Important classification note: the review distinguishes direct evidence from concerns and impact. Ambiguous references to resident conflict, aggression or distress are not labelled as abuse unless the record describes an abusive act. Redacted names are not reconstructed.

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Executive findings

- **Identity:** Records use Claire Lorraine Forbes, Claire L. Forbes and Claire Forbes. Date of birth is consistently 18 December 1975 in the principal records. Some later correspondence spells the forename “Clare”; this appears to be a spelling variation/clerical issue, not evidence of a former name. No former surname for Claire was identified.
- **Confirmed care:** Bon-Accord Children's Home is directly evidenced. Formal records state admission on 16 August 1990 for residential assessment under Section 44(1)(b). The records are on Grampian Regional Council Social Work Department letterhead. The supplied material does not expressly identify a separate funding body.
- **Leave/discharge:** Home leave progressed from overnight stays to weekends. A January 1991 panel report says she had been home on leave since 7 November 1990 with only two overnight returns. A closure summary says she was home on trial successfully from 22 November 1990. The Children's Hearing discharged the order on 10 January 1991 and the file was transferred for voluntary support.
- **Other residential settings:** Clinterty College is described as a residential horse-management course beginning August 1991 and ending when Claire left in December 1991; it is not described as a care placement. Airyhall is described in 1992 as proposed supported accommodation / a six-week assessment offer. The supplied records do not clearly prove that Claire actually took up residence at Airyhall.
- **Direct physical abuse:** No direct description of Claire being hit, beaten, kicked, restrained or otherwise physically assaulted by Bon-Accord staff or residents was located. “Older girls' aggression” and difficult resident-group circumstances are concerns but do not describe a specific assault. A later 1991 record says Claire slipped when pushed by a boyfriend while “fooling around”; this is outside the Bon-Accord placement and is not characterised in the record as abuse.
- **Direct sexual abuse:** No direct sexual-abuse allegation or sexualised incident was identified in the three supplied segments.
- **Most significant care-setting concern:** During Bon-Accord residence, records refer to stress and anger, attachment to a male resident, older girls' aggression, an unsettled group, Claire saying she did not want to be at Bon-Accord, walking out and sniffing aerosol, being found unconscious, hospital assessment, feeling “really bad” in and around a resident, and being scared to tell her mother about “the events”. These entries are relevant as contemporaneous safeguarding/disclosure and impact evidence, but the underlying resident incident is redacted/unspecified.
- **Institutional response:** The documents show Bon-Accord/social-work awareness, medical assessment, family meetings, follow-up discussion and review. On the records supplied, there is no clear evidence that a specific abuse allegation was knowingly ignored. Separate education records criticise delay and poor inter-agency communication in responding to Claire's welfare/truancy case; this is a system concern, not proof that an abuse complaint was ignored.
- **Impact:** Records describe depression/anger during a difficult Bon-Accord period, anxieties, “moodies”, later serious unease, emotional vulnerability, lack of confidence and insecurity, relationship distress, homelessness risk and need for adult support.
- **Substance/coping evidence:** Aerosol/gas sniffing during care resulted in unconsciousness and hospital/casualty checking. In February 1991, after discharge, school records describe amyl-nitrate sniffing as a sign of “serious unease”. Alcohol-related incidents are recorded in June 1991. The records do not establish that later substance use was caused by abuse.
- **Contradictions/positive records:** The file also repeatedly says Claire settled, managed well, made rapid progress, was physically fine after the aerosol incident, and later described the resident issue as resolved / “best of friends”. These entries should be addressed rather than omitted.

Legal-status discrepancy to address: most formal placement/review records identify Section 44(1)(b), but one Segment 002 contact record (PDF p.8) states that Claire was subject to Section 44(1)(a) in January 1991. The same contact record records discharge of the statutory order on 10 January 1991. This appears inconsistent with the repeated Section 44(1)(b) references and should be explained as a record discrepancy rather than silently reconciled.

2-13. Abuse, neglect, disclosure, impact and contradictory evidence

2. Direct physical abuse

No direct care-setting physical assault is described. S003 p.53 refers to "older girls' aggression", but does not state that Claire was struck or injured. S002 p.22 records a 1991 incident in which she "slipped when pushed" by a boyfriend while fooling around; the record is outside Bon-Accord and does not call this an assault. References to "Police Assault" concern an offence attributed to Claire, not an assault on Claire.

3. Direct sexual abuse

No rape, indecent assault, sexual touching, forced nudity, grooming, sexualised punishment or sexual misconduct allegation was located in the three supplied segments.

4. Emotional / psychological abuse

The records contain substantial emotional distress but no clear direct account of Bon-Accord staff emotionally abusing Claire. Relevant entries include not wanting to be at Bon-Accord, feeling very bad around a resident, being scared to tell her mother, "moodies", depression/anger in a difficult group period, fears/lack of trust, and later emotional vulnerability. S002 p.97 also records her mother using the insult "spoilt, little prat" during a shopping incident; this is family-context evidence, not institutional abuse.

5. Neglect

No clear care-setting neglect finding is established. The records do show an unsettled resident group and older girls' aggression, which are safeguarding concerns. They also show staff/social-work follow-up and medical assessment. Outside care, earlier school records document chronic lateness/absence, missed appointments and limited adult supervision at times; these are relevant welfare background but should not be relabelled as institutional neglect.

6. Contemporaneous disclosures and complaints

Strongest entries are S002 pp.98-99: Claire said she did not want to be at Bon-Accord, staff interpreted her as feeling very bad around a resident, and her mother later said Claire had been "scared to tell her about the events" and had not wanted to discuss matters at home. S003 p.54 records Claire wanting to see her social worker and being "not happy - but settled well". The precise underlying allegation is redacted/unclear.

7. Institutional knowledge and failure to act

Bon-Accord/social work knew of the unsettled group, older girls' aggression, resident-related distress and the sniffing/unconsciousness incident. The records show hospital checking, meetings and follow-up, so the supplied segments do not establish a failure to act on a known abuse allegation. S003 p.19 criticises long delay and external-agency communication in the school/welfare case; that is a broader system-handling concern.

8. Frequency, duration and pattern

The strongest pattern is concentrated in Aug-Sep 1990 after admission: difficult resident-group circumstances, older girls' aggression, emotional distress, walk-out/overnight absence with residents and an aerosol-sniffing episode requiring medical checking. There is no record here of repeated physical or sexual abuse. By Nov-Dec, Claire spent increasing time at home and records increasingly describe the placement as successful.

9. Mental-health / psychological impact

Records describe depression, anger, anxiety, serious unease, mood changes, lack of confidence, insecurity and emotional vulnerability. No diagnosis of PTSD or formal psychiatric admission is identified in these segments. A 1992 assessment states she needed consistent adult support and help exploring family relationships.

10. Physical / medical consequences

The clearest event is loss of consciousness after gas/aerosol sniffing during Bon-Accord residence, followed by casualty/hospital assessment; the record says she was physically fine afterwards. Historical kidney problems pre-date the care placement and are not linked to abuse. The 1991 window incident does not record a specific injury or treatment.

11. Substance use / coping mechanisms

Aerosol/gas sniffing occurred during care and is contemporaneously connected by staff to distress and resident/family issues, although the record does not state abuse caused it. In Feb 1991, amyl-nitrate sniffing is described by the Rector as a sign of "serious unease". Alcohol-related offending is recorded in June 1991. Earlier records also mention past pill-taking. Causation should not be assumed beyond the wording used.

12. Education, relationships and life impact

Records document substantial truancy/lateness, exclusions, school moves, learning/spelling/reading difficulties, interrupted education and later improvement at Inverurie Academy. A 1992 report records housing instability, family rejection/conflict, difficulty managing a residential course, need for support with employment and independent living, and proposed supported accommodation.

13. Apparently contradictory evidence

Positive evidence is frequent: Claire "settled", "managed really well", made "rapid strides", was "fine" after the aerosol incident, and the resident issue was later described as resolved with the two "best of friends". These entries do not automatically negate distress or an unrecorded incident, but they should be addressed alongside the concerning records. Additional discrepancies include Section 44(1)(a) vs 44(1)(b), "Clare" vs "Claire", and different educational-outcome descriptions (one report mentions five subject passes; a later summary records three Standard Grade passes).
