William wanted to take his ball.

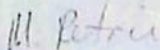
I told William it had been arranged for us to meet his dad at Burger King, we could then go on to a park if they want to do this. William was fine, chatty, looking forward to seeing his dad.

Mr Tarbett did not meet with us at Burger King or make any contact with me at the office to cancel.

William and I arrived early for visit. William continually looked for his dad, and asked if he would be coming. I told William his dad had spoken to Margaret Leslie on Monday when he was seeing [REDACTED] about wanting to change today's visit. Margaret Leslie told Mr Tarbett to telephone the office to do this. As Mr Tarbett had not telephoned to change arrangements it was presumed he wanted to come today at the arranged time. William continually looked and asked for his dad. We eventually went inside Burger King so William could have something to eat while waiting. William ate very little, all he seemed to want was to know if his dad would be coming.

William eventually said "my dad won't be coming, can we go to the park?" we left Burger King at 4.40pm to go to a park for remainder of visit. Unfortunately William was very sick on way to the park therefore we weren't able to go to the park.

I advised Mr [REDACTED] William had been sick, Mr Tarbett had not met with us and William had continually looked for him.

This was my last visit to William, due to my moving away from Dundee. William wanted to play pool, so we visited Kirkton Resource Centre, had a drink/biscuit, and sat in the pool room. William wanted to 'practice potting' the pool balls.

I talked with William about my leaving Dundee, he was unsure about where London is, but understood that it is further away than 'nanas' ([REDACTED] mum). William acknowledged that his next trip out will be with Ingrid, we listed the things that he likes to do, so he could remember to tell them to Ingrid: football, pool, Camperdown, Wildlife Park, Horse rides, McDonald's milkshakes or 'Merrymate bottles of juice'. I told William that I would be giving my red football to Ingrid, for them to play with when it is good weather.

We bought a Merrymate orange drink, on the way back to the [REDACTED]. On the way I told William about it now being Ingrid's job to look for a family for him, where he might be able to live for a long time.

At the [REDACTED] I gave William a present (a large format book "Things that go") and said Goodbye. William was pleased with the photographs in the book, and had started to debate with the other children what sort of car/lorry/bus they would drive when they are older.
