

9.6.81 Rev. James Currie was informed of the events of the camp at Arran, as was Mr McChellish of 121 George Street (Mr F. Gibson had not been available). Mr Lindsay and Mr Ure were questioned regarding the camp by Mr Munro in the company of Mr Walker and Mr Stanger (deputy heads). There had been little in the way of organised activities, no regular checks had been made on the boys and the whole week had been unbelievably lax. The final week-end had been disastrous with boys drinking and involved in crime. Mr Lindsay and Mr Ure admitted to having been drinking themselves. Mr James Maguire accompanied by Mr Law from the Committee on Social Responsibility came to Gairland in the afternoon and discussed the matter with the headmaster and deputies. Mr Ure and Mr Lindsay were suspended on full pay without prejudice pending information being sent to 121 and a disciplinary hearing being convened.
