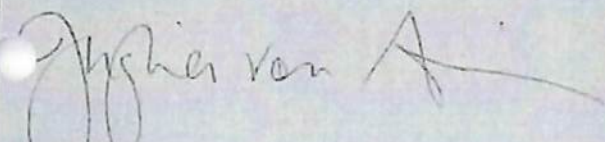

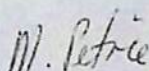

I told William we were going to see his dad and we were meeting him in the Wellgate Centre under the clock. William said he remembered, he asked what they would be doing. I suggested we could go to McDonalds. William was really chatty on way to meet his dad, about school, his friends, christmas, his mum, [redacted]. He asked when he would be seeing them and had his mum seen [redacted]. I told William workers were trying to arrange a time for him to see [redacted]. William and I said to Mr Tarbett William wanted to go to McDonalds - we left to go there. William asked if the little girl was coming with us. 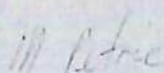
3.55 pm

I met [redacted] Carol and Pauline from the train, to take them to Fintry Child and Family Centre where contact visit was to take place. [redacted] looked well. [redacted] presented as having a good relationship with Carol and Pauline. [redacted] was keen to make conversation with me, about their journey here, school, Thornbrae, what he has been doing, he was keen to point out different places as we passed them to Carol and Pauline.

William was brought to visit by [redacted] both [redacted] and William were pleased to see each other. [redacted] immediately started to show off, take control with William copying him. They didn't want to use any of the games, toys provided, wanted to use the pre school age toys that were in the other room, jump, climb on equipment that had been moved to one end of the room. I gave them some of the mats to use but [redacted] and William weren't happy with this, continued to jump, climb on equipment, throw things about.

[redacted] was brought to visit by Margaret Leslie, all were pleased to see each other, [redacted] giving [redacted] and William hugs. William gave [redacted] and [redacted] school photograph of himself and an advent calendar. Boys immediately returned to behaving the way they were earlier encouraging [redacted] to join them. [redacted] did try to play with the games and encourage the boys to join her but to no avail. At times they all became very boisterous, [redacted] swearing, encouraging sexualised behaviour, especially with William.

The children did sit together around the table while having something to eat but didn't make any meaningful conversation with each other although I and [redacted] tried to instigate this, at times they were quite boisterous. Carol took some photographs of the children during the visit.

Even when saying goodbye to each other they still continued to be boisterous. [redacted] left with Margaret, Carol and Pauline to go to [redacted]. Once [redacted] had left William wanted to leave, wanted to his tea-time club, complaining he was late, wouldn't get in, blaming me for him not getting to his club. Once in my car William calmed down and he and [redacted] started to talk about what they have been doing and William going to his club and what he does there. William then asked [redacted] if she knew their mum was going to have a baby. [redacted] told William she did know and it was going to be a boy and he was going to be called [redacted]. William then thought his mum had had the baby. [redacted] told him she hadn't it will be born in February. William happily went into his club saying goodbye to [redacted].

[redacted] was really chatty on return journey to Crieff, she thought [redacted] and William were bad behaving the way they did, she spoke about how she liked living with [redacted] calling them mum and dad, but would like it if they lived nearer so she wouldn't have so far to travel.

[redacted] responded fondly to [redacted] calling her mum, asking where [redacted] was calling him dad. [redacted] was keen to chat to [redacted] about visit, school.

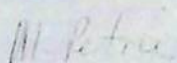

William presented as being pleased about the baby but didn't prolong the conversation. [redacted] wanted to go in my car with William to Burger King, they both chatted happily to each other. We all went into Burger King and sat together chatting mainly between William and [redacted]. Mr Tarbett and [redacted] instigated some conversation with William about what he has been doing but he wasn't very forthcoming. Mr Tarbett had game for William which needed batteries, he asked Lisa to go to Toys R Us for them. William asked if he could go. Mr Tarbett said he had to ask me which William did. I suggested we all go, which we did.

Time was spent looking at the toys which William enjoyed. Mr Tarbett asked William to think about what he would like for Christmas and we could come back here nearer Christmas to let him know. I suggested we could do this next visit to give Ms Tarbett time. All agreed. I arranged for us to meet at Burger King at 4pm next visit which is on Wednesday 18 November.

William collected his bags of goodies from Mr Tarbett's car, he was also given money from Mr Tarbett. William happily said goodbye to everyone.

I gave Mr Tarbett £1.60 for ^{4.10pm} ~~fare~~ for today's visit.

4.10pm - Visit ended.

William chatted happily to me in return journey looking forward to going to Toys R Us next visit with his dad, said he had enjoyed today's visit. William talked about his visit with his mum when she told him about her having a baby, also about his dad telling him this when they were walking together to the cars. William said I just laughed about it when my dad told me because I knew.

I returned William to [redacted] leaving dates of William, contact visits for Mr and Mrs [redacted]

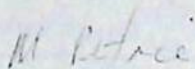
I met with Linda (mum) at Bruce Street CFC. Linda apologised for not meeting with Margaret Leslie, Social Worker and I, she had a doctor's appointment, she also had to sign on. Linda told me she had met her mum on her way to meet me, her mother told her Mr Tarbett knows she is pregnant. Linda said she is worried he will tell the children when he sees them next - [redacted] tomorrow, and he will get to William by going to the school or getting someone else to go there and tell him. Linda therefore felt she had to tell William today she is pregnant, she asked if I would help her to tell him. Linda also asked if I could phone Thornbrae to advise staff of this before Mr Tarbett visits Michael tomorrow. I told Linda I would speak to Margaret Leslie, Social Worker, about this and she would phone Thornbrae. Linda spoke of her concerns about the children, wanting them to be settled, how they will react to her being pregnant.

Linda and I collected William from his tea-time club. Both were pleased to see each other. We decided to go to McDonalds as weather was terrible. Linda and William chatted to each other about what William's been doing at school, home and with his friends. Once I felt it was appropriate we broached the subject of Linda being pregnant. William's response to this was "that's sweet". William then asked would it be a boy or girl, what would the name be. We talked a little about this also trying to reassure William his mum loved and cared for him. William changed the subject and visit continued to go well, we went to shops to get William sweets from his mum as she hadn't brought anything with her for William. Linda told William she hadn't had time to get him anything as she had been to her doctors and to a meeting. William enjoyed being able to choose what sweets he wanted, he also asked for a yo-yo, we weren't able to get one. Linda gave him money to buy one suggesting [redacted] would maybe know where to get one.

Linda and I returned William to his tea-time club. As we were leaving William became a little quiet, he happily said goodbye to us, going through to another room. Just as Linda and I were leaving the car park a worker came after us saying William was upset. Linda and I went back to see William, another worker was with him. William was crying, said he didn't want his mum to leave, he wanted to be with her. We talked with William, he eventually calmed down and left with us so we could return him to [redacted]. I advised [redacted] what had happened at to-day's contact. [redacted] thought William would be alright, pleased about the baby as he likes babies.

When we were leaving William again got upset. Linda also got upset once she was away from William. I returned Linda to central area, she said she was going to her mother's. Linda said she would phone the office tomorrow to find out how William was and if phone call had been made to Thornbrae.

I gave Linda £10.80 for fares for today's visit. I gave Linda date of next contact with William - 28/10/98 meeting at Bruce Street CFC at 4 pm.
