Result of your cervical screening test

Thank you for coming for your cervical screening (smear) test.

Your sample was tested for high-risk human papillomavirus (HPV) which we did not find. Your result means that you do not need another cervical screening test for five years, as your risk of developing cervical cancer over this time is very low. HPV testing is the best way of identifying if you're at risk of developing cervical cancer.

What happens next?

We will invite you for your next cervical screening test in five years. Screening saves lives and is the best way to prevent cervical cancer, so it's important that you come for this test every time you're invited.

See this between screenings? We want to see you

If you have unusual discharge, or bleeding after sex, between periods or after the menopause, contact your GP practice. These are usually caused by something other than cancer but it's important to have them checked.
