should be noted that Jordan's Key Worker was present at Jordan's insistence.

Account of Offence

Jordan mother claimed that approximately 3 years ago she walked into the bedroom and found Jordan lying on top of his ~~younger brother~~ who was approximately aged 1 at the time simulating sex. It should be noted that Jordan was fully clothed at the time and his ~~brother~~ was also clothed and asleep. There is further documentation with in social work records that there were two separate incidents of Jordan having used sexualized language to girls approximately aged 5 years and 9 years. The police were informed of these incidents but no further action was taken due to lack of evidence.

Jordan for his part denies that he simulated sex with his younger sister though admits that he was lying in the bed next to her. Further he also denied having made sexually inappropriate language to two young girls, though stated that it was his younger brother ~~brother~~ who had used in appropriate language.

Relevant Early Background

Jordan is the second eldest of 6 children there being one older brother two younger brother and two younger sisters. Jordan's family reside in a multi storey in area of high deprivation. At times whilst in the home and within the local area I feel it fair to say that Jordan's behaviour was challenging and mum struggled to controls not only Jordan but also his other siblings. Jordan and his ~~younger brother~~ spent short periods of time in care returning home only to be moved again. Jordan has now spent over two years in care. Throughout the years mum has described Jordan as being hyper often truanting from school and presenting adverse behaviours with in the community eventually cumulating in him being excluded permanently from mainstream education and having a number of referrals to the children panel.

Jordan was assessed for and diagnosed as having ADHD and was prescribed medication for his condition. This appeared to have positive benefits

Jordan was initially placed Airth Drive Children's unit 2004 were again his behaviour was challenging. Due to these behaviours he was placed Kibble Education and Care Centre August 2005. Since that time there has been a positive improvement in his behaviour though there has been the odd altercation.

Assessment

The following details evidence and scoring of the individual risk factors related to sexually inappropriate behaviour.

Deviant Sexual interests

Not Present

Adolescents who are sexually aroused by younger children and/or sexual violence are more likely to be at risk of committing subsequent sexual offences (Worthing & Curwen 2000)

Since the reported sexual incidents which were over 2 years ago there have been no more reported incidents. It should also be noted that Jordan denies any involvement in inappropriate sexual behaviour.

Obsessive Sexual Interests

Possibly Present

Adolescent sexual offenders who demonstrate obsessive sexual interests and who are preoccupied with sexual thoughts, behaviours or gestures are most likely at greater risk of further sexual assaults. Furthermore, authors of existing risk-assessments checklists/guidelines for adolescent sexual offenders note that assault supportive attitudes such as victim blame and the belief that sexual assaults are not wrong or harmful are indicators of higher risk (Calder et al Epps, 1997; Perry & Orchard 1992; Plenkty et al; 2000).

Jordan denies any wrong doing though several sources including his mother state that Jordan has uses sexual inappropriate language and sexual inappropriate language to more than one young girl.

Attitudes Supportive of Sexual Offending **Not Present**

Adolescents with history of sexual offences who believe that sexual assaults are "invited", "desired", "harmless" or otherwise "welcomed" by victims are most likely to continue committing sexual assaults (Calder et al; 1997; Epps, 1997; Perry and Orchard 1992; Prentky et al; 2000)>

Jordan displays no deviant sexual interests. This is born at by his key worker and other staff within the unit which Jordan currently resides with in Kibble.

Unwillingness to Alter Deviant Sexual Interests/Attitudes **Not Present**

Ever Sexually 2 or More Victims **Present**

Adolescents who have committed sexual offences against 2 or more victims are most likely at higher risk of re-offending than those adolescents who have committed offences against a single victim. Research regarding this factor is quite consistent. Specifically Rasmussen (1999) found that a number of female victims were sufficiently related to sexual re-offences

Ever sexually assaulted the same victim 2 or more times **Possibly Present**

Jordan denies ever having any sexual contact with his ~~young sister~~. Various sources i.e. social worker home career workers state that mum advised them of two separate occasions were Jordan had lain on top of his ~~sister~~ and stimulated sex. Once within the family home and once within his grandmother's home.

Ever Sexually Assaulted the Same Victim 2 or More Times **Possibly Present**

As stated previously.

Threat of or Use of Excessive Violence / Weapons During Sexual Offence **Not Present**

There were no reports that any coercion was used in the reported offences.

Ever Assaulted a Child **Present**

Adolescents who have ever assaulted a prepubescent child are more likely at risk of continued sexual assaults. In their check lists of risk factors Ross & Loss (1991) suggested that offenders who chose young children are at higher risk to re-offend

The ages of the girls Jordan is reported to have acted inappropriately with were aged 1, 5 and 9 Jordan would have been approximately 10 at the time

Ever Sexually Assaulted a Stranger **Possibly Present**

It was reported that Jordan knew 2 of his victims however 3rd victim was unknown to him

Indiscriminate Choice of Victims **Present**

Adolescents who have committed sexual offences against both males and females or against individuals both within and outside of family relationships, or against known and

stranger victims, or against victims of a variety of ages (i.e. children and peer/adults) are likely at a higher risk of to re-offend

As documented Jordan is alleged to have committed offences against 3 separate victims.

Diverse Sexual-Assault Behaviours

Possibly Present

It has been reported that Jordan simulated sex and also used verbalized sexual assault on his victims

Antisocial Interpersonal Orientation

Not Present

Adolescent sexual offenders who display an antisocial interpersonal orientation are more likely to be at higher risk of further sexual offences

There have been no reports of any inappropriate sexualised behaviour in recent months.

Lack of intimate peer relationships/social isolation

Not Present

With out intimate peer relationships adolescents are likely to feel lonely and isolated and they may turn to children and or forced sex peers/adults when they desire sexual interactions. Although there is no evidence for a link between broadly defined "social" difficulties and sexual recidivism (Khan & Chambers, 1991; Worling & Curwen, 2000a) it is more likely that the more specific social deficit-inability to form and maintain an emotionally intimate relationship with a peer is related to risk of further sexual assaults.

Jordan has an age appropriate relationship and various friendships amongst his peers.

Negative Peer Associations and Influences

Not Present

Whilst it may be felt that Jordan's current residential placement may bring him into contact with peers that who engage in antisocial behaviours I would venture to say that Jordan does not seek out peers out with his setting with a view to engage in adverse behaviours

Interpersonal Aggression

Not Present

Adolescent sexual offenders who have demonstrated a pattern of interpersonal aggression-in addition to their sexual offence(s) are most likely at higher risk of committing further sexual offences. Adolescents who are aggressive and hurtful towards others may have learned to cope with personal difficulties by relaying on aggressive behaviours. (Bremer, 1998; Epps 1997; Perry and Orchard, 1992; Prentky et al; 2000; Ross & Loss 1991; Wenet & Clark, 1986)

Staff at Kibble speak of a well adjusted and in the main settled and happy young person who acts age appropriately having the normal behaviours of an adolescent. Whilst it may have been true in the past Jordan does not seek to settle any problems he may have by use of force or violence.

Recent Escalation in Anger or Negative Effect

Not Present

As before

Poor Self Regulation or affect and behaviour (impulsivity)

Not Present

As detailed before Jordan was diagnosed as having ADHD for which he was prescribed medication which appears to have a positive effect on his adverse behaviours. I would

Conclusion

Jordan is young person who's early years were characterised by an unstable family environment i.e. frequent moves, chaotic home environment, no clear boundaries, inappropriate use of sanctions regarding his adverse behaviour, in short, no consistent parenting.

This has led to Jordan being removed from the family home which at this time has benefited his well being. That said it should be noted that family still remain supportive of him and are attempting to moderate their behaviours that have had a negative effect on each other.

Jordan denies that he has ever committed any sexually inappropriate behaviour though he was able to admit that he has committed other acts of inappropriate behaviours i.e. fighting assaulting other children, out with control of his parents.

This has led to him being accommodated. In the beginning this appeared to exacerbate his behaviour.

His first period of accommodation in Airth Drive Children's Unit appeared to exacerbate his behaviours rather than alleviate them. However, since being accommodated in Kibble there has been a vast improvement in his behaviour.

Home environment in the main has continued to be chaotic though there is evidence that both parents are attempting to modify their adverse behaviours and create a more balanced approach to parenting. ~~She~~ for her part acknowledges that her negative experiences as a child have impinged on her ability to parent effectively and this is an area she needs to address in order for her to move on. It was mum that intentionally advised social work of her Jordan's sexually inappropriate behaviour towards his younger sister which must have been difficult for her. Again, apart from the 4 reported sexually inappropriate Behaviours There has been no further allegations and Jordan's view of females, to the writer's mind, appear to be age appropriate at this time. It was understandable in the beginning that people would be wary of leaving Jordan with young females However, as stated before there have been no further concerns. That said it would be of no harm for Jordan to learn about sexually appropriate behaviour and the consequences should he commit a sexual offence, but he does not need to undertake the full sex offence programme. The work that does need undertaken can be completed by his social worker or Kibble staff.
