### INVITATION TO ATTEND DIABETIC EYE SCREENING

Some people with diabetes can develop a condition affecting the eye called retinopathy, which can lead to partial loss of vision or possible blindness. Research has shown that regular screening for retinopathy in people with diabetes, and treatment for those affected, can reduce the risk of people losing their sight.

As part of a national screening programme for people with diabetes, you will be invited annually, depending on your last screening outcome, to arrange and attend an appointment for diabetic eye screening. This screening appointment will involve the photographing of each eye using a digital camera.

We may need to put eye drops into your eye(s), in which case you should note that your vision could be blurred for 4 - 6 hours, therefore it would not be advisable to drive after your appointment. If you wear spectacles, please remember to bring them with you.
