EDUCATION REVIEW REPORT

Amanda Golabek

Date of Birth: 12.11.79

Since her last Review on 6.7.93, Mandy has continued to attend the Education Unit at Ferintosh and has been in a group with three boys and one other girl. She is following a limited curriculum of Maths., English, Art, and Social & Vocational Studies. Her attitude to her academic work is generally positive. She is well able to organise her work and to concentrate and complete it with minimal supervision from staff. In Maths., Mandy is working through KMP cards, Level 2, taking responsibility for making her own work and organising future work cards. In English, Mandy has completed Headway English Books 4 & 5 and is now using Day to Day English Book 1.

In Social & Vocational Studies, Mandy is working with Real Life Reading Skills. Mandy enjoys Art & Craft sessions. She has tried a variety of activities including scraper board, poster making, painting and collage.

Occasionally, Mandy has been upset about events outwith the Education Unit and has become withdrawn and unco-operative. This type of behaviour, so apparent when she first came to Ferintosh and generally occurring when Mandy was coping with disappointment of some kind, is now seldom seen.

Mandy appears more able to work through her feelings and the moods do not appear so intense or so long drawn out. On one occasion, when disappointed about not being allowed to visit Alness, she disappeared from school. It was felt that she was making her own way to Alness and staff set off to look for her. However, after 20 minutes, she returned on her own, having spent the time wandering in the grounds. This was seen by staff as Mandy showing a more mature attitude in coping with her feelings.

At times, Mandy has become involved in silliness and name-calling within the group but, generally, she is amenable and co-operative. She has plenty of ideas on how to spend any spare time and quickly becomes engrossed in what she is doing.

She has been saying, consistently, since before her last Review, that she wishes to return to Alness Academy. If she returned to school now, she would be in a 3rd year class at the beginning of the Standard Grade Course.

Her positive attitude to academic work and the substantial changes we have seen in her general attitude to her life situation, appear to indicate that Mandy is ready to make a success of a placement at mainstream school.

This letter is to give you written confirmation of the decisions taken at the Child In Care review meeting held on 15th September 1993 regarding your daughter **Mandy**.

The decisions taken were as follows:

1. Mandy's placement at Ferintosh will continue. A foster placement for the future is not ruled out but is not being looked for at present.
2. Peter Jamieson and Cath Neil are to try to negotiate a place for Mandy at Alness Academy or if that fails at another mainstream school.
3. Information about Mandy's recent involvement in alleged offences has been forwarded to the Reporter and will be dealt with in due course.
4. Access - Grace Welsh is to see Wendy Golabek, Mandy step mother. Grace hopes to make clear arrangements for Mandy to visit her family at agreed times. Mandy's sister Tina can visit her at Ferintosh as often as she likes.
5. A full medical on Mandy was done in May 1993. Her skin complaint is clearing up.
6. Review in early December.

I have to inform you of your right to appeal the decisions of this review. Any such appeal should be addressed to John Dunlop, Principal Officer (Care Management), Dingwall. REVIEW REPORT

Amanda Golabek

Date of Birth: 12.11.79

Conclusion of Assessment Team Meeting/Children's Hearing:

After a recommendation made at Amanda's A.T.M. it was a Panel decision that Amanda's supervision requirement be transferred to Ferintosh. This requirement was made on 10th. May 1993 and on 26th. May Amanda moved to the medium term unit at Ferintosh.

Observed Behaviour:

Mandy transferred to the medium term unit on the evening of an organised walking and cycling trip and very easily slotted into a fairly well established group of children. This was aided somewhat perhaps by the fact that Mandy was already well acquainted with one of the older girls in the group. Mandy coped well with this trip and it served well as an introduction to staff, other children and also to the types of activity that would be available to her, particularly in the forthcoming holidays.

Mandy's behaviour within the unit has been of a generally acceptable standard and she could not be described as a "management problem", although she can be lazy when it comes to doing chores and is not particularly quick to get out of bed in the morning. Mandy is a girl of very varying moods and although her daily notes often describe her as "quiet and sullen", she is also capable of being quite chirpy and chatty although this is more likely within a smaller group.

Relationship With Peers:

Mandy settled well into the group and at first did not seem to be either threatened by them or threatening towards them but her position in the group soon strengthened and of late she has shown one or two signs of being capable of minor verbal bullying. She seems reasonably well liked by the group and the above only seems to occur when she is on a low.

Relationship With Adults:

Amanda is capable of communicating well with adults although likes to do so on her own terms and is far less communicative when requests are made for her to do something or if permission is refused to do something she wants. She also seems to perceive her keyworker/key senior as different from the other staff and her attitude is of a higher standard when these staff are on duty.

Visits to Alness:

Mandy has very strong feelings about Alness and has been on several visits (one without permission) to see her sister and friends there.

5th. June

Mandy's first visit to Alness (some time spent at Coulpark) - returned on time.

12th. June

Went to Alness for evening visit and returned on time.

13th. June

Refused permission to go to Alness. Mandy left the building without permission and headed to Alness. She was collected from police station on 15th. June and permission for following weekend's visit was withdrawn.

26th. June

Visit to Alness. Although she did not check in with staff as requested, she did go to Coulpark to report having lost her bus fare. She was collected from Coulpark.

Conclusion:

We would hope to structure Amanda's life over the coming months, to the point where we would be able to negotiate her return to mainstream education.

This would have to be achieved before an alternative living base could be identified.

The kind of things you should complain about are:-

- * You've been slapped, shaken or beaten.
- * You've not been given enough privacy, for example in the bathroom or bedroom.
- * Someone has made suggestions to you which you feel aren't right.
- * Someone has shown you rude pictures or books.
- * Someone has touched (or asked to touch) parts of your body in a way you feel isn't right.
- * Something you own was taken away and not given back.
- * You've been given no pocket money.
- * You were refused food as a punishment.
- * You weren't allowed to see your parents when it had already been agreed.
- * You didn't get the clothes you needed.
- * You were made to wear your nightclothes during the day as a punishment.
- * You were given medicine or tablets when you weren't ill.

20. Summary of Discussion

Written reports were provided by Martin Hill and Marge Slavin (see attached). The previous review on 14.01.93 had highlighted the many problems Mandy was experiencing. These were showing up in her school behaviour, in the friends she was going around with, and the fact that she was not accepting reasonable limits set down by her foster parents, the Frasers. Following that review a discussion had taken place between Mandy, her foster parents and the workers involved. Mandy and the Frasers had worked out some kind of compromise and had agreed to try and work together. There had then taken place a meeting at the school when it was agreed that Mandy would be accepted back into the school so long as she co-operated with their expectations. For the next three days everything seemed to go alright with Mandy at school. On the Friday Mandy had been worried about a friend and had gone out of school without permission. This seems to have led to a downward spiral in Mandy responding to requirements at school. Mr and Mrs Fraser began to despair that Mandy was simply not responding to anything they asked. Mandy's admission to Ferintosh was the response to an emergency situation as Mandy was seen to be putting herself at risk by being out at night, her carers not knowing where she was. An informal arrangement had been made for Mandy to spend 21 days at Coulpark for assessment purposes. The Childrens Hearing however made a Supervision Order with a Condition of Residence at Coulpark.

21. Decisions and Recommendations (include access, parental rights, custodianship, adoption, discharge from Care)

1. Mandy's placement at Coulpark will continue.
2. In the event of a crisis in Mandy's behaviour Martin will negotiate a place if at all possible at Ferintosh.
3. In the event of a major crisis with Mandy's behaviour putting her at risk, a further referral to the Childrens Panel will be necessary.
4. Contact:- Former Foster Family (Fraser's) - Mandy can contact and visit them if she wishes.
Father & Sister - Informal contact will continue as before.
Mother - Mandy to discuss her wishes in this respect with staff.
5. Martin to present report to Permanency Advisory Group at end of March.
6. Change of Social Worker ruled out for time being as not in Mandy's interests.
7. Martin to write to Mrs Connell advising her no further information will be sent unless she requests it.
8. Review in April following school holidays.

20. Summary Of Discussion (Continued)

The focus of work for Mandy at Coulpark is to provide her with very clear boundaries. The meeting was concerned that should Mandy's very worrying behaviour of staying out all night and failing to attend school continue, then Coulpark would not be providing the right sort of care for her. It was agreed that so long as Mandy was not absconding and so long as she had a regular pattern of attending at school 100% then she could remain at Coulpark. It was noted that Mandy has an eczema condition on her feet and this is why she tends to skip P.E. Mandy agreed that she would seek advice from her doctor and always provide a proper excuse provided by the doctor or Coulpark if she needed to miss a lesson.

It was noted that the Fraser family had felt a certain amount of anger towards the Social Work Department, not towards Mandy. Because of their feelings there is no possibility that Mandy could return to the Fraser family in the near future. In the meantime so long as Mandy co-operated with expectations she would remain at Coulpark. In the longer term staff at Coulpark would help Mandy to work on why her placement with the Frasers had gone wrong and what is behind her behaviour and her absconsions.

Regarding Parental Rights for Mandy, Martin's report is to be presented to the Permanency Advisory Group at end of March.

Mandy is now placed closer to the Alness Social Work Office. A discussion took place about transferring the Social Work Management of Mandy's case from Dingwall to Alness. The meeting agreed that Mandy has had many changes recently and it is not in her interests to have a change of Social Worker at this time. This will be explored at the next review.

Mandy raised the concern from reading Martin's report that her mother's address had appeared. She related that Tina had been very distressed to learn this. The girl's mother feels so strongly she does not want contact from Social Work that Tina worries that all contact will now cease. Martin Hill to write to Mrs Connell reassuring her that she will not be sent further information about Mandy but this will be provided should she request it.

1. Mandy's placement with the Frasers seems permanent.
2. Mandy's stealing and other behaviours are giving cause for grave concern. Discussion and follow-up with Mandy will take place regarding the consequences of her behaviour and her need to take responsibility. Val, Martin and Mary Fraser to deal with this. Refer to girls' group if one becomes available.
3. Martin is obliged to refer recent events to the Reporter but recommendation will be that no Panel be requested at present. The Social Work plan is to support Mandy's placement with the Fraser family.
4. Martin will liaise with school over any difficulties with Mandy leaving the Frasers to concentrate on home issues.
5. Martin will continue to pursue the Parental Rights application in order to provide Mandy with the security of a permanent placement. (Martin will need time allocated to do the report).
6. Access. This is left up to Mandy's discretion and she visits her sister at her father's house quite regularly. Val Dunford is to try and find out the contact address for Mandy's mum.
7. Review in six months.

10. Dates and nature of Social Worker's contact with Child since previous Review/Reception into Care

11. Date and nature of Social Worker's contact with Family since previous Review/Reception into Care

There has been no contact with either of Mandy's parents or siblings since the last Review. I have traced Mandy's mother's address in Edinburgh via the Social Work Department there, as have others.

12. Present situation with Family since Reception into Care/Last Review (full consideration to be given to all relatives, extended family - substantiate if Care of Child cannot be assumed by them)

There has been no contact from Mandy with either of her parents.

13. Present situation of Child since Reception into Care/Last Review (include schooling, health, behaviour, religious upbringing, etc.)

Since the last Review the problems with Mandy within the foster home and school have continued. During this period I have been away from the office for three weeks and whilst I was away the situation with the foster parents was felt to be untenable as Mandy was putting herself constantly at risk by staying away from the foster home. It was felt that given the circumstances Mandy would need to be placed in Residential Care. Mandy was consequently moved to Ferintosh under Section 44 (6) where she slept on the floor for a few nights. Arrangements were made prior to my returning to work that she should be transferred to Coulpark. At an emergency Children's Hearing held on 9th February, 1993, a three week assessment at Coulpark was asked for but the Panel made a Condition of Residence at Coulpark. After the last Review I negotiated with the school for Mandy's return, but this did not work and Mandy was again excluded.

Further attempts by Coulpark to reintegrate her to Alness Academy is being made to-day. Initially things went very badly for Mandy at Coulpark as Mandy was constantly absconding. However, since Friday 19th February, 1993 until the time of writing (24.2.93), Mandy has shown capable of more responsibility and has not put herself at risk but has conformed to what should be expected of her. Given Mandy's behaviour at Coulpark up until last Friday we would have had to look at an alternative more structured placement for Mandy, and this again may become necessary if Mandy puts herself at so much risk again.

Healthwise Mandy is in good health. Following the last Review I contacted the Reporter to the Children's Panel who agreed that we need not at that stage refer to the Children's Panel.

BACKGROUND

Mandy lived with foster parents, Mr and Mrs Fraser, Alness since November 1991. This placement has recently broken down due to difficulties which arose from Mandy's refusal to come home at night at a reasonable hour. On occasions she stayed away all night and on one occasion was gone for three nights.

On 3 February Mandy did not return home from school. She was found by police around midnight. Permission was given by Director of Social Work under Section 44 (6) of Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968 to move Mandy to Ferintosh House on an emergency basis.

Children's Panel on Monday, 8 February recommended that Mandy be placed in Coulpark under Section 44 (1)(b) Social Work (Scotland) Act 1968.

BEHAVIOUR

Since her admission to Coulpark, Mandy has refused to abide by rules regarding when she goes out and returns home. On being counselled for going out without permission she chose to go out again anyway. Although her repeated absconding has been reported to the police Mandy usually returns of her own free will. Since coming to Coulpark she has been reported missing on six occasions:

Thursday, 11 February	Left school in the morning. Returned to Coulpark by the police at 11.30 pm on 12 February.
Sunday, 14 February	Allowed out for 1 hour at 3.30 pm. Did not return. Was seen outside the building about 9.45 pm by another resident who spent over an hour persuading her to come in. (10.55 pm)
Monday, 15 February	Walked out at 6.45 pm when she was refused pocket money. Found in bed in the morning having entered the centre

avoiding staff.

Tuesday, 16 February	Left the building without permission at 9.30 am having returned 10.20 pm.
Wednesday, 17 February	Left the building without permission at 1.30 pm having returned at 11.30 pm.
Thursday, 18 February	Left the building without permission at 11.00 am having returned at 11.00 pm.
Friday, 19 February	Left the building without permission at 2.15 pm. Staff went out looking for her and brought her back at 2.45 pm.

Following this last incident Mandy was counselled by Mr Erskine about her behaviour and the risk she is putting herself in, since then she has conformed to the rules given to her regarding time keeping and asking permission to go out etc.

RELATIONSHIP WITH ADULTS AND STAFF

Mandy has difficulty discussing anything with members of staff. She puts her head down and lets her hair fall over her face when talked to and seems to switch off, either not listening to what is being said, or choosing to hear only what she wants to. She tries to manipulate getting her own way by asking for something and if this is refused claiming that another member of staff has said otherwise. When confronted with issues such as this she deals with it by running away. For example on Monday, 15 instant she asked me for pocket money. I said I would have to check with staff what the situation was first. Shortly afterwards she asked another member of staff for pocket money. This was refused and she claimed that I had said she could have some. The member of staff spoke to me about this and we then spoke to Mandy pointing out that this type of behaviour was unacceptable. It was later discovered that she had left the building without permission. Following repeated absconding from Coulpark, Mandy was counselled about the risk she was putting herself in and the possible outcome if she continued to behave in this way. Since then Mandy has conformed to the rules imposed on her ie not going out without permission, returning at an agreed time and by being in the building no later than 9.30 pm at weekends and 9.00 pm during the week. She appears to have accepted these rules and is given positive encouragement in return, from the staff. Interaction with staff is minimal but pleasant.

RELATIONSHIP WITH PEERS/OTHER RESIDENTS

Mandy has maintained contact with her friends in the community. She goes out with them regularly and they visit her in Coulpark, She appears to get on alright with the other residents, all of whom she had met before during brief stays at Coulpark. She tends to gravitate towards residents she feels will condone and encourage her own behaviour.

HEALTH & HYGIENE

Mandy is in good health although she suffers from eczema on both feet and a dry flaky scalp. She has medication for both conditions. She takes good care of her appearance and does her own laundry with just a little prompting from staff. She shares a bedroom with another girl and both need to be reminded to tidy their room. Her personal hygiene is good.

EDUCATION

Mandy attends Alness Academy. On 12 January she was excluded from school for two weeks for leaving the class and the school building at will, for refusing to complete detention given to her, for refusing to work in class and for refusing instructions from staff. She returned to school on 26 January. She ran away on 3 February and was placed in Ferintosh on an emergency basis. She did not attend school during this time. After she came to Coulpark she was re-instated at Alness Academy on 11 February on condition that she attend all classes and comply with instructions given to her by staff. Shortly afterwards Mandy left the school building and as a result has, again, been formally excluded until such time as she is prepared to attend regularly and comply with school rules and regulations. At a meeting with Mandy, a member of staff and Mr Meikle (headmaster) held at 11.00 am Wednesday 24, at the school it was agreed that Mandy could return to school on the basis that she accepted the conditions agreed.

CONCLUSION

In the early part of the placement Mandy caused considerable concern to her carers. Her constant absence, inappropriate company and unwillingness to communicate gave concern as to how we could keep her safe.

It appears now that Mandy is making some commitment to her placement, accepting instruction and showing a willingness to return to school.

Coulpark believes we have a part to play in offering Mandy support and would wish to continue working with her until such time as she is more settled and better able to discuss her wishes for her future.

at some point decide they cannot continue to offer Mandy a place. It was noted that the Bridgend unit is thought to be not operating at present and when it does it is part-time and temporary. It was explained to Mandy that in the event of extreme difficulties at school this can provide for grounds for a referral to the Childrens Hearing and if the problems were severe enough the Panel may consider recommending placement at Residential School. The Review meeting did not feel this was an option that they would be recommending at present. The meeting believed that Mandy needed to consider carefully the consequences of her behaviour and for her to make a determined effort to do what was required at school as this did not seem unreasonable.

The meeting noted that a Police Report on Mandy's activities over the Christmas holidays may be passed to the Reporter of the Childrens Panel. The Reporter would then seek comments from Martin Hill as to whether he felt a Hearing was needed or not.

One positive in the whole situation is that Mandy is able to communicate well with Mary Fraser and it is hoped that she has been able to share all her worries and concerns with Mary. The Review felt it would be very useful for Mandy if she could attend a social skills group with girls her own age. None was available at present so far as anyone was aware. Mandy does not have good skills in relating to her peers, and tends to buy their friendship. When Mandy steals money she shares it with her friends and possibly when Mandy stays out very late this also is to impress her friends who are somewhat older.

A worrying incident had occurred at school recently. An assault had been made on a young person at school. Mandy had been with a group of young people who had egged her on to a fight and she had been the one to make the assault. Because of concerns about bullying in school, the incident was quite rightly taken seriously. The matter was referred to Mrs Burns, the Reporter for the Childrens Panel. It has been decided that no further action will be taken on this matter. However there were additional problems at school for Mandy. She has become very unresponsive to teachers and has been failing to hand in pieces of work. She has not been complying with requirements for dealing with her attendance sheet. She has been late on 19 occasions so far. Mandy is close to a three day expulsion from school. After some discussion it was observed that until now Mandy appeared to fail to see the consequences of her actions. She has always been rather good at telling lies plausibly and has also had a habit of stealing things. Due to the recent events outlined above, Mandy has been able to see clearly that her actions in school may lead eventually to her having to change schools, and also that there is a limit to how much worry the Frasers can take. It was thought by the meeting that perhaps Mandy was beginning to see what a mess she was getting herself into. Mandy indicated that this was the case. The meeting gave support for the Frasers remaining very firm with their sanctions when Mandy misbehaves. It was acknowledged that some sort of strategy would be needed for people to help and guide Mandy through this troubled period.

I have continued visiting Mandy at her foster home to support and assist her as required.

I wrote to Mr. Golabeck some months ago but have received no contact from him. I have written to Mandy's brothers and received no contact from them. At the time of writing I have not been able to make contact with Mrs. Connell but hope to have done so before the Review.

12. Present situation with Family since Reception into Care/Last Review (full consideration to be given to all relatives, extended family - substantiate if Care of Child cannot be assumed by them)

Mr. Golabeck continues not to have any contact with this Department. Mrs. Connell remains in Edinburgh with . Mrs. Connell has rung Mandy on occasion but apart from this there has been no formal contact. There has, and is, regular contact between Mandy and her elder sister, Tina, who lives with Mr. Golabeck.

13. Present situation of Child since Reception into Care/Last Review (include schooling, health, behaviour, religious upbringing, etc.)

Mandy has now been with the Fraser family for over a year, on this her second placement with them. Whilst Mandy gets on well with everyone in the family, her behaviour leaves a great deal to be desired. Mandy has been staying out late, going through the window when kept in, on one occasion staying out all night, whilst an incident of assault against another girl was dealt with under the terms of the Supervision Order.

School continues to be problematic for Mandy. She has truanted on occasion and needs to take a more responsible attitude. Mandy spends her evenings when not at home hanging out with a group of friends who are much older than her. Their behaviour is not conducive to Mandy's good behaviour. Mandy is not a very talkative person and is generally monosyllabic at best.

Healthwise Mandy is in generally good health. I have requested that a medical be undertaken and sent the appropriate letters off some months ago, but at the time of writing this is still outstanding.

I have not been able to complete the Parental Rights procedures yet but hope to do so either before Christmas or at the latest in January, 1993.

14. Contact between Parents and Child (how have access arrangements operated; what requires changing)

Mandy speaks to her father when she sees him in Alness, but there is no other contact. Contact between Mandy and her mother is by telephone.

15. Areas of Concern (if any)

I have continued visiting Mandy at her foster home to support and assist her as required. Boarding Out visits have been made.

11. Dates and nature of Social Worker's contact with family since previous Review/Reception into Care:

Mr. Golabeck has maintained silence and has not been in contact with this Department, despite previous requests. Mrs. Connell remains in Edinburgh and there has been no contact with her either.

12. Present situation with Family since Reception into Care/Last Review (full consideration to be given to all relatives, extended family - substantiate if Care of Child cannot be assumed by them)

Mr. Golabeck continues not to have any contact with this Department at his own instigation. Both natural parents are aware of the plans to place Mandy with an alternative family, and neither parent has opposed this in any way. Neither parent is, or has been, willing to sustain contact with Mandy.

13. Present situation of Child since Reception into Care/Last Review (include schooling, health, behaviour, religious upbringing, etc.)

At the last Review the decision was formalised that Mandy should move to stay on a long term basis with Mr. and Mrs. Fraser. This move was agreed by the Children's Panel at the Hearing in October. Mandy has continued to have spasmodic contact with Patti Davis and this can continue if Mandy wishes to visit Mrs. Davis's and Elizabeth's home which is not very far from Mandy's home.

Not surprisingly, given the length of time Mandy has known Mr. and Mrs. Fraser and their family, Mandy settled in quickly and has firmly established herself as part of that family. The foster parents are very capable and get on with their lives without requesting assistance from Social Workers.

Mandy attends Alness Academy where she is doing quite well. However, there was a period when she stayed off school for a week with another girl, but this was some time ago and there has been no problem in this area since.

Mandy's relationship with her natural family (her father and sister still live in Alness) has improved, and Mandy now "hangs out" with her sister Tina in Alness. Her natural father now acknowledges her when he sees her on the street and on one occasion did give her some money. Mandy's brother Lee has also recently visited the area and Mandy saw him also. As far as I am aware, Mrs. Connell still lives in Edinburgh with _____ and I have cautioned Mandy that she must not have unsupervised contact with her mother should she arrive in this area, as there would be concern about any contact _____ may have.

I did make contact with Dr. _____ concerning the problems Mandy was

having with her toe, and it transpired that appointments have been made but not kept. I understand the matter is now resolved and that Mandy remains in all respects in good health.

As Mandy is so settled and appears to be happy at Mr. and Mrs. Fraser's, I could not see Dr. Kay Brightley having anything she could realistically offer Mandy, and it was agreed that it was no longer necessary for Mandy to see her.

The Matching Panel meeting held on 24.10.91 agreed that Mandy should be placed with Mr. and Mrs. Fraser.

As regards Parental Rights, Mandy will have been in care for three years shortly, and it would seem appropriate now to go for Parental Rights.

20. Summary of Discussion:

Lesley Martin read out the decisions of the last review, and asked for comment on them.

Martin Hill said that he had arranged for Mandy to see Dr Brightley, but the appointment did not go ahead, as it was felt that Mandy had moved on, and the contact was not appropriate.

Mandy has not seen Patti Davis often, and the last time was at Christmas. Mandy sometimes sees (Patti's foster daughter) at the swingpark. Jenny Tidey felt quite sad that there was so little contact between Mandy and Patti Davis. Martin Hill said that it was difficult to explain the reasons, but it appeared to be disappointment on Patti's part, and that she is concerned about the relationship between Mandy - ie that Mandy would be a bad influence on

Martin Hill said that the Children's Hearing sanctioning Mandy's move to Mr and Mrs Fraser went fine, and that a formal agreement was made at the Matching Panel.

Mandy will have been in care for three years in July, and Parental Rights will be initiated at that stage.

Mrs Fraser said that things at home are going fine, and Mandy is getting on well with (Mrs Fraser's daughter). There had been no problems until Mandy started skipping school.

Mrs Lowe said that Mandy is a super girl, and that she is very fond of her. In November Mandy had a few days off school truanting, but this had been sorted out. Until March things had been going well. However, in March Mandy skipped two Monday mornings off school, and this has been put down to the fact that she does not like PE, and wanted to miss the class. Mandy

has also had a few other days off school through truancy. Mrs Lowe's main concern for Mandy is the three girls she is "hanging about" with, and the influence they are having on her. Mandy missed detention yesterday, and Mrs Lowe feels that it was because of these girls. One of these girls is Mandy's sister, and this adds to the problems.

Lesley Martin asked what Mandy did in the evenings. Mrs Fraser said that Mandy used to have other friends, but at Easter she became involved with and this has totally changed her personality - she has become cocky and smart.

Val Dunford said that Mr and Mrs Fraser were planning taking the family to EuroDisney in late June, and permission and passport would be needed for Mandy. Mrs Tidey said that it would need both the Director's and one of Mandy's parents permission. However, the Director can over-rule if no parental permission is obtained. Martin Hill said that he had previously sent letters to Ms Connel (Mandy's mother) in Edinburgh, but had received no response. Mandy said that that address was her brother's address and not her mother's. Attempts should be made to find out Ms Connel's address. Martin Hill is to approach Mandy's father, Mr Golabek, to try to obtain permission. Martin Hill is also to obtain Mandy's birth certificate. Mrs Fraser will get passport photos taken for Mandy.

A full medical examination needs to be done on Mandy.

Mrs Fraser asked about contact between Mandy and her family. Martin Hill said that he had spoken to Mandy about her family, and the need to protect herself from (Ms Connel's cohabitee). It was felt that ideally access should be arranged through Martin Hill, but Mrs Fraser pointed out that Brian and Lee have turned up at her house over weekends asking to see Mandy. It was felt that as long as is not around during these visits then Mandy could go out with Brian or Lee.

Mandy has continued to do well with Mrs. Davis, although the placement is not without its minor problems. However, Mandy gets on well with Mrs. Davis and , who is also fostered at the same address.

Mandy is now attending Alness Academy, which her sister Tina also attends. Whilst Mandy appears to be settling in at school, there are problems with her being in Alness and close to her natural family. Although fairly recenty Mandy's father walked past her and ignored her, a recent conversation between Mandy and her sister Tina has led Mandy to be unsettled as she feels there is a possibility she could return to stay with her father.

Recently Mrs. Davis went to Poland for a holiday which had been known about at the time of Mandy's placement with her. Mandy spent this period of three weeks with a family at Castletown near Thurso. Mandy appeared to enjoy this as a holiday but was very pleased to return to Mrs. Davis' home.

Healthwise Mandy continues to be in good health. A referral has been made to Dr. Brightley but there is a considerable waiting list.

20. **Summary of Discussion:**

In discussing the recommendations of the previous Review, it was noted that Mandy has not yet seen Dr Brightley, as there is a long waiting list. Mandy had not been informed about the family in Fortrose, as after investigation it was not felt that they were suitable to foster her.

Martin Hill said that neither Mrs Connell or Mr Golabek have any contact at all with Mandy. Mandy is now attending Alness Academy, and her favourite subjects there are Maths and Science. When Mrs Davis went to Poland on holiday recently, Mandy went to stay with a family in Caithness, which she enjoyed for a holiday stay.

John Dunlop pointed out that Mandy likes living in the Alness area, and the drawback to this is that her father lives there, which causes Mandy to be upset when she sees him. However, Mandy has said that she would rather stay in the area, even with the problems, than have to move away and make new friends, etc.

Mrs Fraser and Mandy left the Review. Mrs Davis said that initially Mandy had come to stay with her only for a few weeks, and the intention had always been that she would move on. The placement has gone well, and she feels that Mandy wants to remain in the Alness area.

Mandy is physically very slow at times, and is a dreamer. Mrs Davis felt that it may be beneficial to Mandy to see a Psychiatrist, as at times she sits as if in a dream or "switched off", particularly if she is questioned about something which is painful for her to talk about. Mrs Davis said that Mandy will then suddenly smile, and she will be fine again. Val Dunford said that Mandy has behaved like this at previous foster parents.

Mr Dunlop said that Mandy feels that Mrs Davis has become a very important

person in her life, as has , and that Mandy has a great liking for them both.

Mrs Davis said that she would be very willing to have Mandy to stay with her, but felt that Mandy has always wanted to be with the Fraser's, and that her heart has always been there. Her only worry is that Mrs Fraser's daughter is very close in age to Mandy, and this could cause problems. She said that she loves Mandy, and will miss her when she goes. However, Mandy will always be welcome to visit.

Mandy is still waiting for an appointment for the hospital in connection with her ingrowing toenail. Her toe is very sore, and Mandy has been attending her G.P. every fortnight since June, as it had gone septic. It was decided that Martin Hill would contact Dr to see if he could speed things up. Mandy has had her eyes tested at the Opticians, and he confirmed that she had perfect eyesight. It was felt that the problems experienced previously by Mandy could have been caused by the pressure/stress that Mandy was under. Dr carried out Mandy's medical examination, and found Mandy's blood pressure to be slightly raised. He felt that this could have been because of stress of the medical examination.

Mrs Fraser then joined the meeting and Mrs Davis left. Mr Dunlop said to Mrs Fraser that he was very pleased when he heard that she wished to have Mandy back to stay with the family. Mrs Fraser said that she had missed Mandy when she went to stay with the MacDonald's, and especially when she went to Mrs Davis', because her daughter lives nearby, and she kept bumping into Mandy. She said that the whole family would be delighted to have Mandy back.

Mrs Dunford said that the small age difference between Mandy and (Mrs Fraser's daughter) has always been concerning. Mrs Fraser said that has missed Mandy, and they have talked about Mandy coming back to stay, but that this time it would be until she was eighteen or older.

Val Dunford said that Mr and Mrs Fraser are now approved as Community Carers on a long-term basis. Jenny Tidey said that the case will need to go to the Matching Panel on 24.10.1991, so that the match between Mandy and the Fraser's can be approved.

Mr Dunlop said that Mandy had said that she was very fond of Mrs Davis, but that she had always wanted to be with Mr and Mrs Fraser. Mrs Fraser said that there will be no problem with Mandy seeing Mrs Davis.

When everybody had rejoined the meeting the following decisions were made:-

21. Decisions and Recommendations:

1. Mandy to move to live with Mr and Mrs Fraser on a long-term basis. Mandy is going on holiday to Alton Towers with Mrs Davis next week, and after this she will be able to spend some time with the Fraser's.
2. Children's Hearing to be called, hopefully at the end of October, to sanction this move.
3. A Matching Panel is to be held on 24.10.1991, and Martin Hill to present a supplement to his Form E. Val Dunford also to present report.
4. Martin Hill to talk to Legal Section about the Department getting Parental Rights for Mandy.
5. Patti Davis has done a great deal for Mandy, and given the bond between them, Patti Davis to continue as an "auntie" type figure.
6. Social Work Department to speak to Dr Brightley about her seeing Mandy, to help her to speak about her feelings regarding her parents, the past etc.
