She told me that she had only used two out of the last 5 days, which represents an improvement from her previous reported use. Ashley also tells that she continues to be sick and that her Social Worker is Lynn Dickson.

Summary and Recommendations

1. Jackie Brookes and I had a long discussion with Ashley about her current methadone use. I do not currently think that Ashley is taking her whole dose and as mentioned above we have it on reasonably good authority that Ashley is selling her 45mgs take away dose. After considering things I think there is less risk to Ashley and the baby in decreasing the dose that giving her her entire dose supervised in these circumstances. We have therefore compromised, and we will increase Ashley's dose to 65mgs supervised daily.
2. It is also noticeable that Ashley's mood is low. Today it was necessary to sort out her methadone but after the birth I think she needs a full psychiatric appointment, to look at her mood again in view of the fact that she had postnatal depression after the birth of Regan.
3. I note that Ashley is working with Lynn Dickson and a large Care Package is now being put in place with Social Work and Aberlour. I think that Ashley will struggle with another child, and certainly she does not give the impression of coping well with the two she has at the current time.

JS reported AY had good parenting skills and Reagan was a bright little boy. AY said she read to him a lot.

Concern was expressed that AY drug use was more than occasional. If there were any concerns regarding wellbeing of Reagan and the baby then a case conference would be held.

SD said if AY's parents were worried they would be in contact with him for assistance.

AC explained about new project – Aberlour Trust, work with families with drug issues. Intensive support for user and children. This would be another safeguard
